SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

Files of this organization reveal the following information regarding SUBJECT:

Premier Otto Grotewohl received a letter addressed to him at the Russian Embassy, Berlin (UU9220), East Germany, postmarked 11 June 1957, from Mrs. L. Bulson, SUBJECT's mother, who resides at 23 Ruth Street, Bargoed Glam, South Wales, Great Britain. The letter stated as follows:

"23 Ruth St Bargoed Glam South Wales, Great Britain 21 April 1957

Dear Sir;

Once again I am writing to you, but this time I am sending it back to Berlin with a person who is living there, but has been staying here for a holiday. I thought perhaps you are more sure of getting this letter if it was posted in Berlin than if it was posted here. Will you please send my son back home to us. He is in Bautzen, Wall Str 4. He is the only one we have, and we have not seen him since Xmas 1954. Perhaps he is afraid to come back here, because he was in the British Army. He may think that he will get punished, but that is not so. Please send him back and please will you tell him that everything will be alright if he comes home again. Please will you do this for his father and I because we want him home so much. He is all we have and we don't want to lose him.
