1. There follows the monthly operational report for Project LIEVVOY activities during October 1965.

2. Target Lines - October 1965

There was only one change in target lines during October. 20-68-69 was disconnected on 30 October to provide a free line for use against a LIEVVOY target. The number and identity of this target will be provided when the new connection is made.

3. Processing of LIEVVOY Information

There was no change in the processing during this reporting period.

4. Exploitation of LIEVVOY Information


During this period LIEVVOY provided operational data of interest in connection with the visit to Mexico of President Tito of Yugoslavia.

MEXI-655 reported a contact by an English-speaking man with the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City. This was forwarded to Headquarters for further dissemination.

MEXI-6591 reported a long distance call from Herb PROWSE from Las Vegas who claimed to be a student working with the Cuban Embassy in Mexico. Further dissemination was left to Headquarters.

MEXI-6615 reported contact between New York Times writer, Herbert MATTHEWS and the Cuban Embassy in Mexico. No investigative action was taken by the Mexico Station.
