ReBulet 10/11/63, making reference to Miami teletype 8/16/63, which indicated that "MM-726-S, head of the MIRR, would be interviewed."

Referenced teletype was in error and should have read "ORLANDO BOSCH AVILA, head of the MIRR,....."

SA ROBERT J. DWYER, who prepared this teletype, can not explain exactly how this confusion occurred, except that it may have been an error in his dictation.

In any event, the error was subsequently corrected, BOSCH was interviewed, and results submitted by airtel and letterhead memorandum for dissemination dated September 3, 1963.

SA DWYER has advised he will make every effort to insure that such errors do not occur again.

Inasmuch as the teletype was not submitted for dissemination and the correct information was submitted subsequently in airtel and letterhead memorandum, no other administrative action is recommended except scoring this as a non-substantive error against SA DWYER.

Reurtel 8-16-63 in which you indicated MM 726-S, head of captioned organization in Miami, would be interviewed for information concerning captioned organization. Advise Bureau of results of this contact together with any additional pertinent information which may have been received concerning the organization and its activities.

For your information, at the conference conducted by John Grimmins, Office of Coordinator for Cuban Affairs, Department of State, on 9-13-63, the details of which were furnished your office on 9-16-63 by airtel captioned "Anti-Fidel Castro Activities," Grimmins called attention to air raids over Cuba on 8-15-63, 9-5-63, and 9-8-63 for which credit was claimed by captioned anti-Castro organization.

According to Grimmins, Customs agents on 9-12-63 interviewed an American soldier of fortune in Bimini, Bahamas, one Bill Johnson. Johnson claimed credit for these raids and implicated two other American adventurers, Jack Griffin and one Greasner. Johnson stated he had used a Cessna 310 plane and a Cessna 175 and had purchased two converted P-51's which he hoped to use for raids in the forthcoming week. The raids allegedly were undertaken to prove to a Cuban group that Cuba could be successfully bombed and he was now expecting support from the MIRR. Since Customs is investigating in this matter, check with Customs locally for information concerning the air raids and captioned organization's connection with them.
