Miami is maintaining close liaison with other federal agencies in following subject's activities in the revolutionary field. Mr. JACK NEELY, covert CIA representative, Miami, Florida, and a former Bureau agent, has advised SA STAFFORD that CIA, Miami, has no interest in subject, is not sponsoring him in any way and Mr. NEELY said he felt certain that if subject was being sponsored by New York or any of their other offices he would have been informed at Miami. NEELY did not rule out the possibility that subject's activities might be sponsored in some way by either the U. S. Navy or U. S. Army.

REQUEST OF BUREAU

Bureau is requested to contact the Department of Defense through appropriate liaison and attempt to determine if subject is being sponsored by any of the military organizations. This action is requested only if Bureau's inquiry of CIA, Washington, D. C., should prove unproductive, it being noted that New York in its airtel dated 6/22/62 had requested the Bureau contact that agency and attempt to determine the full extent of CIA's utilization of subject's group, as alleged by ALEXANDER I. KORKE, Jr., interviewed by New York on 6/22/62.

Miami at Miami, Florida, will through informants and other appropriate investigation obtain further information concerning subject's plans and activities and will keep the Bureau promptly advised of pertinent details.
