The following information supplemental to references was acquired during two Station meetings with AMBANG-1 (on 02 and 23 June 1968) and several meetings with (Q)REPORT-1 during the same period.</p> <p>2. AMBANG-1 expects that Subject (201-773270) will be returning to Cuba in the near future. (In relation to the return of Subject to Cuba, Subject told (Q)REPORT-1 on 21 July that he had arranged to meet him at the airport upon his arrival.) On this visit, Subject stated that same day, Although AMBANG-1 gave no specific information concerning the character and general disposition of Subject, he nevertheless felt that Subject, in conjunction with his present contacts, had potential for contact within military circles in Cuba.</p> <p>3. In general no definite plans were made during the conversations between AMBANG-1 and Subject to define various means of communication were established for future contact:</p> <p>A. Mail. AMBANG-1 gave Subject three different mail drops in the United States (New York, Miami, San Juan, Puerto Rico) for his correspondence to AMBANG-1 inside Cuba.</p> <p>B. Telephone. In comment that telephone contact is desired, Subject is to call [redacted] who resides in Miami and is the contactor of one of the [redacted] in Cuba. per DOI 70-17 following plan was established for clandestine operations. Subject will send a picture of his boat, a 100' long boat for excursions to HABANA via VINALES. In ACROSS THE LOST SEA BOAT, which also served the purpose for clandestine liaison work. AMBANGU, it turns, will be used to procure a boat identical to the said pictures sent by Subject. Accordingly, on 14 APRIL 1959, plans were made and agreed upon to depart from a point in Cuba, probably from VINALES, west of CUBA. All official Cuban Government cover, including false names, identifying the clearance necessary for the initial transit, was made up prior to the departure of the boat. The clandestine boat would then depart CUBA, passing out of sight of land, and proceed for HAVANA. The two boats (the clandestine boat and the official boat acquired by AMBANGU) will rendezvous off HAVANA and make appropriate arrangements, then return to their original port of destination.

4. AMBANGU generated that he had a 100'-foot boat which he had through [REDACTED] and relatives in HABANA.

5. WILLIAM H. COOPER CO. has against FIDEL CASTRO, personally \$10,000 worth of arms and other items in bank balances as a result of the usurpation of the Cuban Government.
