

NOT AU WITHER

- 1. In response to a telephone inquiry made in July 1964 concerning the time required for issuance of a Soviet visa for a US businessman, the Soviet consul in Helsinki stated that he could issue a transit vies (valid for 24 hours) is five minutes but that for a longer stay he would need about a week to process a visa application and have Inturist arrange for lodgings. He implied that the main reason for delays in visa issuances was a shortage of hotel space in the USSR.
- 2. A Finaish travel agency representative said in July 1964 that he is able to obtain Seviet tourist visas for his customers within live days if he pushes the matter.
- 3. A telephone check with the Soviet consulate in Stockholm in July 1964 revealed that normal visa processing there takes seven days but that this can be shortened to five days 'in exceptional cases." The Soviet official receiving the telephone call stated that it was impossible to get a visa within two or three days.
