Action Required: Renew the Project

- 1. On 28 June 1963 we pouched to Headquarters the renewal for Project LIMOTOR under HNTA-21650. We had every reason to believe that after a plausible period of time that the Project was undergoing usual Headquarters processing for renewal. We were therefore astonished and disappointed to say the least to learn in Reference (which we received on 19 September, and the separate cover to which we received on 17 September) that on 1 August a Project Extension was requested and not a Project Renewal. In future instances we request that you notify the Station immediately when the usual steps for renewal have not been taken, particularly where Projects are only extended and where you expect the Station to reply three days after the receipt of a dispatch in order to allow for timely Headquarters submissions about which the Station was belatedly notified. Other priorities have precluded earlier response to Reference.
- 2. In the interest of time and efficiency we propose to answer below the questions posed in paragraph 5 of attachment

to reference, and have Headquarters resubsit this information as an addendum to, or have it incorporated in the Renewal Request forwarded with HEMA-21650.

- 3. The following sub-paragraphs are keyed to Paragraph 5 of attachment to Reference:
 - During the past Project year, 1 August 1962 through 31 July 1963, the LIMOTOR complex produced 103 individual personality reports; 43 from Seymour D. TRIWNICH, 2 from LIMMBROIL-2, 2 from LIMOTOR-14, 43 from LIMOTOR-19, and 13 from LIMOTOR-22. These personality reports can be categorized as follows: parsonalities known or suspected to belong to or be identified with pro-covermist political groupings or philosophies, including Americane; Soviet personalities (LITALON-3); potential operational leads; particularly as it concerns the LIMOTOR effort against the Mexican counterpart of ODACID (see VI. FLANS of the LIMOTOR Project Renewal already forwarded). Those personality reports do not include the LIMOTOR coverage of UNAM lecture series given by known anti-American speakers (most of which originated with LIMUTOR-22) nor the regular list of UNAM School for Foreigners obtained by LIMDTOR-19). The LIMDTOR personality reports have not received dissemination, but are aids in terms of CI information and requests from local customers; specific reports are passed to area officers and have been found to be most useful.
 - b. During the project year 1 August 1962 31 July 1963, the LIMOTOR complex produced 11 reports on elections held in the various faculties of UNAK (two from Seymour D. TRINNICH, & from LIEMPROIL-2, 1 from LIMOTOR-19, and 4 from LITOTOR-22). These reports are considered excellent correborative information to the efforts of LICOAN according to the Station KUNOLP element. Directly related to the election reports are the reports on individual student party activities about which LIMCTOR produced eleven reports which the Station's KUNOLF element is still most interested in receiving on a priority basis. During the period of the student riots and other activities connected with the owster of Eli de Cortari Morelia, LIMOTOR produced three reports confirming Station efforts. Reports have also been produced on the LILISP-C, LINUPF Student group, and LICOAX, although not in the quantity desired. This emphasis has been reflected in the present project year. LIMUTOR-22 has also reported on LICOAX harmsement activities at UNAM and in one instance was a victim of same.
 - c. Through joint conversations between the KU/CLF element and the LIKOTOR staffers, more defined areas of interest and activity have been found to which LIKOTOR assets are now being directed. At the same time LIKOTOR agents are being further trained to prepare their material in a more readily disseminable form on subjects of

sufficient interest to customers. Through these efforts we hope to be able to produce more positive intelligence disseminations from the LIFOTOR Project.

- The following are exemples of LIMMOR information which was of value to Station case officers:
 - (1) For the KUMOLF officers see sub-paragraph above.
 - (2) A check with Headquarters REDOX elements will clearly rowal the contribution made by LIMOFOR-19 to the BECHICK/BENAVAVE case. This was clearly pointedout in the Project Heneval subsidesion (please see II ASSETS, C. LIMOTOR-19). During the past project year LIMOFOH-19 substitted 12 written reports on her contects with BECHICK. In addition several special meetings were held with her, TRINNICH and Phineas F. SLINKARD for the purpose of briefing and debriefing her on the BECHICK/BECNAVE case. Her most effective role in providing the Station with parallel developments in this important ease has drawn the constant praise of SLINKARD.
 - Gerald P. GESTETMER levied a requirement on the LINCTOR project to produce a lead of a person who could be used as access to a local Soviet known to be ONU and considered a NEDCAP possibility. Several reports on this lead were subsitted by Seymour D. TRINNICH, however, this has not further developed to date. LIMPTOR-19 also submitted several reports on a Station lead who was a REDSOX candidate. This also did not materialise, but represented a special LIMTIOR effort for a Station case officer.
 - (4) During the summer of 1963, the Station DIZTAG element in the person of Phineas P. SLINKARD requested the LIMOTOR complex to produce a lead into the local DIZTAG cultural society and thus to the local DIZTAG diplomatic installation. Although Seymour D. THIMICH did produce several reports on such a candidate the lead never externalized but was an example of its value to a Station officer.
- The Mollowing are the current outstanding LIFOTOR tarmets:
 - (1) Communist, pro-communist, and communist front organizations, individuals, and student groupings at the UNAM; the activities of these targets.
 - (2) Soviet or Soviet bloc personalities known to attend, visit, or otherwise appear at the UMAH

- (4) Students now attending a special school in Maxico City (separate and distinct from the UMAM) for the purpose of assessment and ultimate recruitment of personalities in the Paxican equivalent of CDACID. Please see Project Renewal submission VI. PLANS, B.
- f. During the Project year 1 August 1962 31 July 1963 there were no security, cover or control problems.
 - g. We have not coordinated the LIMOTOR Project with any local CDYOKE, Mexican government, or non-Mexican government groups. HEPINCH provided the Station with the lead and access to LIMOTOR-22 which lead to his recruitment.
 - h. The LIMITOR Staff Agent spends about 2 1/2 hours weekly on each LIMITOR field agent under normal circumstances, or about 7 to 8 hours weekly. In addition the LIMITOR Staff Agent 10 almost constantly on the job living his cover, making contacts, and writing-up these contacts. While he spends a good portion of his daily life on the job, it is almost impossible to cite a figure which could accurately state the number of hours he spends on KUBARK/LIMITOR activities. The inside Case Officer expends an average of four hours weekly on LIMITOR mattern under normal circumstances. Special activities such as project remember and this dispatch would be exceptions to the norma.
- 4. Concerning paragraph 4 of Reference, it should be quite clear to Headquarters by this writing that LIEFSHOIL-2 has been incorporated into the LIFFNOR Project. Please see HFMA-20753, dated 19 February 1963, HFMA-11488 dated 12 April 1963, HFMA-21146, dated 26 April 1963; HFMA-11568, dated 17 May 1963; HFMA-21649, dated 28 June 1963; and the LIEFCROR Project Renewal substitted under HFMA-21650, dated 27 June 1963. At an appropriate time we will consider changing the LIEFCROIL-2 cryptonym but do not consider it a priority at this time.
- 5. We hope soon to prepare a Progress Report on the LIMDICA Project, probably covering the period January-July 1963. Beginning with August 1963 we plan to have Metalie S. MICHNOFF prepare LIMDION Progress Reports for regular three month periods.
