On page two of this brochure there is a printed letter by Otash in which he states his reasons for publishing this directory. A postscript to this letter acknowledges "the fine cooperation we have received from J. Edgar Hoover, director of the F.B.I., U.S. Dept. of Justice...and many contributing individuals without whose help this book could not have been published."

The extent of the Bureau's cooperation with Otash, a former criminal symbol informant of the Los Angeles Division, was in the form of a letter dated April 19, 1961, which replied to his communication inquiring as to the location of FBI offices abroad and in this country, which information was to be incorporated into his directory.
