United Airline's flight 706 from Los Angeles 3:30 PM, July 29, 1953. He made no contact at the Denver Municipal Airport and proceeded immediately to the Mayslower Hotel in Denver, where he is registered as ARTHUR CLARK Spot surveilances revealed no contact between CLARK and BRADING.

On July 16, 1953 DN-119-C reported that CLARK was then staying at the Argonaut Hotel, Denver, and planned to move to the Mayflower hotel on July 17, 1953.

Denver proper number MA 1101 mentioned in Los Angeles airter July 27, 1950 is lasted to the Argonaut Hotel.

R. L. BAUMAN, mentioned Los Angeles airtel July 27, 1953, has been previously identified in connection with this investigation as ROG-R L. BAUMAN, independent oil operator of Delias, exas, was is a crose friend and associate of ARTHUR LEWIS CLARK.

During the last several months DN-119-0 and DN-123-C have regularly reported that ARTHUR LEWIS CLARK has been spending a great amount of time in Denver and that he has been staying at the Cosmopolitan Hotel, the Brown Palace notes, as well as the Argonaut and May flower Hotels on various occasions. DN-119-C has stated that CLARK is associated with BAUMAN and SAMUEL S. GARPTELD in oil drilling operations in the vicinity of Newcastle, Myoming.

There is being enclosed for the information of Los Anceles one copy of the report of SA PAUL E. BUSH dated August 27, 1952 at Denver in the PEREIRA case. This report contains considerable information concerning CLARK and GAR-PIEID. Reference is also made therein on the administrative page of the report to RCEEF L. BAUMAN. It is noted that in this report it is reflected that while CLARKWES in custody of the Denver Police Department in June of 1954, he was interviewed by agents of the Denver Office at which time he furn shed considerable backgroun. information concerning himself and stated that he and SAM GARPIELD were then establishing offices in Denver under the name of the Crude Cil Producing Corp. Since that time offices of the Crude Oil Producing Corp. have been opened at 1050 California Street in Denver, and the office is being maintained by one IRVING PASTERNAK, whose residence address is 4000 South Colorado Boulevard, Denver, Colorado, telephone number Plaza 51947. The telephone number of the Crude Oil Producing Corp.

During the past year periodic spot checks of telephone calls made by CLARK from his hotel rooms in Denver reflect that he is in frequent contact with VICTOR EMANUEL PEREIRA. During the interview with CLARK in June, 1952 he acknowledged acquaintance with FEREIRA and BRADING, and DN-119-C, DN-123-C have stated that it is their impression that CLARK and his associates have obtained large amounts of morey from PEREIRA and his wife ostensibly for the purpose of investing the same in oil drilling operations.

During the past year, PEREIRA and BRADING made statements reflecting that they were "in the oil business with Mr. CLARK and Mr. GARFIELD."

DN-119-C and DN-123-C have reported that no information has come to their attention reflecting that CIARK is engaging in any illegal activity in Denver. Spot checks of CIARK's telephone calls reflects that he is in frequent contact withvarious oil operators in Denver.

It is further noted that Capt. WILLIAM P. SANDERS reported in June, 1953 that he had received information through a source which he is not at liberty to divulge, that while at the Cosmopolitan Hotel in June, 1953, CLARK was in frequent telephone contact with the law firmof SHLVESTER and HARRIS, New York City. He appeared to be on very friendly terms with

one SIMERY HARRIS of that firm. It is noted that the firm of SILVESTER and HARRIS is presently representing PER. IA and ERADING in the appeal of their case to the United States Supreme Court. It is noted that on one occasion in June 1953 HARRISIS reported to have told CLARK that FREINA was having trouble getting money from his wife and is prestically broke, to which CLARK responded to tall that supid (PEREIRA) to start putting the pressure on her (meaning Ers. PEREIRA) and make her cough up some of that dough.

This same source reported that in June, 1953 CLARK was in frequent contact with CHARLEY CORLEY, who is reperted to be operating a vending machine business in Los Angeles. At that time CORLEY was planning to meet ARTIE CLARK, JE., (son of ARTHUR LEWIS CLARK), who was arriving in Los Angeles. By plane. At that time CORLEY was planning to pick up WICHCH PEREIRA at the Beverly-Carlton Hotel in Beverly Hills and have PEREIRA accompany him to the airport, inasmuch as PEREIRA is well acquainted with young CLARK.

DN-119-C, DN-123-C and DN-115-C, have, during the last year, identified CHARLES CORLEY, formerly of Tulsa, Oklahoma, as a friend and associate of various gamblers in the Denver area, including ARTHUR LEWIS CLARK. DN-115-C has reported that CORLEY, several months ago, left Denver with the intention of seeking to establish a business in Los Angeles, California. It is noted that CORLEY is a close friend and associate of GERALD D. ALLEN, wa. Gerry Allen, who is known in Kansas City, Missouri and Denver as a former "high roils" gambler.

A photograph of ARTHUR LEWIS CLARK, which was taken at the time of his arrest by the Denver Police Department in June, 1952 is enclosed to Los Angeles.

It is noted that by teletype dated June 15, 1953, Denver informed the Bureau, Rl Paso and other interested offices that as of June 9, 1953 EUGENE BRADING was at the Statler Hotel in New York City, telephone mumber Penmsylvania 65000 and on June 10, 1953 ARTHUR CLARK was at the Stanton Hotel in New York Cit, telephone number Eldorado 5400. No information has been received by the Denver Office as to the whereabouts of BRADING Since that time.

as to whether additional active investigation is desired concerning the movements of PERRIRA and BRADING, in view of the instructions contained in Bureau teletype to Denver dated June 15, 1953 to the effect that is was no longer necessary to maintain spot checks of their activities since the Supreme Court had granted certification subjects appear

El Paso is requested to inform Denver whether Elling's presence in New York City was verified pursuant to Denver teletype of June 15, 1953 and whether El Paso has information concerning his subsequent whereabouts.
