On November 24 and 25, 1963, a source furnished an account of a meeting that was held in New York City on November 23, 1963, between Professor Robert Harry Carroll of the Political Science Department, Northwestern University, and Bohdan Lomondowski, Polish Ambassador to the United Nations, and Lutzack Lacks, Special Advisor for International Matters to the Polish Foreign Minister. The source explained that Professor Carroll had been in New York to deliver a speech on the evening of November 22, 1963, before a group of alumni of Northwestern University. Prior to his trip to New York, he had made arrangements for the meeting with Lacks and Lomondowski.

The source learned that shortly after noon on November 23, 1963, Professor Carroll was the luncheon guest of Lacks and Lomondowski and the discussion was opened with a question by the Poles on the reaction of University people to the assassination of President Kennedy. The source has learned that Professor Carroll advised the Poles that there was real shock and dismay within intellectual circles concerning the tragedy.

Lacks and Lomondowski then commented that the assassination was a disaster and as its result, the future was very uncertain. Lomondowski commented that his first reaction to the assassination was the possibility of a military coup d'etat in the United States; however, Lacks had convinced him that such a reaction was unwarranted and based on a lack of knowledge of the American political system.
