- 1. Oswaldo DORTICCS, president of Cuba, arrived in Lina on 4 June where he was met by President PRADO and a handful of diplomats and government officials. At the Peruvian military's insistance, no military honors were accorded. The Feruvian Government, acting at the last moment, ordered DURTICUS' plane to land at Las Palmas, a restricted military base, and in doing so upset aprists and Communist plans to hold a desconstruction of support at the airport. The two-day visit was marked by a rather cold reception from the local government and pross, with only La Tribuna, the Apris a newspaper, giving the visit front page publicity. In summary, Station Lina believes that DCRTICUS' visit was a failure as far as increasing public sentiment in support of Cuba is concerned.
- 2. The Station's KUCLGE effort to counter any adverse effects of DORTICOS' visit were instrumented by a variety of agents. The program was as follows:
- a. Through Diffile-3, some 15,000 copies of a leaflet written by the Stution based on Reference 1, were distributed in Limn on 3 June and 4 June. An additional 10,000 copies of a smaller haflet propared by DikeER-) were also distributed. Copies of these leaflets are forwarded as attachment A.
- b. On 4 June FRADECIMAL devoted his moontime radio program to an attack against Communist Tenetration and manipulation of the Cuban revolution. The proeram was announced through paid newspaper advortisements which are forwarded for Headquorters only as attachment 3. Reference B material was passed to FULDECINAL for his use on this program.
- o. DULIFORGE and DUBRICH, collaborating with April a university students, were responsible for erecting two large banners reading. "Estamos con Cuba, pero no al Comunismo", one across the entrance to the mirport and another across Avenida Arcquipa, one of Liza's rost traveled streets. Those banners were put up early on 4 June and later that day Communist teams managed to destroy both of them but not before they were seen by thousands of people. In addition, 30,000 copies of three other leaflets, attachments C. were distributed before and during DORT:-CCS visit. R DULINGCE reported that the Communists were distributing leaflets of their own, attachment D for headquarters only, and one of his distribution teams was attacked in the vicinity of San Marcos University.
- d. In addition to highlighting anti-CASTRO, anti-Communist material on his 4 and 5 June radio and TV programs, DUBREAD also made use of a series of articles from Caracas opposing Derios visit to that country. OThese articles were for-warded by Statics and said available to DUREAD by Station DUREA gave the articles to Aurelia Fint quesada of El Cozercio, who in turn presented them at the editorial board meeting of his paper. El Comercio, taking the clippings as an example of hecistheric solidarity against DATICOS' trip, altered its own policy secewhat and in both editorial and news columns attacked the DCRTICGS visit. The articles are forwarded as attachment E for Headquarters only.
 - e. DUPASIC, in the 4 June issue of the DUPLICITY-I magazine, launched an attack against APRA and especially Armando VIIIIANUEVA for his support and promotion of the CASTRO revolution. According to DULIFURGE, this article was much discussed by the ignistas, causing a great many second thoughts on the continuation of APRA support for Cuba.

3. The Station realizes that a majority of its JMNAXX program depends on leaflots, but it is believed that it is justified when the increasing amount of Communist propaganda being produced in this manner is taken into consideration.
