Senstudy 75

Captioned matter pertains to Bureau's handling of requests from Senate and House Select Committees to study Governmental operations with respect to intelligence activities. In connection with work of these committees, staff members may seek to interview current and former FBI employees.

Recently, the Senate Select Committee (SSC) staff has interviewed several former employees and it is anticipated that many more such personnel will be contacted.

The FBI has pledged full cooperation with the committee and we wish to assist and facilitate any investigations undertaken by the committee with respect to the FBI. However, we do have an obligation to insure that sensitive sources and methods and ongoing sensitive investigations are fully protected. Should any former employee contact your office and have any question regarding his obligation not to divulge information obtained by virtue of his past FBI employment, he should be instructed to contact Legal Counsel, FBIHQ, by collect call. Your conversations with former employees must be in keeping with our pledge. It is believed such a procedure would insure proper protection and also facilitate the work of the SSC.

The above procedure also applies to current employees of this office. However, contact with the Legal Counsel should be handled through the SAC.

Reference airtels to ADIC, New York dated 9/20/79, and 9/28/79, captioned as above.

Reference airtel of 9/20/79, sets forth both background on Congressman Young and my approval for Congressman Young and a Staff Member of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence to visit both the New York Office and Miami Division for briefing purposes. Congressman Young's visit, however, was subsequently postponed because of pressing Congressional business.

Congressman Young has now, however, indicated that he will be able to visit the Miami Division on either March 28 or in mid-April, 1980.

Congressman Young has indicated he is interested in being briefed on the Miami Division's Foreign Counter-intelligence and Counterterrorism Programs. Specifically, he is interested in the activities of Cuban and/or other Hostile intelligence services in the Miami Division territory such as collection of protected information, collection against Cuban exiles and agent of influence operations. He is also interested in knowing the extent to which Cuban exiles may be subjected to harassment by hostile intelligence services.

Congressman Young is also interested in the manner the Miami Division is managing and allocating its resources in these programs.

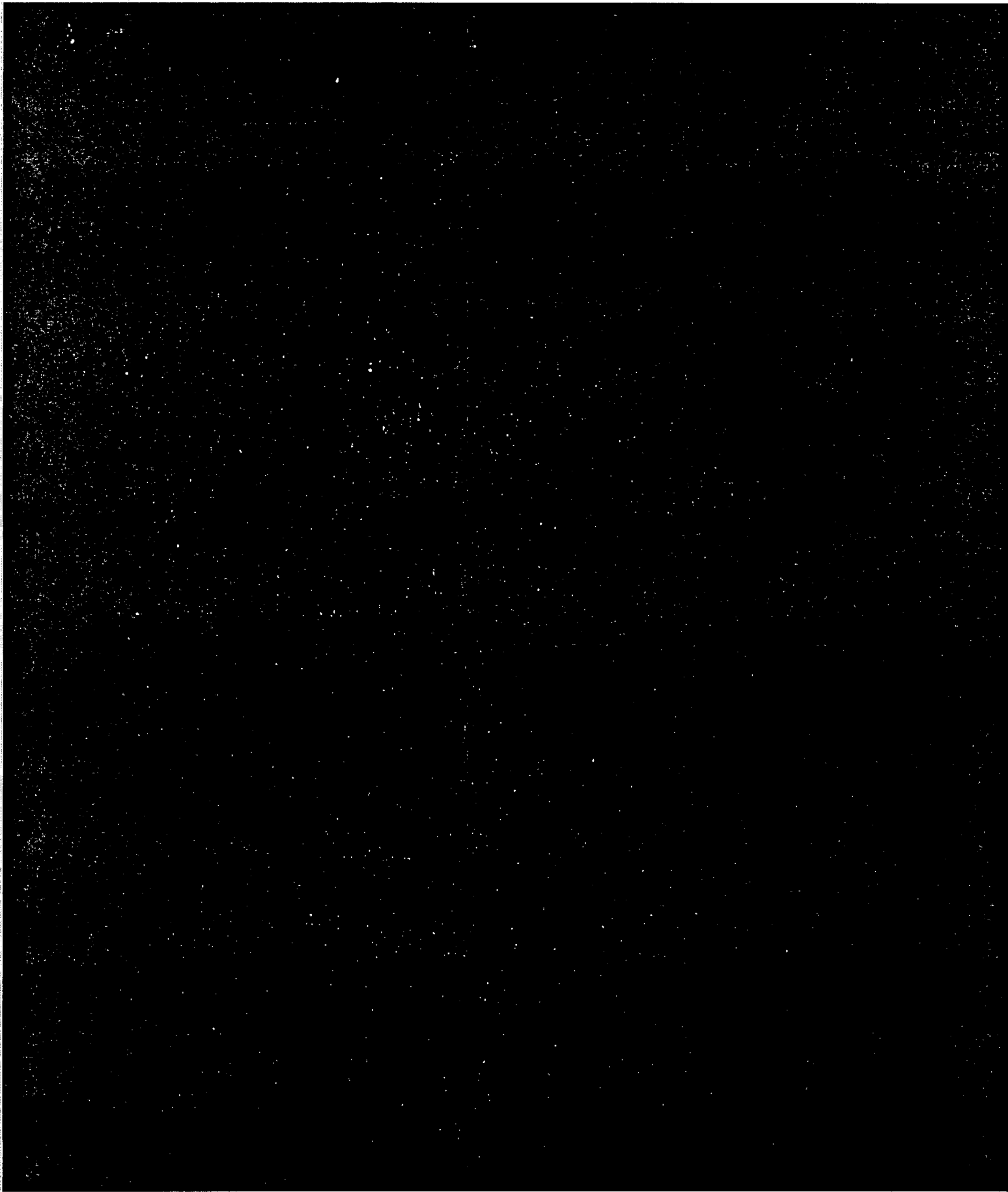

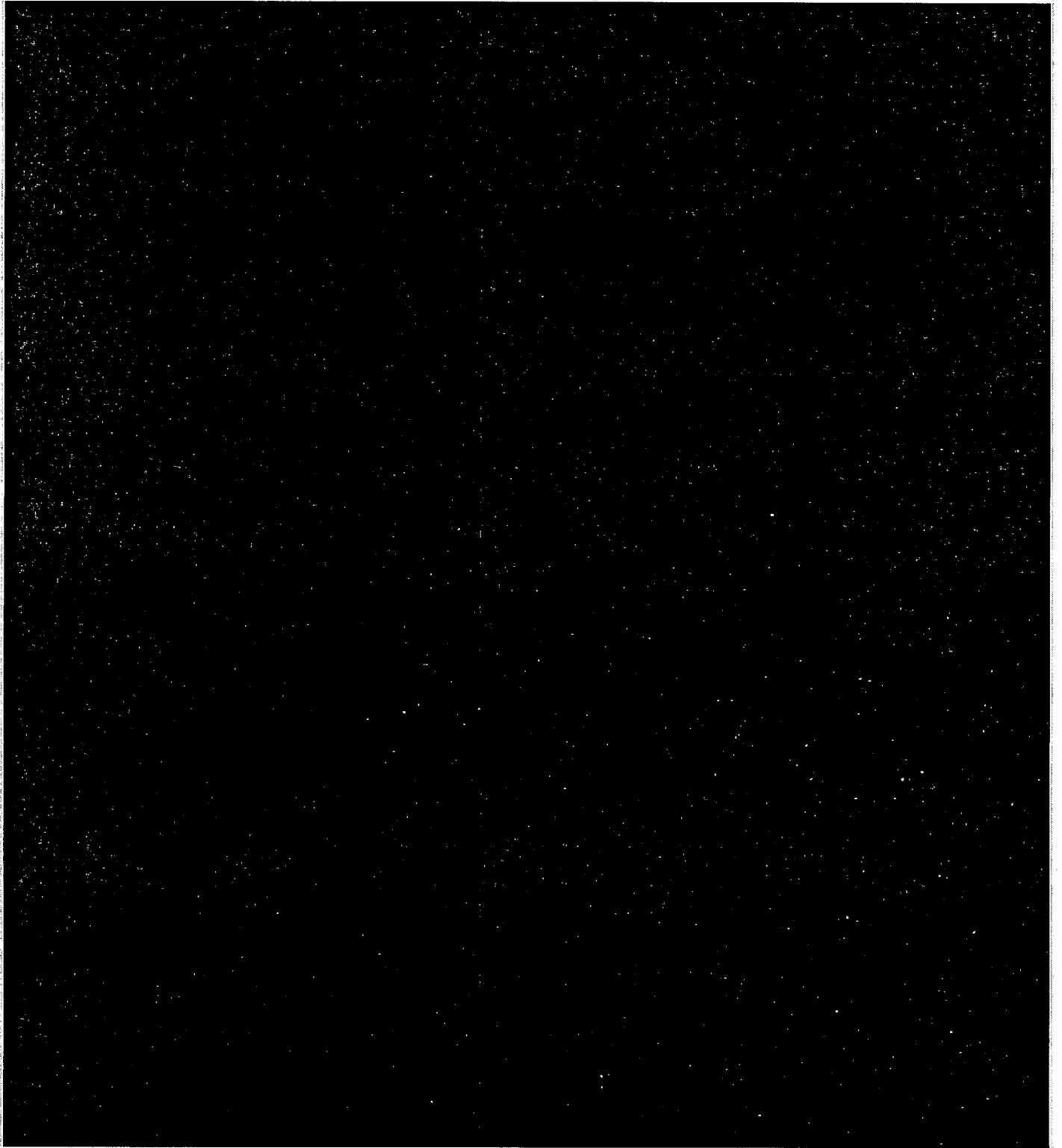

For information of New York, on 3/11/81 FBI Director Judge Webster received a letter from Congressman Edward P. Boland, Chairman U. S. House of Representatives Permanent Select Committee of Intelligence, requesting the FBI respond to a number of interrogatives. (U)

Question #2 read, "We have had testimony from CIA on Soviet active measures abroad. Can the FBI provide this Committee with the same kind of testimony on active measures in the U. S.?" The FBI response at that time advised this Committee that an "Active Measures" study was being prepared by this Bureau and that upon completion a copy would be provided to the Committee. (U)

The FBI's KGB Active Measures study is near completion and upon FBIHQ approval will be submitted in final form to HPSCI in compliance with our initial response regarding this matter. (U)
