Enclosed herewith is a reprint of an article that appeared in the Sunday, July 3, 1962 edition of the "Denver Post" Newspaper, written by ROBERT K. BROWN, Bufile 2-1490.

[MM 639-S] furnished the following information:

During the end of January, 1962, ROBERT K. BROWN, Boulder, Colorado, was observed in Miami associating with GERALD PATRICK HEMMING, an American "soldier of fortune" involved in Cuban revolutionary activities.

In February, 1962, BROWN continued to be in Miami, was in close contact with a number of Cuban nationals and also had contact with FRANK ANTHONY STURGIS, aka., Frank Fiorini, a well known adventurer who had been in the Cuban armed forces and arrested by United States Customs on July 30, 1958.

During March, 1962, BROWN continued to interview a large number of Cuban nationals and initiated contact with Americans interested in anti-Communism. BROWN also contacted the John Birch Society and other extreme groups for the purpose of obtaining help for Cuban nationals and soliciting their aid in fighting Communism.

BROWN later returned to Boulder, Colorado, and on about June 21, 1962, sent a clipping from the "Denver Post" containing the article he wrote entitled "Cuban Exiles Have Learned to Hate CIA".
