Source thought subj was hard Commie, although he admired the material accomplishments of US. Feels subj is very much a Sov Commie and is not defectable. Very pleasant and jovial with good sense of humor.

Source did not know which directorate he was in - might be technical section - but knew that he was a "fairly high boss." Source could not recall whether he had ever seen Subj so does not know if this is the same person.

1. Source invited to give lectures on math in USSR. Soon after receiving the invitation, he and wife were in bar of Helsinki restaurant, when subj and fnu RASKE, a Finn Commie, came up to his table and introduced themselves. Subj mentioned source's imminent trip to USSR. Subj told source to come to Sov Emb next day to meet the Cultural Attache, who could arrange to get source to USSR and back without cost. Source invited subj and RASKE to his home for dinner following Sunday. Both accepted. SUBJ paid entire bill. When source went Sov Emb next day met Yuriy VORONIN and subj, also SERGEYEV. V. invited himself to dinner with subj at source's home. Subj, VORONIN and wives went to source's for dinner, bearing many presents. RASKE did not come. Subj told source "this RASKE is a swine." Felt that it necessary to use these Finn Commies politically but that they cannot be trusted.

22 [CFHA] 2413 Subj had contact w/Prof [David Hecht] (Fulbright), a Russian speaking research scholar whose interest is 19th century Russia. [Hecht] through Hilliker (Chief, Pol. Sec.), met Jane Nichline who obtained a report for Hqrs. 9 Apr 57 [Hecht] reported that GOLUB was very down on the Amer Emb and America. wanted to know about American life in U.S., etc.

This is a very long report—five pages. For elaboration, see att to dispatch retained in Finland files.

In mid-December, VAINGLORY/12 told [VARIATION] the following which [V/1] passed to [station]. GOLUB had recently complained to Johannes VIROLAINEN that the Finn security police were not paying any attn to cases of British & American espionage in Finl, adding that the Soviets had info regarding Western espionage in Finl and would be glad to furnish it to the security police. GOLUB said some of the western cases were old & some new. Did not elaborate. Source did not say what VIROLAINEN's reply was to GOLUB.

[V/1] then said it would behoove AIS officers in Hels to be as careful as possible cause it quite possible security police would receive orders to keep their eyes sharply peeled for oper involving Finnish citizens. Pendleton briefed all senior ODEARL people. ODUNIT man said he had recd a warning few days earlier from a friendly Finnish officer that another ODUNIT officer had been seen too frequently driving a Volkswagen w/dipl plates around freight yards of Hal. (This was ODUNIT's energetic factory & freight car marking program.) The ODOATH man said his family had noticed Finnish policeman on the beat outside his house had recently begun to go to phone booth & make a call every time the senior ODOATH man left his house and drove towards town. Everyone took warning seriously. [V/1] to tell us any further developments.

On 21 Dec 57, [VARIATION] told Sttton that Subj had visited the Min of the Interior re security police having contacts with Westerners. [V/1] was told that it had no connection with him; Finl a free country & people had right to talk with any one they pleased. Min of Int asked him exactly what he was driving at— Subj was evasive & gave a vague non-sequitur answer which gave no hint as to what proof the Soviets were talking about. Min of Int told GOLUB if Sov govt had any official complaints to make he should make them thru proper channels. When asked if he thought there were any deeper significance to these Sov gambits, [VARIATION/1] replied that he did not expect the Soviets to do anything more than drop these conversational hints. 01

On 21 Jan 58 Subj called [VACCINE] & invited him to lunch. During the lunch Subj, for some reason, wanted to impress on [V/1] that he manages to keep informed of certain things even though [V/1] doesn't help him. For example:

He knows that Oskari VAINONEN and Antti MÄLÄ are in Haaparanta. He has photos of MEKARA's documents & knows that an American interrogate these men in Haaparanta.

An American Captain (G. did not remember name) said, while he was drunk, that the [VACCINE] detective WESTERBERG is his friend and has the job of keeping track of Soviets in Helsinki.

He knew that there was a mtg of Scandinavian Security chiefs in Helsinki in Nov & that THULIN (Sweden) & JENSEN (Denmark) & the Nor chief attended. [V/1] said this was so.)

The American military has 15 persons working for them in Helsinki although only 7 appear in the Corps Diplomatique.

Col. Bjork, the Amer Mil Att, is the man who calls the shots for Amer espionage in Finland.

2. At one point in the talk [V/1] said he took G. to task for having interests not consistent w/a diplomat's job. G. protested that his interests were purely diplomatic and that he had no other than normal consular duties.

On 27 June 58 [V/1] said that Subj had just (date not given) called him and asked him to lunch, but since [V/1] was [V/1] was [V/1] (Stanley [V/1]), he had to postpone the mtg w/Subj. Subj had said on the phone that he was leaving for vacation (presumably in USSR) on the 25th of June. [V/1] was to meet Subj one hour after we left him, that is, at 1500 hrs. We suggested to [V/1] that he ask Subj about the executions in Hungary (and his associates), but [V/1] said that the question is a little bit delicate for him to put to Subj. Although we asked [V/1] how long Subj would be gone, [V/1] said he did not know but would try to find out. In reference to your mild concern re [V/1]'s relationship w/Subj (OFFA 2348, 13 Feb 58), we have occasionally suggested replies and comments designed to harass Subj, but almost without exception [V/1] has turned them down as inappropriate, just as he did on this suggestion re Hungary.

Subject, Soviet Consul who replaced I.M. STOLYEV, joined the Helsinki Consular Corps, which had previously had no Sino-Soviet bloc representative, in the fall of 1947. Since the Consular Corps is not specifically a "western" body, the Corps had no valid reason to refuse his entry. As far as is known, no other Sino-Soviet bloc representatives have followed GOLUB into the Corps.

Costille, KUBARK, attended a Consular Corps luncheon on 10 Dec 58—during luncheon C. was introduced as new Vice-Consul from U.S.—after lunch GOLUB came directly up to Costille, introduced himself and asked C. to join him at his table for coffee and cognac. Subj was extremely friendly and proceeded to ask the usual HRQ-1 type questions, such as Costille's home in States, how long he'd been in Finl, did he have a dipl title, etc. Subj mentioned that his wife was in the Sov Union and that he was living alone in his apt. Subj speaks no English, so Finnish was used.

(His comment: A photo came in w/this dispatch—Costille, GOLUB and 6 others. Photo sent to SR/2/E for filing.)

On 4 May Subj phoned Costille (KUBARK) for lunch that day. Most of the time was spent on polite conversation and no political topics were discussed. Subj asked C. about his home and family in the States and his vacation plans. Subj mentioned that he was not going to be able to take a vacation this summer as he had hoped. When C. asked him why, he gave the reason that the Amb, whom Subj described as still being new and not quite sure of himself yet, had told him he wanted him to remain in Hels as he was the only person of officer rank in the Consular Section. (Comment: Maybe it's cause KHRUSHCHEV is coming to Hels this summer.) Not once during the lunch did the subject mentioned in refs (C's trip to USSR and treatment accorded him) come up. (For any further comments see Finl chronos)

22 [C] 3500 Postille (KIMBARK) said that GOLUB's Finnish is excellent and that G. claims to know no English. However, when G. was having difficulty w/ Finnish, GOLUB was able to put these English words into Finnish.

22 (OPHA) 3900 Subj told Costille (KUBARK) that he had been in Finl now for about four years
12 May 59 and that he had been enjoying himself very much and liked Finl and the Finns. He said that he was glad that he did not speak English as he would then probably be sent to England or the U.S., which in his opinion were too far from his home in the Soviet Union. Accdg to Subj, this made travel home, as well as phone calls, too expensive. When Costille asked him where he would like to be sent next, he answered Moscow. He stated that over three years was too long to be away from one's country.

On 1 Dec Source said that GOLUB had told VALDX/1 that a Western agent, who crossed the Finnish-Soviet border near Imaatra on 13 May 1959 had been arrested and was being held by the Soviets. GOLUB did not reveal the name of the agent, but said that he had been trained in Austria. To the station's knowledge, there have been no REDSOX missions run via Finland by KUBARK since 1953. Does he know of any REDSOX agents who disappeared in May? Or is GOLUB making up the story? (To SR Division for answer)

(VALINK/8) called Roodine (FURARK) at R's home and said that he would like to see him on an urgent matter--met him half an hour later, and he related the following. GOLUB had reported to (VALINK/8) that a western agent had been arrested in the Sov Union near Iqatra, but on the Sov side of the border. G. had said that the agent had been recruited in Switzerland and dispatched across the border on 19 May of 1959. The agent had come to Helsinki on 17 May and had been met by a man described as between 35 and 38 yrs old, about 170 cm. tall; the man smoked a pipe, spoke good English and passable Finnish. This man had driven the agent to the Finnish border in a Dodge auto, bearing license plate BF-158. (VALINK/8) investigated and found that the car was owned by Torreyson's (unilateral of) (FURARK'S) firm and thought therefore that (FURARK) might be involved. He wanted to warn us, so called Roodine. Roodine checked our 3 military attaches' offices w/neg results and then went to (Torreyson) if find out if he had even loaned his car for any such trips or was somehow involved indirectly. Negative answer. Roodine thinks the whole story is provocation, concocted by the Soviets and set afoot thru GOLUB to serve as a counter-balance to recent revelations of Sov espionage in Finl. (See sub Joint Weeks for 11 Dec 59)(sic). Roodine goes on to say that it is interesting that the Communist newspaper Hansen Uutiset carried an editorial on the 10th of Dec accusing the Security Police of not investigating cases of western espionage. *****

On 21 May VALINK/1 was informed by GOLUB that he (G.) had been summoned to Leningrad for a mtg w/a repn of the Soviet Internal Security Police (presumably MVD). While there, GOLUB had been instructed to determine what security precaution the Police of Sweden, Norway and Denmark plan to take to insure the safety of KHRUSHCHEV during his August visit to the Scan countries. During the conversation, G. was very critical of his Soviet colleagues in Stoc, Oslo and Cope, for their failure to develop close relations w/repns of the Security Police of those countries. G. was worried not only about his own inability to develop the info requested, but also for the safety of K. during this trip. G. did not know for sure whther K. would visit Finland on this trip, but believed that if he did, it would occur after the visit to the other 3 countries, and that any visit to Finl would be purely unofficial.
