SUBJECT: Suggested Press Guidance on Release
of CIA Records on Kennedy Assassination

1. On 16 August, CIA released to the National Archives approximately 23,000 pages of declassified records related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The records are comprised of documents and other materials contained in CIA's file on Lee Harvey Oswald. This is in addition to approximately 12,000 pages from the Oswald file that were transferred to the National Archives in 1992. All of the records in the Oswald file that can be declassified--more than 90% of that file--have now been released.

2. A large volume of additional declassified records related to the assassination and investigation are to be released shortly. The records have been declassified under the requirements of the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992.
