In conjunction with our investigation into the circumstances surrounding the death of President Kennedy, we hereby request the declassification of portions of a memorandum to be used in our forthcoming hearings, scheduled to begin on September 6th, 1978.

The document we are requesting partial declassification of is the November 24th, 1963 memorandum by President Johnson's aide, Walter Jenkins, setting forth a phone conversation with FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover. A copy of the memorandum is enclosed with this letter.

Most of the memorandum appears to have already been made public, initially by the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence in 1976. However, there is a lengthy paragraph beginning at the bottom of page two of the memorandum which is still classified as "secret."

We now request that the only portions of the memorandum that remain classified be limited as follows:

A. All of the last paragraph on page 2, which continues on to page 3, would be declassified, except the two sentences: "For instance, Oswald made a phone call to the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City which we intercepted. It was only about a visa, however."

These two sentences could remain classified as

"secret."
