(identical with MM 635-S, heretofore a valuable security informant of Miami) and Valdes were arrested by Miami 1/27/60 in connection with plot to kidnap Rolando Masferrer, prominent anti-Castro exile. Reference memo noted it was not clear whether Fernandez planned to advise Bureau of plot but was unable to do so because of circumstances. 21 By teletype and airtel 1/28/60, Miami has furnished additional data concerning informant's role. Fernandez visited Miami 1/13-19/60 and supplied Miami Office with considerable data regarding Cuban intelligence activities and political developments (including information showing his own uncle is acting as Cuban agent in U. S.). Informant returned to Miami 1/27/60 and telephonically contacted Miami Office on arrival and again after processing by INS. At time of second call, he indicated he was late for appointment with unidentified individual but did not mention name of Valdes or indicate he was involved in Masferrer kidnap plot. MM 635-S did suggest meeting agent who handled him on evening of 1/27/60, but agent was unable to meet with informant due to other commitments and meeting was agreed on for following HN morning. Following arrest, Fernandez was interviewed privately by agent handling him, SA George Davis. He advised he had been instructed by his superior in Cuban National Police to meet Valdes concerning unidentified matter but insisted he was not aware of kidnap plot until he had met Valdes at which time he had no opportunity to contact Miami Office. He said he planned to advise Miami immediately following meeting but arrest prevented this. Fernandez claimed that he would not have actually staken part in kidnap plot and under no circumstances would he divulge his relationship with Bureau. Miami believes Fernandez gave plausible explanation and still has valuable potential as informant. Fernandez has just recently been promoted in Cubán National Police [to position of assistant to head of confidential section. current story may cover up. However, this informant has been operated by Miami since 1955, has produced valuable information, often of real significance, and has never previously given any indication of untrustworthiness or duplicity. Moreover, it is felt informant's story is very plausible if, in fact, he had no advance knowledge of kidnap scheme.  $\chi(\mathcal{M})$

There is little likelihood informant will divulge relationsip with FBI since such action would seriously jeopardizehis own safety. Under circumstances, it is felt we should not take any precipitous action to manipulate this matter for the benefit of MM 635-S or exert any influence on his behalf. It is believed, however, that we should furnish informant's account to Department and to U. S. Attorney, Miami, who is handling case (we have previously advised both Department and U. S. Attorney of fact Fernandez has been paid Bureau informant). Department should have this information to handle any problems which may arise if Fernandez does divulge his informant relationship.

Notes that Government may decide not to carry through on prosecution in this matter, especially since key Government witness would be Mrs. Catherine Taaffe who is of dubious reliability (we have also furnished Department full facts concerning her). Government may decide not to try subjects in favor of having them deported. In any event, it is felt we should await outcome of future prosecutive developments before making decision as to future operation of MM 635-S:  $\sqrt[4]{4}$
