MCUIP-1 - In July 1960, Headquarters advised Station Bogota that Subject with two sides would be traveling to PEFRINE to assume the post of Kavy Chief in the Fab Directorate and visa assistance was requested. Routine difficulties followed including no funding by the Fil until finally in inquat 1560 the Station had to advance funds for Subject and one companion including \$150 each required by the commutate as evidence of solvency. There is no indication in the files as to whether this 1300 was to be absorbed as a AUBARK expense or whether it was to be repayed. However, since that time, ALGUIF-1 has become a socurity risk. He is considered an opportunist and associates with people with whom KUBARK wishes no contact. Cas of these individuals is described as needing only the slightest excuse to make public statements embarrassing and harmful to LUBAIX interests. decordingly, it is recommended that this advance be written off without attempting to secure repayment.

- 2. AMCALL-1 Funds were passed to AMCALL-1 by the principal agent for use in the AWALL project. However, as conventional political action on the labor front became more and more difficult, these funds nade their way increasingly into the MiP war chest since ARCALI-1 was national co-ordinator for this organisation. Finally, the taking over of the labor movement by the communists left no read open to opposition elements except that of sebotage and claudestime activity. In April 1961, Gordon BIKAZIAS, principal agent with whom AVCALL-1 was in contact was arrested and ultimately deported. There was no farther contact with Atiali-1 following the arrest of Hilakias. The funds that had been passed to him ware presumably used by the EEP underground and must have been gone long before the time of ARALL-1's arrest the end of September 1961. Accordingly, -H/4/PA-PACP is requesting that the sum of \$840.61 charged against the agent be written off both because the funds were undoubtedly expended by the HRP underground in furtherance of anti-lastro objectives and because AMCALL-1 himself is either dead or in prison and eccountings can therefore not be recured.
- 3. Pudro DIAT Lang The sum of \$400 was passed to Subject on 19 Jamary as expense soney for a prop tour he was to take along with

Inis CONTE Agreere and other Cubens. The plan called for the we of MAZ'lens's plans piloted by him.
