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FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

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SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

On 10/23/53 T-1 advised subject BRADING moved into a Beveriy H ills, Calif. apartment rented by ARTHUR LEGIS CLARK, SR., 10/18/53. T-1 advised FRADING attempted to borrow money from local banks. ARTHUR LEGIS CLARK, JR., advised T-1 that subjects BRADING and FERRIRA would receive word from their stimmer on outcome of appeal to months and two weeks from 10/23/53. T-1 advised BRADING and PEREIRA left Los Angeles for Sacremento, Calif., and returned 11/7/53. T-1 contacted subjects PEREIRA and BRADING in Los Angeles on 11/28/53. T-1 advised contact with subjects PEREIRA and BRADING in Los Angeles on 12/4/53 and furnished descriptions of cars driven by them. T-2 advised BRADING moved from CLARK, SR.'s, apartment on the night of 12/10/53. On 12/11/53 T-1 advised BRADING was out of the city and would return on or about 12/25/53. On 12/14/53 T-1 and T-3 advised subject PEREIRA was out of the city and would return in several days. On 12/15/53 T-2 advised GLARI, SR., had not renewed lease on apartment. Contacts with T-4 set out. List of vending machine companies furnished by LAPD set out.

DETAILS:

One October 23, 1953, T-1, of known reliability, advised that ARTHULING CLARK, SR., had rented an apartment located at 8338 De Longue, Los Angual Langue, Los Angual

T-1 stated that subject EUGHE H. BRIDING had given up his apartment and moved in with the CIARKs. CIARK, JR., told T-1 that CIARK, SR., had gone to Hiami Beach, Florida, by way of Denver and Chicago, and that he was not

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
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returning to Los Angeles. He further stated that he planted to join his father in the next few months unless his father changed his plant.

T-1 advised that the PEREIRAs had been quarreling for the past month and that recently at the Balbos Club, located near Sen Diego, Californi the PEREIRAs had a drunken brawl in which "s. PEREIRA received a broken arm and which resulted in the PEREIRAs being thrown out of the blub.

ARTHUR LEWIS CIARK, JR., told 7-1 that PERETRA had run through most of his wife's ready cash and that PERETRA had unsuccessfully attempted to horrow money from three different banks. CIARK, JR., told T-1 that on October 23, 1953, ERADING and PERETRA received word from their attorney that he would advise them of the final outcome of their appeal two months and two weeks from the above date.

CIARK, JR., stated that Mrs. PERCIRA was disgusted with her husband and had threatened to break off with him entirely. CIARK, JR., stated that as a result of this PERCIRA had been staying with them for several days at a time.

T-1 advised that CIARK, SR., had returned to Ios Angeles and that PEREIRA and his wife continued to have marital difficulties. T-1 advised that inc. PEREIRA left Ios Angeles the last week in October, 1953, for a visit to Dallas, Texas. T-1 advised that CIARK, SR., and CIARK, JR., left Ios Angeles on November 7, 1953, and stated they would not return.

T-1 advised that ERADING and PERSIRA left on a business trip to Sacramento, California, and that they returned to Los Angeles on November 7, 1953.

T-1 advised that Mrs. PERKIRA had returned from Texas.

T-1 advised she contacted HRADING and PARCIRA on November 28, 1953, and stated that neither mentioned or indicated their intentions to leave Los Angeles.

On November 28, 1953, T-2, of unknown reliability, advised that BRADING was presently occupying an apartment at 8338 De Longpre, Los Angels, and that this apartment was originally leased by ARTHUR LEATS CLARK, SR., approximately two months ago. T-2 stated that CLARK, SR., was out of town and that the lease would expire on December 10, 1953. T-2 advised that BRADING drove a black Cadillac sedan. T-2 advised he would immediately notify this Office in the event ERADING moved or left town.

T-2 advised on December 2, 1953, that a man described as white, male, American, 40 to 45 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches tall, 200 pounds,

visited BRADING in his apartment and that he drove a 1953 Cedillac sedan California licenes 1 Y 70763, color black.

The California State Department of Motor Vahicles advised that California licence 1 Y 70763 was listed to a 1953 Cadillac sedan, motor number 536040490, and was registered to C. J. CCRIEY, 305 South Clark Drive, Beverly Hills, California. (It is to be noted that CORLEY is the head of Leet, Inc.)

On November 28, 1953, T-3, of unknown reliability, advised that subject PEREIRA was at home and that if it appeared that PEREIRA was leaving town, this Office would be notified.

T-1 furnished the following descriptions and licences of caredriven by ERADING and PERSIRA:

1953 Mercury coupe, California licence 9 Z 1538, color yellow, (Driven by PEREIRA).

1952 Cadillac sedan, California licence 9 Z 4089, color black, with Scotch plaid seat covers, (Driven by ERADING).

The California State Department of Motor Vehicles advised that California licence 9 Z 1538 was listed to a 1953 Mercury Sport Coupe, motor number 53 IA 37954 M, registered to Dundee, Ltd., 8255 Beverly Boulevard Los Angeles. They also advised that California licence 9 Z 4089 was listed to a 1952 Cadillac Touring Sedan, motor number 526007527 and was also registered to Dundee, Ltd., same address.

T-1 advised she telephonically contacted BRADING and PEREIRA on December 4, 1953, and also on December 8, 1953.

On December 11, 1953, T-2 advised BRADING moved from the martners at 9398 De Longpre, Los Angeles, schetime during the night of December 10, 1953, without advising the landlord.

On December 11, 1953, T-1 advised that Mrs. PETEIRA stated BRADING left Los Angeles on the night of December 10, 1953. T-1 advised that the secretary of Dunder, Ltd., at 8255 Beverly Boulevard, Los Angeles, advised that BRADING was out of the city and would return on or about December 25, 1953.

On December 14, 1953, T-1 and T-3, both, advised Mrs. PERKIRA stated subject PEREIRA was out of town and would return to Los Angeles in several days.

T-1 advised the secretary at Dundee, Ltd., stated that subject PERSIRAL FEB out of town and would return to Los Angeles in approximately a week.

On 11/28/53 El Paso advise that AUSA HOLVEY WILLIAMS, El Paso, had received confidential information that the U. S. Supreme Court would officially affirm the conviction of subjects BRADING and PEREIRA on 11/30/53, and Mr. WILLIAMS was desirous of having the Bureau effect the immediate arrests of the subjects after the ruling was officially handed down. The Bureau was requested to advise as to what action is to be taken.

On 11/23/53 the Bureau advised that previous discussions with the Department reflect that as the conviction of the subjects was affirmed by the Supreme Court, the Clerk of the Court would forward to the Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans the ruling of the Supreme Court. Thereafter, the Circuit Court would return the ruling to the Trial Court in the proper district.

The Bureau advised that the Department is completely conversant with details of the case and that no request for Bureau action had been made. Bureau called attention to the fact that the attorney for subjects could file additional motions in this case and that subjects are free on bond; therefore, subject to jurisdiction of both Circuit Court and Trial Court. The Bureau advised no surveillance should be conducted, but alert informants should report any indication of subjects to leave the Country.

On 11/30/53 the Burcau advised that the facts of this case were discussed that in the mendate of the Supreme Court becomes the order of the District Court and accordance with orders of the United States Attorney in the District Court, no action can be taken to cause their apprehension. Bureau further advised that at such time as the mandate becomes the order of the District Court and each request is made for apprehension of subjects by the Bureau, full justification should be submitted by the El Paso Office to support such action.

Los ingeles 3626-C advised that she was leaving Los ingeles for Elberon, New Jersey, on 12/17/53, and would not be able to furnish information in this case until her return on or about 1/15/53.
