2. On h Hovember 1958 Hollie BLOCK (born 6 Hovember 1911 in New York), holder of American passport Ho. 116708, left Schiphol Airport in Ameterdam on a KLM flight bound for Hopeow via Marsaw. She traveled with her child Johanna Horris BLOCK, born in 1950, who was easid to be in possession of a Greek passport. Mrs. BLOCK had seriginally planned to fly to Hoseow on 2 September, but her trip was postpaned by the circumstances outlined below.

3. On 30 August 1958 Morris BLOCK, husband of Mollie BLOCK, arrived at Amsterdam on a KLH flight from Hontreal. BLOCK was convying American passport No. 921617, issued 12 April 1956 but changed by him to read 12 April 1958 se that is would appear to be still valid. Hearis BLOCK was refused entry to The Betherlands on the basis of his falsified passport. The American Consulate in Amsterdam validated his passport for a single return trip to How York, and he was sent back to How York on a KLH plane at 2359 hours on 30 August 1958.

he Merris RLOCK was born in New York on 30 Harch 1920; he is a machinist by compation, and his home address was given as 250 Corbin Place; Excelys, Her Tork. BLOCKS's passport carried the fellowing

BLOCK stated to the Datch passport control officer that he had visited the USSR 25 July 1957 - 15 October 1957 as a delegate to the World Youth Fectival held in Mostow in 1957. BLOCK stated it was his plan to travel from The Hetherlands to Moseow and to settle himself and his family there. He said his visa for Russia was ready at the Seviet Embassy in The Hague and that since he was not permitted to obtain a new valid passport, he had changed the date of issuance of his former passport to make it appear to be still valid. Since he had not known for sure that he would be allowed to depart from the United States, his wife and child were to take a later plane to Amsterdam after his wife know he had reached Ganada. He said that he had been unsuployed in the United States and that his wife had had to support the family on her salary of \$65 a week.

- g. BLOCK stated to the Dutch passport control officer that there was only one country in the world where freedom was really possible, and that he wished to go times. He no longer wanted to live in America, for the laws were made there by three or four families and the rest had to fall in line. He had had more than enough of the elique around Risenhover. He stated he no longer valued his American mationality and saked if they could not admit him so that he could apply to the Russian Embassy. He said his wife had the money and thekets for the trip to Moscow from Amsterdam.
- 6. BLOCK had with him a suiteese and a cage with a parret; his wife was to take the rest of their belongings with her. Also in his possession were:
 - Benchmant Store Union, AFL-GIO, 13 Actor Place, New York 3, Actor Place, Brooklyn 35, Hembership number 58923, membership peid up to 25 August 1958. In addition, he carried a District 65, AFL-GIO Employment Office Caids giving a registration date of 29 July 1958.

 - to the viciting cards on which were: SH Jilly and SE 210th.

7. BLOCK also threw eway a used piece of carbon paper which he obviously did not want to have with him or his return to the USA. The carbon read as follows:

8. BLOCK had \$63 with him. A room had been reserved at the Matel Krasmapolsky in Amsterdam for him and his wife, mines they had planned to travel together to Moscow on 2 September 195t. On his departure for the United States, BLOCK exclaimed as follows: "Oh, most I have to go back to the United States, but I have no money and I also had not paid for the trip, so what more can happen to me?"
