Informant reported at that time that PERERIA's wife and her sister, MRS. FRANKIE HARWELL, as of March 12, 1953, were still at their winter home in Miemi Beach, Florida.

This information was furnished the El Paso Division by airtel dated Harch 12, 1953.

By mirtel dated March 13, 1953, El Paso requested that contact be maintained with Denver informants for the purpose of keeping advised as to the whereabouts and activities of subjects pending disposition of the proposed appeal of their case to the United States Supreme Court.

On March 16, 1953, Denver Informant T-1, reported that subject BRADING had returned to Denver by plane from Washington D.C. on the night of March 12, 1953, and that BRADING and PERERIA then proceeded to Casper, Wyoming, where they registered at the Townsend Hotel. T-1 stated that both subjects were expected to return to Denver on about March 17, 1953. Informant stated that ERADING had not disclosed the purpose of his recent trip to Washington but that PERERIA and BRADING had stated that they would be in Casper, Wyoming, for a few days for the purpose of transacting business concerning their oil interests near Newcastle, Wyoming.

On March 19, 1953, T-1 reported that PERERIA and BRADING were in the process of liquidating all of their oil interests in Newcastle, Wyoming, and Denver, Colorado; that they were leaving Denver on March 19, 1953 at 4:15 p.m. via Continental Airlines for El Paso, Texas, where they were to have a conference with their attorney whose last name, according to informant, FRYER (phonetic). Informant stated that subjects had a reservation for return flight from El Paso to Denver, leaving El Paso at 8:15 p.m. on March 20, 1953.

According to the informant PERERIA and BRADING were planning to make a trip to New York City shortly after returning from El Paso and that they intended to consult with an attorney in New York whose name was not known to the informant.

Informant related that both subjects appeared to be highly agitated concerning the outcome of this case and that PERERIA was still drinking steadily.

T-1 stated that as of March 19, 1953 PERERIA's wife and her sister, MRS. FRANKIE HARWELL, were still at Miami Beach, Florida and PERERIA had made the statement that his wife wouldnit up the money to appeal their case to the United States Supreme Court.

On March 25, 1953, T-1 reported that PERERIA and BRADING had returned to Denver from El Paso, Toxas, on March 21, 1953, and on March 23, 1953, they left benver by plane enroute to New York City. Informant stated that subjects told him that they planned to remain in New York City for a few days and then fly to Miami Beach, Florida, after which they might return to Denver, Colorado, around April 20, 1953.

On March 13, 1953, Denver Informant T-2, of known reliability, reported that he had just received information from a source he believed reliable reflecting that subjects PERERIA and ERADING, as of March 13, 1953, were at their winter home, 1431 West 22nd Street, Sumset Island, #4, Miami Beach, Florida, and had recently been discussing plans to go to South America "to explore business possibilities". Informant surmised that PERERIA and BRADING might be planning a trip to South America to avoid serving their 12 year sentences which were then reported to be pending on appeal to the United States Supreme Court.

By mirtel dated April 17, 1953, the Miami Division reported that subjects ERADING and FERERIA were observed at 1431 West 22nd Street, Sunset Island # 4, Miami Beach, Plorida, on April 16, 1953.

On April 20, 1953, Denver Informent T 1 reported that PERERIA had arrived in Denver by plane from Miami on the night of April 19, 1953, and was then staying at BRADING's apartment in the Camelia House, Denver, Colorado. He stated that PERERIA apparently planned to return to Miami Beach within the next few days. Informant stated that it was his understanding that PERERIA and BRADING intended to retain the house on Sunset Island beyond the period of the lease which was to expire on May 1, 1953.

T-1 reported on May 1, 1953, that he had received no information from PERERIA and BRADING since April 20, 1953. He stated that BRADING was still leasing apartment number 610 in the Camelia House, Denver, Colorado, but there was no indication that either PERERIA or BRADING had been there

since April 20, 1953. By teletype dated May 1, 1953, the Bureau reported that information had been received from the department reflecting that records of the U. S. Supreme Court reflect that a writ of certiorari had been filed with the U. S. Supreme Court on April 30, 1953, requesting review of the decision of the U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals, New Orleans, Louisiana, in this case. It was stated that action on this matter was anticipated prior to the end of the courts term on June 8, 1953. It was stated that if the writ were denied by the U. S. Supreme Court, certified copies of denial would be sent to the circuit Court of Appeals, New Orleans, Louisiana, within two days. The Circuit Court of Appeals would then have 30 days to send down a mandate to the trial court following receipt of the order.

It was stated that the department reported that no action could be taken against PERERIA and BFADING until the mandate of the U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals had been received by the U. S. District Court, El Pase, Texas. It was stated that arrangements had been made by the Department to be immediately advised by the Supreme Court of action taken on the writ and that if the writ were denied the U. S. Attorney and the U. S. District Judge at El Pase might attempt to expedite mandate from the Circuit Court. The Bureau stated that all offices must be alert to movement of subjects so that the Bureau may be advised of any plans on the part of PERERIA and BRADING to leave the United States.

By teletype dated May h, 1953, the Miami Division reported that PERERIA was in Miami Seach as of April 30, 1953, but that BRADING was not observed. It was further stated that PERERIA's lease on the Miami Seach residence had been extended to June 1, 1953, and it was reported that PERERIA had been looking at houses to buy on Miami Beach.

On May 11, 1953, Denver Informent T-1, stated that neither PERERIA or BRADING have been in Denver since April 20, 1953, and it was his understanding that both of them were at PERERIA's residence in Miani Feach. Denver Informant T-2 reported on May 20, 1953, that neither subject has been in Denver during the last 30 days and that it was his understanding that both of them were still in Miami Beach, Florida.
