3. EXPLAIN ANY TRAINING SUBJECT HAS HAD IN CRYPTOSTIC OPERATIONS.	<p>Under auspices of "AMWORLD", Subject was trained in the use of the one-time pad. He underwent extensive paramilitary and intelligence training during JMATE.</p>
