## MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD:

SUBJECT: Telephone Conversation with the Director, 27 July 1959,  
12:30 p.m., Concerning Marcos Diaz Lanz.

1. Since Colonel King had not spoken with either General Cabell or Mr. Helms concerning assisting Marcos Diaz Lanz in coming to the States, and since neither Mr. Dahlgren nor Mr. [Reynolds] knew any-<sup>03</sup> thing about any such conversation with the Director, after discussing this matter with Mr. Helms on 27 July, and upon Mr. Helms' recommendation, I telephoned the Director concerning this matter.

2. The Director said he had not discussed this with Colonel King, and asked me what was the issue. I said that I knew State <sup>WOULD</sup> not like the idea of us having brought this man into the country, and should we tell them. The Director asked me where the man was and I told him he was now in Florida and that I had received instructions from Colonel King to bring him up here and make him available to the intelligence community. The Director said he did not think it was a good idea for Marcos to come here now, and recommended we hold him in Florida for a few days, but to tell State we have him but not admit that we helped bring him over. <sup>ALSO TO MAKE HIM AVAILABLE TO THE INTEL COMMUNITY.</sup>

3. The Director's instructions as above were complied with.
