b. DIR-69901 asked the Station to obtain a list of all Cubans in Cuba awaiting transit visas to Mexico. Jeremy K. BENADUM learned that approximately four thousand visa applicants are awaiting decisions on Mexican visas. These transit visas are authorised for issuance by the Mexican Consul in Havann for a six months' period and valid for travel of lifteen to thirty days in Mexico. Obtaining a list of persons for whom visas are authorised does not necessarily indicate travel plans since the applicant has six months to enter Mexico.

- c. On 2 October 1963 the Station advised LITEMPO that the Chinese Communists in preparation for their commercial exhibition to be held in December 1963 were expected to ship goods aboard a British ship "West Breese" which was scheduled to arrive in Veracrus on 12 October 1963. In this shipment there was thought to be a large amount of Cammunist propagands. LITEMPO was asked to intercept this propagands.
- d. On the night of 23 October 1903 the Chief of Station, Mexico, asked for LITEMPO support in assisting personnel and recovering property in a sensitive TYPIC operation (WAVE-6395 and related cables). The LITEMPO group immediately sent an agent to assist the injured personnel and plans have been made for a discreet recovery of the prop "ty involved.
- esatacted Jeremy K. BENADUM and asked that he have LITEMPO check at the airport to learn if Cleto Manuel Sousa Betista had made reservations to leave Manico via a south-bound airline. The LITEMPO group was asked to search subject and his luggage to see if he was carrying from \$25,000 to \$50,000 U.S. dollars which he was to have received from the Soviet Embassy in Maxico. The LITEMPO group checked all airlists and reservations for south-bound travel. In the afternoon of it Cotober 1963, after receiving instructions from KUBARK Headquarters, the Station asked the LITEMPO group to make no search of subject or otherwise hinder his travel. Subject departed on 12 October 1963 via Guest Airlines 0830 flight for Panama. In the event that subject had been searched, BENADUM advised that there is no Maxican law which forbide the carrying of U.S. currency. They could have noted the numbers of the bills but could not have confiscated the money.

#### 2. Liaison.

- a. The Chief of Station, Mexico, met with LITEMPO/i and 2 several times during this reporting period to ask their assistance in providing support to Station operations such as described above.
- b. On 28 October 1953, COS, Mexico, passed one thousand rounds of .223 Colt automatic ammunition to LITEMPO/1 as a personal gift for LITEMPO/2 and LITEMSOR.

e. On 28 October 1963 LITEMPO/1 asked COS, Mexico, for the LITEMPO/2 during the

presidential campaign. (See MEXI-6649, DIR-78868 and MEXI-6726 for details.) As of the end of October 1963, it was well known that LITEMPO/2 would be the PRI camildate.

b. Passport Camera. HMMA-22430 transmitted three one-hundred feet rolls of 16mm film to Headquarters for any further exploitation. Coverage for the period 7 through 22 October 1963 again indicated mechanical difficulties. Approximately twenty-five feet is well exposed film and the remaining seventy-five feet is a series of black shots suggesting that the camera may have been dropped. The Station KURIOT technician will examine the camera and try to correct the difficulty.
