On March 15, 1962, CHARLES SAMS, United States Mail Carrier, advised SA STEPHEN J. LABADIE that, although he had carried mail to subject's residence at 2505 Bristol Avenue for the past five years, he had never seen subject. He states, as a matter of interest, he hardly ever sees anyone at 2505 Bristol Avenue, and has only been in contact with an individual he knows as ANNIE MAE JACKSON, the colored maid, because he also delivers mail to her residence, 2505 DeLeon. He noted that even though ANNIE MAE had been pleasant enough with him over several years, she has never divulged any information concerning subject or his residence. This source endeavored to locate subject at his residence on March 15, 1962, and reported subject was not at his residence.

TP T-1 is ROBERT J. JONES, Manager, Rocky Point Beach Motel, who requested his identity be concealed.

TP T-2 is CS TP 51-C, whose identity is known to Bureau.
