("Worker" and "Daily Worker"); Morning Freiheit Association ("Morning Freiheit" and "Jewish Life"); Workers! Bookshop; F & D Printing Co.; 12th - 13th Realty Corporation. Strict care must be exercised so that the existence of this important source of evidence will not become known to any outside agency.
