

ADMINISTRATIVE

JOE MOLINA was arrested by the Dallas Police Department on 11/23/63 in connection with the investigation of the assassination of former President JOHN F. KENNEDY. MOLINA was interviewed by SA JAMES S. WEIR, of the Houston Office, at the Dallas Police Department in the presence of Detective B. L. SENKEL. Following this interview, Chief JESSE CURRY, Dallas Police Department, advised SA WEIR that MOLINA had caused the police department considerable trouble in the past by demanding such things as listing Mexicans as white persons rather than as Mexicans, and generally protesting alleged discrimination of members of the Mexican race.

WILLIAM J. LOWERY, JR., former DL-2-S, who was also a member of the American G. I. Forum at the same time JOE MOLINA was a member, advised that MOLINA contacted him at which time he said he was considering a law suit against certain Dallas newspapers, radio stations, and possibly the Dallas Police Department for alleging he was a communist. Mr. LOWERY has further advised that on 12/11/63 he was contacted by an attorney named MANUEL who advised LOWERY that MOLINA would probably file a civil action because of the slanderous statements made against him by Dallas
