

[V/I] then said it would behoove AIS officers in Hels to be as careful as possible cause it quite possible security police would receive orders to keep their eyes sharply peeled for oper involving Finnish citizens. Pendleton briefed all senior ODEARL seople. ODUNIT man said he had reed a warning few days earlier from a friendly Finnish officer that another CDUNIT officer had been seen too frequently diffin driving a Volkswagen w/dipl plates around freight yards of Hel. (This was CDUNIT's energetic factory & freight car marking program.) The CDOATH man said his family had noticed Finnish policeman on the beat outside his house had recently begun to go to phone booth & make a call every time the senior CDCATH man left his house and drove towards town. Everyone took warning seriously. V/1 to tell us any further developments.

REPRITER, joined the Helsinka 24 Aur 58 Consular Corps, which had previously has no Sino-Soviet bloc representative, in the fall of 1957. Since the Consular Corps is not specifically a "Western" body, the Corps had no valid reason to refuse him entry. is far as is known, no other Sino-Soviet sloc representatives have followed WILL into the Corps. LOFHA 3694 Tostille, KUBARK, attended a Consular Corps lumbeon on 10 Dec 58-during 30 Den 58 lum-heon c. was introduced as new Vice-fonsul from U.S.-after lum-h GILB came directly up to nostille, introduced himself and asked n. to join him at his table for coffee and cognac. During the conversation, G. was very critical of his Soviet colleagues in Stoc, Osle and Cope, for their failure to develop close relations w/repns of the Security Police of those countries. G. was worried not only about his own inability to develop the inforequested, but also for the safety of K. during this trip. G. did not know for sure whither K. would visit Finland on this trip, but believed that if he did, it would occur after the visit to the other 3 countries, and that any visit to Finla would be purely unofficial.
