BACKGROUND

1. On 3 January 1963 Quinton N. OUSLER turned-over the responsibilities of inside Station control of the LIMOTOR Project to Marvin A. CABOT during a meeting held with the outside Staff Agent for the LIMOTOR Project, Seymour D. TRINNICH. What follows is the first in a series of Progress Reports which it is hoped will not only serve to keep Headquarters advised of just what is going on in the LIMOTOR Project but will also serve to apprise Headquarters in greater detail of the performance of the LIMOTOR Staff Agent on the outside under student cover. During the period under review TRINNICH's replacement, Natalie S. MICHNOFF arrived to take over the outside responsibilities for LIMOTOR. In the future regular Progress Reports on LIMOTOR will be submitted on a quarterly basis.

MEETINGS

2. During the period under review 32 meetings were held with Seymour D. TRINNICH by Marvin A. CABOT. Two of these meetings were in CABOT's home under the cover of darkness. The remainder were

at four selected meeting sites on the streets of the metropolitan They have code names and were chosen to allow for maximum chack of possible counter-surveillance (use of che-way streets, oto.). CAROT busses TRINNICH at the predetermined site at a predetermined time and ultimately picks-up TRIMICH in his QP whicle. These metings are then held in CABOT's car. special emergency seeting sites have been selected but never used; one is close to TRIMMICH's residence, and the other close to the UNAM.

- 3. As ean be seen from the member of meetings held in a seven month period, they were usually held once a week. THINNICH's meetings with the other LIMOTOR assets were so arrenged to allow for a minimum passage of time between the field agents meetings and the meeting with CABOT. The TRINNICH-CABOT meetings usually last, on the average, two hours. Specific requirements were passed and administrative matters were attended to. Usually TRINNICH reviewed with CABOT each report received from the LIMOTOR agente and insedicte guidence is given where possible. Since these meetings were WINNICH's only contact with the Station, deliberate efforts were wade to keep him abreast of general Station developments as well as KURARK developments. This has proven to be a distinct advantage from the standpoint of the outside Staffer's morale, making him feel much more part of the Station and what it is trying to accomplish.
- TRIMICH is turn had predesignated meeting sites for LIMMTOR's 14, 19, and 22, similar to those cited in paragraph 2 above, and picked up his agents in his QP vehicle. Effective 7 March TRIMICH began preparation of contact reports with each of his agents. In turn LINOFOR-14 was instructed to propare a short report on each of his meetings with LIEFBROIL-2.

OPERATIONAL

- Since Jamuary 1963, the Station has attempted, through its regular contact with Seymour D. TRINNICH, to gain further insight into just what goes on at the UNAM which is of interest to the Station, and at the same time to examine the LINOTOR assets and their capabilities in terms of the UNAM. The LIMOTOR project is, as stated in the Project Renowal, an important Station "eyes and ears" meshanism at the UNAM. Based on a look at LINUTUR for the period under review the Station notes the following:
 - a. While the Project is producing it has received little in the way of guidance from the Station or Medquarters on information which it should collect. examination of escess was also necessary,
 - There was rinsufficient coordination with Station MUCACE astivities at the UNAM.
 - c. While it did produce, little of the product was considered of value for formal dissemination.
 - d. There was little or no play-back into the LIMMOR Project. That is to say that while the Project itself, primarily in the person of TRIMNICH displayed initiative and generated activity, it often ended just at that paint. This contributed to low morale, particularly as it concerned TRIMICH.

6. At the beginning of the period under review, the LIMOTOR stable consisted of the following assets:

LINUTOR-14 (who maintained contact with LIEFEROIL-2 and LIKAYAK-6; the latter served as a contact to LIEFEROIL's 3 and 4)

LIMOTOR-19

LIMOTOR-22

At an early stage in the TRINNICH-CAPOT relationship, i.e., at the 24 January meeting, steps were initiated via LIMOTOR-14 to accomplish the termination of LIKAYAK-6 and LIEVEROIL's 3 and 4 for lack of production. This was finally completed effective the end of Warch 1963. Although a bid for drop or termination pay was made, it was rejected. In order to provide LIKAYAK-6 with a means of contact should according of importance develop in the future, LIMOTOR-14 was instructed to acquire a Post Office Box, which he did. It was taken out in the alias used by LIMOTOR-14 with EIKAYAK-6 (Podro MORAN) and also the alias used by LIMOTOR-14 with LIEMEROIL-2 (Mugo de la Torre) as an emergency means of contact (using a telegrem).

- 7. As a matter of operational background, Seymour D. THINNICH was known to LIFOTOR's 14, 19, and 22 under his true name. They also knew his home telephone number which was used for communications from them to him. LIFOTOR-17 was unaware of the existence of LIFOTOR's 19 and 22. We knew CUSLER under his true nickness. Although LIFOTOR's 19 and 22 brew each other slightly socially, they were unaware of each others clandestine relationship with TRINNICH. LIFOTOR-19 knew Phiness F. SLINKARD through their close cooperation on the EECHICK/EEKNAVE operation (under true name). LIFOTOR-19 also knew CUSLER under true first name.
- 8. With paragraph 7 in mind, there Tollows a brief resume of each of the LIMOTOR agents:
 - A. LIEMBROIL-2. For the current period this agent has been a key writer for one of the leading INAH student newspapers, Revolucionario. He is well-versed in UNAH student affairs and has a wide range of contacts with student leaders. He and the newspaper were of particular interest to us, particularly because the latter was considered one of the biggest at UNAH but because it was also financed by the private secretary to LITENSOR in the name of LITENSOR's office. However by August Revolucionario was in bad financial straits, victim of embessioners of funds, and virtually extinct. Through LIMMON-19 we have attempted to exploit LIEMBROIL-2's other connections. We have tried to raise the level and desirability of his reporting. LIEMBROIL-2 does

not know LIMOTOR-14 by his true name, nor does he know that LIMOTOR-14 represents ODYORE or PRPRIME. We have tried to impress on LIENSROIL-2's mind that he is working for a "group of Mexican businessmen interested in knowing what is going on at the UNAM". This agent is paid 1,500 peace senthly.

B. LIMOTOR-14. With the termination of LIKAYAK-5 and LIMOTOR-14, this agent's responsibilities consisted of meeting LIMOROH-2 and thereafter to translate his reports. This we feel is not sufficient work for this agent whom we feel is a valuable long-range asset, and capable. We have been attempting to interest him in becoming a safe-house keeper in addition to his regular duties. He is also paid 1,500 perce menthly. He has taken on additional responsibilities at his present place of exployment, but as a target it is presently expletely uninteresting to us. Should LIKOTOR ever acquire additional non-FBPRINE assets, this agent would be the handler. He is a Mexican citizen.

C. LIMPTOR-19. This agent continues to concentrate on possible leads to present or future members of the Maxican equivalent of ODACID (see Project Renewal, VI. PLANS, B). Also during the period under review she did yeomen service in the BECHICK/BEKNAVE case (see also paragraph 3d (2) of HFWA-22370, dated 24 October 1953). In the first entegory she has already completed preliminary write-ups on ten of the 2) students of the servol in question. She is one of the finest elicitors of information we have seen and continues to do a fine job, whatever her assignment wight be. Incidentally she is on the executive board of the Robert Cuba Jones group, a strange constellation of students, and visitors including diplomats. LIMPTOR-19 is the regular source of the Station's list of School for Foreigners students.

D. LIFOTOR-22. He is a passive asset at the UMAM who has been instructed to report all that he sees or hears which deals with student political groupings of the left in all faculties at UNAM, with particular attention to student elections and political alignments. He has been in the best position, along with LIEMBROIL-2 to report on the activities of LICOAX and LILLISP-C. LIPOTOR-22 specifically, as well as LIMOTOR's 14 and 19, was scheduled for an LCFILITTER examination. The results of that examination will be discussed in the Progress Report covering the period after August 1963 or in a separate dispatch.

9. As indicated in the Project Renewal we have no immediate plans to expand numerically the assets of LIMOTOR.

PRODUCTION

10. During the period January - June 1963, 225 raw reports were produced by the LIMOTOR assets. Of these, 38 originated with Seymour D. TRINNICH; 3 with LIMOTOR-14; 33 with LIEMBFOIL-2 (although several of these contained several topics); 75 with LIMOTOR-19; and 76 with LIMOTOR-22. These figures may be further malyzed as follows:

The personality reports were routed to interested Station officers and wore than made part of existing personality files at the All of the reports connected with the UNAN were read by the Station KUCAGE officers for whatever action they felt was necessary. Reports dealing with EE subjects or personalities were routed to SLINKARD. This raw report production does serve to strengthan Station CI and personality files and by its very nature little of it ever sees the light of day in terms of formal dissemination outside the Station (an exception was NEXI-6693).

12. Unfortunately, only two of the 225 raw reports received formal dissemination, both originating with LIEVEROIL-2 (HFMS-6939 and 7577). As indicated in the Project Renewal submitted with HEMA-21650 and in NEWA-22370, it is hoped through proper guidance and increased direction to be able to raise the level of disseminable information originating within the LINDTOR Project. Efforts will be made to enlist the support of the MATRICH Political Section as well as the local GKFLOWAGE to better channel the LIVOTOR efforts and increase customer interest in the product, by providing the Station with suitable guidance where possible.

COVER

13. The Station has not encountered cover problems within the Project during the period under review. The capability of the Project is cortainly enhanced by the fact that the Staff Agent outside is under student cover. He can develop expertise in the LINDTOR target through his daily activities and comment with greater authority on the production of other LIMICEs.

14. Since early 1963 plans were made for the eventual appearance of an LCFLUITER team from Headquarters. Based on earlier correspondence, LIMMTOR-22 was a prime candidate, and both LIMMTOR's 19 and 22 were included in further planning for the LCFLUTTER visit.

15. No security incidents have occurred during the period under raview. As indicated in paragraph 3 above, Staff Agent meetings are held as close to the regular meetings with the inside Staffer as possible. Beargancy meetings can always be arranged. During the reporting period steps were taken to sterilize the LIMOTOR raw material as much as possible, to protect it against exposure of assets should it ever become compromised.

ADMINISTRATIVE

150 Effective 1 July 1963 LINOTOR-19°a salary was increased to 4,360 peace per much (less FBFRINE tax deductions). No other salary increase are contemplated.

17. All LIWOTOR production (raw reports eited under PRODUCTION above) is routed to COS and DXOS plus the interested Station officers.

CCHCLUSIONS

18. During the period under review, definite progress has been each toward the objectives as set down in paragraph 5 above. Plans call for Marvin A. CABOT to brief the Station's operational staff on LHEDTOR during one of the regular weekly operational staff meetings. Similarly, plans called for a meeting of CABOT, TRIMMICH, and MICHNOFF with Station KUCAGE officers. Continued effort is being made to improve the quality and scope of LHEDTOR agent reporting. And last but not ledst, three non-productive LINOTOR Agents were dropped. The next LIMOTOR Progress Report will descentrate even further progress toward these modest objectives.

19. One overall factor must also be considered. In view of the scope of this Station's operational activity, and given the very special political complexion of the student body and faculty of the UNAM, this Station carnot easily allow itself the lummery of being without a LIWTOR-type project.
