MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

SUBJECT: Views of AMEMBASSY on Current Cuban Exile Situation

1. The next logical action for AMEMBASSY and the one most urgently needed is the selection of a single chairman to replace the rule-by committee that is now employed by AMEMBASSY.
2. The most obvious choice for chairman is AMEMBASSY.
3. Because of the bitter personal differences between AMEMBASSY and AMERI, the selection of AMEMBASSY as chairman could very well bring about the resignation of AMERI from AMEMBASSY. This would not in the least weaken AMEMBASSY and might in fact strengthen it.
4. The views expressed above are those of AMEMBASSY-3, who made a special trip to the Headquarters area on 1 September 4. met Paul J. PAMECH and discussed these matters with him. The meeting lasted from 1630 until 1930 hours in a local hotel room.
5. As AMEMBASSY-3 sees it, the selection of a single chairman would automatically solve several of the current problems of AMEMBASSY. For example, it would speed the decision-making process. It would force AMEMBASSY to work for the common good rather than his own particular political interests. It would present the committed Cuban exiles with a strong personality around whom they could rally in the traditional Latin pattern.
6. AMEMBASSY-3 paints quite an encouraging picture regarding the Miami office of AMEMBASSY, but he says the good talent assigned by the majority of AMEMBASSY to head up the Miami office is being frustrated by the unilateral actions of AMERI, who refuses to be bound by decisions which AMEMBASSY took in his absence. Two good examples are the following:
- (initially) Dr. J. C. V. Underhill
- a. AMEMBASSY names AMERI-1 chose RENEALVERO (fmw) as head of the Communications Committee. RENEALVERO is a graduate of MIT and an instructor there. He was granted leave without pay by MIT to accept the AMEMBASSY post. AMEMBASSY-3 has the highest respect for him. However, when AMERI-1 returned to Miami he immediately insisted on putting one of his men, CARLO (fmw), in as head of the Communications Committee. CARLO was formerly a part of the communist organization of the 60 of July movement. He operated in Carrizas. He is probably well-qualified for the job but he is completely loyal to AMERI-1 and was not the choice of AMEMBASSY for the chairmanship.
- b. Colonel MATTEZ Elosea is an outstanding figure and the best possible choice to head up the Military Committee. Although he was only issued a written verbal invitation to leave Cuba and join AMEMBASSY by AMEMBASSY at the outset, his response was immediate acceptance, to the surprise of AMEMBASSY. Since his arrival in Miami he has impressed

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ABMAIL-3 and others as a strong leader, honest, dedicated and professionally competent. Once again, however, AMAIL-3 wishes to replace MARTELL with Colonel Oscar DIAZ. A struggle for power is under way between MARTELL's men and AMAIL, much to the detriment of ANFASD's military effort.

7. At the instructions of the ANFASD members in Mexico, ANFASD-1 was to arrive in Miami on 31 August to put ANFASD-1 in his place... AMAIL-3 is hopeful that this meeting will have the desired effect. He has promised to provide a private report on the outcome to ANFASD.

8. Among the other five members of ANFASD there is good faith. They do not see eye to eye in all matters, but they are willing in the interest of unity to resolve their differences in a civilised manner.

9. In reply to a query concerning Major Raul CHIRAS, AMAIL-3 gave an unfavorable description. He called CHIRAS a person of little moral fiber who has been trying, without success, to form a competing organization headed by himself, ANFASD-1 and ANFASD-2.

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
