Airtel to SAC, San Juan RB: DOMINICAN SITUATION

Pedro Daniel Del Carmen Zervigen appears to be identical with Pedro Zervigen Ayala, address Rlogue 14 #12, Carolina, Puerto Rice, who was a delegate to the convention of the Cuban exile anti-Castro organization, Junta Revolucionaria Cubana (JURE) held in Tampa, Florida, in July, 1965. He was listed as a member of the Foreign Directorate of this organization. (105-114543-252)

Bufiles contain several references to Carlos Diago Diago concerning his connection with anti-Castro organizations and with JURE. Diago, with the address Paoli 430 Hato Rey, San Juan, Puerto Rico, attended the convention of JURE in Tamps, Florida, in July, 1965. (105-114543-252)

ReSJtel 5/20/66 revealed the May 20, 1966 issue of the "San Juan Star," a San Juan daily newspaper, indicated 20 residents of Puerto Rico were to spend seven days in the Dominican Republic as observers of the June 1, 1966, elections. The article indicated the group has no political affiliations and would pay its own expenses. Bufiles were reviewed concerning individuals named in reSJtel 5/20/66 and the following information was developed: Bufiles contain no pertinent identifying information concerning Ramon Calderon.

The following information possibly pertains to the Luis Caracho named in referenced teletype: SJ 577-SS on SJ 5/17/65, revealed one Luis Camacho informed Juan Bosch that two members of the Rouse of Representatives were going to make a speech Camacho desired to discuss this matter with Bosch (109-12-211-3193)

Silvia Viera, a University of Puerto Rico professor, is possibly identical with the Sylvia Viera, a university professor whose name appeared on a petition in the September 13, 1965, issue of "The New York Times." This petition was captioned "Puerto Rico Calls to the Conscience of the World." The petition requested the Working Subcommittee and the Committee of 24 of the United Nations to include the case of Puerto Rico on its agenda for study and decision. The petition indicated Puerto Rico had not yet solved its constitutional problems nor had an opportunity of exercising its elementary right of self-determination. (105-93124-155)
