- 1. Forwarded as Attachment One under separate cover are reports prepared by Wallace B. ROWTON on the activities of LIRING-3, dated 9, 13, 22, 23, 25, 26 and 27 May 1967. Forwarded as Attachment Two, also under separate cover, are photocopies of correspondence exchanged between LIRING-3 in Nexico City and Paz FESPEJO in Havana. Forwarded as Attachment Three herewith, is a pamphlet obtained by LIRING-3 which tentains the text of the message allegedly sent the Tri-Continental organization by Ernesto "Che" GUEVARA.
- 2. There is little question that LTRING-3 must often ask bimself just where his association with ROWTON is taking him and must speculate about just what ROWTON is after. There are obviously times when, left to conjectures and suppositions, LIRING-3 must feel like "quitting;" Yet, the ascendancy gradually developed by ROWTON over LIRING-3 has reached the point where LIRING-3 is unwilling to go back to the drab, uninteresting life he lived before meeting ROWTON. The result of LIRING-3 s "second thoughts" has up to now been a desire, in the end, to collaborate even more closely with ROWTON. ROWTON's report dated 13 May, and more particularly, LIRING-3's scribble attached to that report, give an indication of the confusion which exists in LIRING-3's mind as a result of the contacts he maintains at ROWTON's urging with the Cubans, Guatemalan rebels, and various shades of Mexican and Central American leftists.

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In addition LIRING-3, a professional artist finds himself involved in the development of a commercial venture, an undertaking for which he is ill equipped. This other shortcoming requires very close guidance by ROWTON and, in turn, makes LIRING-3 even more dependant on his case officer. Thus, while LIRING-3 occasionally thinks of returning to painting and OS giving art lessons and develops qualms about taking money from ROLFON for what he considers to be little result, LIKING-3 keeps involving himself deeper and deeper in activities of interest to ROWTON.


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

Tallace B. Rowton Meeting with LIRING/3.

CENTER MOOK

1. Rowton met with LIRING/3 at the safehouse from 1800 until about 1930 on 25 May, 1967. InRING/3 reported that as yet he had not heard from Garcia and would stand by for the next two days in the hope that Garcia would reappear at his home. LIRING/3 agreed to invite Garcia, once he did appear, to coffee or lunch at a restaurant on 20 or 30 May so that Rowton could get a look at him. LIRING/3 also reported that LIRING/4 had been working parttime, in the mornings, at the Consulate and that her rapport with the local staff was improving. Rowton suggested that it might be the right time to give LIRING/4 some compensation for her efforts. LIRING/3 agreed and promised to ask LIRING/4 to be at the safehouse at 1000 on 27 May, so that Rowton could again talk privately with her and give her the money (Rowton suggested 500 pesos, and LIRING/3 agreed that this would be adequate).

- 2. LIRING/3 reported that LIRING/4's resumption of contact had begun to pay off better than he had thought possible. He explained that she had found an opportunity on the afternoon of 23 May to chat with Abelardo Curbeld and had returned home with some interesting imformation concerning the Cuban attitude toward LIRING/3 himself. According to LIRING/3, LIRING/4 said that Curbelo told her that he was happy that she had familiar come back in close contact wi the Consulate! In commenting on LIRING/3, Curbelo in a more or less joking we stated that LIRING/4 must understand that the "revolution is surrounded by provocations" and that many persons on the outside, such as LIRING/3, have become innocent victims of organizations such as WOFACTI, that are constantly sending provocations against the revolution. Curbelo stressed that he did not feel that LIRING/3 fell into that category, but LIRING/4 must understand the precautions that have to be taken by the revolution. He concluded that he hoped LIRING/3 would not take offense (tomarlo a mal) and would feel free to
- 3. LIRING/3 then stated that he was doing his best to keep active certain contacts he had had in the past that were on the periphery of the official Cuban circle. He mentioned specifically the case of Silvia and Horacio Durán that then explained the background of his relationship with them. He related that Silvia Durán worked as receptionist at the Consulate in 1963-64 and was on duty when Lee Harvey Oswald applied for a visa. She had been recommended to the Cubans by Teresa Proenza, the Press Attaché from 1959 until 1962. LI-RING/3 described Teresa Proenza as a Cuban-worse a seed about 52, a Lesbian, and a member of the Communist Party of Cuba, horwas currently in jail in

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Cuba as the result of a conviction for espionage on behalf of NOFACT. LIRING/3 recalled that during his last visit to Havana, a friend of his in
the Ministry of Education, informed him of Teresa Proenza's present situation
and advised LIRING/3, in the event he was asked, he deny that he had known
Teresa Proenza or had had anything to do with her. LIRING/3 continued that
just the other day Silvia Durán had telephoned him to say hello was that he
had visited her at her home to renew his acquaintance. (LIFEAT 300-26(10.8)
reveals that at about 1245 on 22 May 1967, LIRING/3 telephoned 15-78-11 and
asked for sra. Silvia. When (maid) informed him she not in, he asked for sr.
Horacio. When same negative reply given, he asked that they be advised that
LIRING/3 had talled to say hello. SAN-26 (11.0) reveals an incoming call
from Silvia Durán in which she asks how he obtained her number. To rephies:
"At the Cuban Institute". She states that she is studying at some school and
at the moment is free to talk to LIRING/3. The latter replies that he would
go by to visit her (Constituyentes 143, apt 3) in a few minutes.)

- 4. LIRING 3 continued that Silvia Durán informed him that she had first met Oswald when he applied for a visa and had gone out with him several times sin she liked him from the start. She admitted that she had sexual relations with him but insisted that she had no idea of his plans. When the news of the assassination broke she stated that she was immediately taken into ematody by the Mexican police and interrogated thoroughly and beaten metal she admitted that she had had an affair with Oswald. She added that ever since then she ha cut off all contact with the Cubans, particularly since her husband Horacio, who was badly shaken by the whole affairs, went into a rage and has forbidden her to see them. She added that she felt certain that her telephone was tapped by the Mexican police, or, more probably by WOFACT, since tapping was an expensive proposition and the Mexicans wouldn't be able to afford it for so long a period.
- 5. Rowton counseled LIRING/3 against any further contact with the Duráns on the ground that it might put him under some sort of suspicion either in the eyes of the Mexican police or the Cubans. He pointed out that little or nothing was to be gained from such a contact.
- 5. LIRING/3 then produced, at Rowton's request, we sketch of the Consulate and Embassy premises, copy of which is attached. LIRING/3 commented that to his knowledge Cepeda did not have an office, at least not on the first floor. His other comments appear on the sketch as reproduced by Rowton.

SUBJECT: Meeting with Mr. Slawson of the Presidential Commission

on 5 May Idenderning telephony convenention between Caban

of the Commission in Mr. Whitten and Mr. Hall met with Mr. Slawson of the Commission in Mr. Whitten soffice. This meeting had been requested to ask for a fresh translation of the taped conversation between Cuban President Dorticos and Ambassador Armas. Win Scott had told the Commission staff visiting Mexico City that his translators, in the rush at that time, might have misconstrued certain nuances of meaning in what was a difficult recording. In view of this, Mr. Slawson asked that a new translation be made, if possible, by a person knowledgeable of the Cuban dialect.

- 2. According to Mr. Slawson, only Messrs. Rankin, Willens, Coleman (?) and he presently know of the telephone taps in Mexico City. Slawson, Willens and Coleman were briefed on the taps during their visit to Mexico City.
- 3. In about three weeks the staff will begin presenting to the Commission evidence on the conspirational aspect of the assassination. At this time, apparently, their evidence is against the existence of a plot. They will wish to present to the Commission the Armas Dorticos conversation. Slawson suggested the possibility that a knowledgeable CIA man could make this presentation, interpreting the conversation in the light of our study.
- 4. Mr. Whitten said that we will again translate the tape, using the best available Cuban linquist, and once again study the nuances of the conversation. Any presentation to the Commission, however, would have to be referred to Messes. Helms and Rocca for decision. According to Mr. Slawson, no member of the Commission now knows of the telephone taps in Mexico City (he did not mention Mr. Dulles).

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- 5. Mr. Whitten carefully briefed Mr. Slawson (probably rebriefed him) on the importance of these telephone taps to U.S. security and the grave damage that would be done to U.S. Mexican relations if knowledge of their existence became public.
- 6. Mr. Slawson quite clearly was a bit unhappy that certain information could not be used, since the taps were the only source. OSWALD's very bad Russian was the example he used. I asked what opinion Mrs. OSWALD had of her husband's Russian. She thought that he spoke it very well.
- 7. Mr. Slawson asked if the retranslation of the Dorticos Armas conversation could be made available to him by the end of next week.
- 8. According to Mr. Slawson, the Commission Staff had come up with the idea that Silvia DURAN might be invited to the United States, ostensibly to be interviewed by a periodical, and then questioned by the Commission. The Chief Justice turned down the proposal at once, on the ground that she was a Communist and U.S. Mexican relations might be damaged. This idea has been abandoned.
- 9. From Mr. Slawson's remarks it is evident that the preparation of the Commission's report has begun, and is in its initial stages.
- 10. Mr. Whitten called me after the meeting to say that the work of retranslating the Dorticos-Armas conversation from the tape had started.
