Source of Paras. 1 - 3: A Cuban exile with excellent contacts in the Movimiento Revolucionario del Pueblo (MRP, Revolutionary Movement of the People). He has reported accurately for more than a year on the activities of this organization and its affiliates and on exile political developments in general.

 1. On 20 October 1984, Aurelia Nazario Sargent, leading official of the Segundo Frente Encional del Escambray (SFME, Second National Front of the Escambray), said that a written message had been received that morning from Eloy Gutierrez Menoyo, SFME military leader, who advised that two more groups of from seven to ten men each were soon to join him. Two of these men would be Orlando Martinez and Hector Gallardo, both members of the Movimiento Esvolucionario del Pueblo (MRP, Bevolutionary Movement of the People) residing in Miami. Gutierrez said that he had to face some unexpected problems such as the sinking of one of his boats and the high cost of operations, but that he hoped to be in Cuba shortly.
 - 2. Hazario said that he was sure that Gutierrez was not in Santo Domingo, but he did not deny that Gutierrez might be on a small key near the Dominican Republic
 - 3. On 21 October Reinaldo Abreu Perez said that he had received the message from Gutierrez on the previous day and that he was sure that Gutierrez had already been inside Cuba, paving the way for a future uprising. According to Abreu, Gutierrez will make no definite move until after the United States elections because he does not want to embarrass the present administration in Washington. Abreu said that Gutierrez is sure that the United States will help the people inside Cuba when the uprising begins.

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Source of Paras. 4 - 6: An educated Cuban exile who is active in several emigre political organizations, source is a fairly reliable reporter of political maneuvers among Cuban exiles. This information was obtained from Aurelio Nazario Sargent.

- 4. As of 6 October Nazario said that the SFNE had received some bad news about the activities of Gutierrez. He said that the infiltration into Cuba of the second group of trained men, which was to include the guerrilla chiefs, had been paralyzed bocause of accidents to the boats. Gutierrez suffered the loss of two boats during the last hurricane, a small boat and a large one which had cost more than \$10,000. According to Nazario, Gutierrez had to suspend the purchase of weapons in order to apply that money to the repair of the boats and to the needs of the men at the keys and other places. Several broadcast centers had also suffered damage because of the bad weather.
- 5. Hazario said that the collection of money had been smaller, but that efforts were being made to maintain their operations which were scheduled to take place in Cuba in November and December during the sugar season.
- 6. The Latin American trip of Dr. Armando Fleitas Diaz, Secretary General of the SFNE, had been considered successful in regard to publicity, but unsuccessful in regard to finances and official relations with representatives of the foreign governments.
