Security Violation - Exposed Classified Material [EBIT OPTH, Susan]03 FAILLIPS, David A.

INCIDENT:

1. While conducting a security patrol in Room 2015, Barton Hall at 2200 hours on 22 April 1960, Geard G. L. Samuels found a sheaf of classified documents in a metal correspondence divider on top of one of the desks. The Eight Security Officer, Donald Prichard, deternined that the documents were SECENT copies of official dispatches which he impounded at 2215 hours.

INVECTIONTICS:

03 2. Liss Engan Mentvorth, custodian of the documents, advised that she must have indivertently overlooked then she secured her office before departing at about 1720 hours on 20 April 1960.

03 3. Miss [Kartha Horvath] who was working with Hiss [mentworth] secured her working erea in Hoom 2015 at the same time as did Hiss 03 [Wentworth.] when she departed a few sinutes after 7. 83 [Wentworth] 09 she did not notice the exposed documents which had been left unsecured by Mics Lentworth of In this instance it is not deemed appropriate to charge hirs [Horvath] with a violation of security regulations since essentially her departure was timed with that of Miss [Hentworth] and her being last to leave the room is considered to be a technicality.

4. Kr. David Phillips, Will Staff Duty Checker on 22 April 1960, double checked Room 2015 after it had been vacated for, the day and prior to 1 00 hours. He also stated that he did not see the exposed documents.

CONCLUSION:

03 5. As costodian of the exposed classified material, Eiss Eentworth was responsible for its secure storage. As the Staff Duty Checker, Hr. Phillips was responsible for detecting the fact that classified material had not been properly secured. As each failed to properly discharge his respective responsibility in this matter, each will be charged with an Exposed Classified haterial security violation.
