Purposes and Activities: Interests include the improvement of inter-cultural and inter-racial relations; the protection of civil liberties; the prevention and treatment of emotional disturbances, etc.

[redacted] channeled the following amounts of CIA money to CIA projects:

1961 - \$15,000 to American Society for African Culture (AMSAC)

1962 - \$10,000 to African-American Institute (AAI)

1963 - \$15,000 to Pan American Foundation (PAF). (This represented a part of the total budget for PAF in 1963. Virtually all PAF funds in 1963 were used for grants to individual recipients of Agency operational interest. No domestic organizations received any of the funds.)

1964 - \$10,000 to International Development Foundation (IDF)

Korman Fund gave its own money to the following CIA projects:

1962 - \$7,500 to American Society for African Culture (AMSAC)

1962 - \$3,000 to African Research Foundation

1962 - \$3,100 to U.S. National Student Association (USNSA)

We hold copies of Schedule of Ordinary Grants of the [redacted] for 1962 and 1963. These documents confirm the figures and the recipients cited in the [redacted]. No CIA funds were given for other than the four grants listed above.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Deputy Director for Operations

REFERENCE: New York Times Article [redacted]

1. Reference reports that the President of the [redacted] said that he was approached by a "mysterious gentleman" from the CIA in 1963 or 1964 and asked to pass about \$15,000 in Government funds to the [redacted] of which [redacted] was then Chairman of the board. OS files reveal that the [redacted] (formerly the [redacted]) was never used to pass CIA funds to the [redacted] as implied in inference. Attached is the record of CIA funds passed through the [redacted] and bonafide grants made by the funds to CIA projects. It is noted that in 1961, the [redacted] passed \$15,000 of CIA funds to the American Society for African Culture (ASAC). Possibly [redacted] confused this funding for African activities with the [redacted]

2. It is true as reported in the article and sourced to an executive of the [redacted], that the fund supported a single Agency program in the 1960s. This program was the [redacted] as Agency-controlled non-profit organization active in the Latin American labor field. CIA's use of the [redacted] to fund the [redacted] terminated in 1964 when use of the [redacted] was exposed in Congressional hearings of the [redacted]. OS files confirm that the [redacted] made in 1965 a bonafide grant to the [redacted] for Greek refugee relief. There is no evidence that CIA funds were passed to the Kaplan Fund for any other purpose than support of the [redacted]

3. Although there is no evidence that CIA ever directly or indirectly funded the International Rescue Committee or Freedom House, Mr. Stone personally and through his firm, Research Institute of America, [redacted] A 300 agent, Joel A.

REASON OR ASSUMED REASON FOR INCLUSION IN THIS COLLECTION.

A review of the HSCA volumes did not surface an "Abram" Chayes but an "Abraham" Chayes, a legal advisor to the State Department, who maintained that at the time Oswald received his visa to enter Russia from the Soviet Embassy in Helsinki, normally at least 1 week would elapse between the time of a tourist's application and the issuance of a visa. It would appear that Abram and Abraham are not identical to each other. Betty Lichtenfeld of the HSCA reviewed the file on 17 August 1978.
