

narrow in interest to merit KUBARK support", Chief of Station, Maxico has asked IDEN B and his company to pay this subsidy in the future. This // arrangement will begin on 1 January 1964. The circulation of this magazine is approximately 2000 copies. It is definitely conservative, strongly pro-private enterprise and anti-Socialist. In a meeting on 30 July 1963 with the Chief of Station and Michael C. Choaden, the Chier, HBFLNCH said, "we do far too little propaganda of IDEN A type; that is, that which is procapitalist and strongly anti-Communist". He said this 15,000 pesos monthly is less than it costs monthly for us to put one officer abroad and this is far wider - far beyond what one more man could do". He asked hat the Chief of Station appeal to GALBOND to keep financing IDEN A. Josh hat? 4. As previously pointed out to Headquarters, IDEN C provides the Station with a research facility not otherwise available. They are able to place articles in newspapers and magazines, sponsor lectures, and sponsor research projects. 5. Manuel CALVILLO Alonso is an intellectual asset connected with the LIRUFF organization. He is a source of positive intelligence on rightwing political groups. He is the brother-in-law of Dr. Salvador NAVA Martinez of San Luis Potosí, prominent eye surgeon and politician. CALVILLO also knows the educational field better than any source of the Maxico Station. He, additionally, provides the Station with background information on wellknown leftists. He has just completed a book on "Penetration of Mexican" Educational System by Communists". This manuscript has been read by Chief, HEFINCH Mexico, IDEN D, IDEN B, and Michael C. Choaden and the Chief of Station, all of whom believe it an excellent historical account of penetrations by Communism into the Mexican educational system. who has lived through the years cited (1930-1963) believes the impact of the book (which he says is factual and excellently documented) "will be terrific". HMMA-21976 transmitted a copy of this to Buencs Aires with a request for publication. The timing of this publication is important because of the impact it is expected to have on impending national elections in Mexico. 6. The student activities of this group (IDEN E) have been far more effective than it would appear from Station reporting. LIHUFF/1 and the Station are at fault for failing to keep Headquarters fully informed on these activities. Headquarters (in reference) recommended that instead of a flat subsidy for basic expenses for the student group, the Station provide funds for specific activities, trips, demonstrations, etc. This arrangement is perfectly acceptable to the Mexico Station. Those activities which are financed by KUBARK will be coordinated by the Station CA staff. IDEN E consists of 200 shock troops who are vigorously anti-Communist and campaign actively against Communist and pro-Castro groups at the UNAM; the University in Guadalajara, and the University in Puebla. This is an excellent channel for action, for anti-Communist propaganda and for pro-Free World propaganda. They are willing to take direction from LIHUFF/2 who will take direction from LIHUFF/1 (who is in contact with Chief of Station, Mexico). The group publishes a weekly news organ (IDEN F) forwarded under separate cover. Also by separate attachment is a list of some of the activities of this group during the past few months. 7. In summary, the Mexico Station requests that the LINUFF Project be approved for an expenditure of US\$30,000 to be used for spot covert

be approved for an expenditure of US\$30,000 to be used for spot covert action activities via the LIHUFF organization. Of this amount, US\$6,000 will be used to pay a monthly salary of US\$500 to LIHUFF/1. The remaining sum will be used for specific activities in coordination with other CA activities of the Station.

Militant political action in campaigns against Communist rectors in Monterrey, Puebla, Guadalejara and Morelia, working with other anti-Communist groups. (In all cases these Rectors were eventually removed from their posts).

Continuous placement in capitol and national media of anti-Communist articles of interest to students and government leaders.

A significantly effective character assassination campaign against Marxist director of the \_\_\_\_\_broadcasting station, has been launched and sustained by the group.

Carried out successful demonstrations before the Maxico City Soviet Embassy, and during the visit to Maxico of Tito (several members of the group were jailed as a result).

The group has participated continuously in political action activities at the National University - and throughout Mexico - in support of anti-Communist student candidates.
