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Anatoliy Likinglovich COLITSGI <u>Dona 25.0.1925</u>. Derected in Finland 25.12.1951.

GOLITSIN defected during nource's period of cervice with the X.G.B. Source heard about him from various X.O.B. officers but never not him and knew of him only by this name. <u>Irian TEPLIANOTA</u> however also knew of GOLITSIN on KLDOV. She heard him story when she visited her parents in Finland and, while there, she met GOLITSIN's wife who called on her mother.

2. With regard to COLITSYN's defection, source said he had been told in London by both <u>Konstantin Ivanovich ZOTOV</u> had of K.C.A. Janneh 2 (Counter-intelligence) there, and <u>Samey Fikhaylovich COLUBE</u>, the K.C.B. officer responsible for the S.K., that COLITSYN, whose job in Finland source described an "Branch 2 or something", had eleshed violently with his Resident in Holsinki. He wrote a mumber of official and private letters to Loncow asking that either he of the Resident be transferred. Headquarters refused to agree this, and when he visited Loscow threatened that if he failed to get on with the Resident he would be in danger of losing his job. This was too such for GOLITSYN, so he defected. Seurce edded that this reason for COLITSYN's defection was convincing, and that he had noter heard any rumour that it was not genuine.

3. Source gave the following information about the measures taken by the K.G.B. as the result of GOLITSYN's defection:

(a) He had been sentenced to death; this was stated in an article in "The Chekist" which appeared some time after 1964. The K.C.B. would try to kill him as soon as they could find him.

(b) Within six weeks of GOLUNEV's arrival in London on 12.6.71. he told course that he had received a telegram from Headquarters ordering him to concentrate on obtaining information about GOLINSW, (to when the K.G.B. had given the abusive nickname (DROD), because according to their information GOLITSYN hed visited England several times, and whil they had now catablished "the place of residence" they had no approach to him. Hoseow required dotailed information about where he was livi his habits and activities. From the wording of this telegram source deduced that GOLITSYN was not resident in England, and that the object of this order was to remind COLUNEV of a standing instruction that the highest priority was to be given to obtaining information about him.

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
