1. Transmitted herewith are photostats of two statements, both typed on machines located in the Soviet Embassy in Helsinki. One of the letters is a statement similar to an affidavit of support which is required by the Finnish government from a Finnish resident who invites a relative or friend from the USSR to visit him. In this case Aleksandra Tschervakova is attesting to the fact that she will provide for the complete support of her brother-in-law, (sic) Parashov's, Maksimova Paulova, during a 1 to month visit to Finland. (It is possible that the writer did not know Finnish very well, and referred to a woman as her brother-in-law.) The other statement is signed by the Soviet Consul, G. E. OJUS, and is an acknowledgement that the signature is that of Soviet citizen Tschervakova. The cachets of the Soviet Embassy may be of interest.

2. ^{DI} [VATRIP/1] provided the photostats attached. Tschervakova called at his office with the originals by mistake. They were to have been submitted to the Foreign Ministry. ^{DI} [V/1] asked Tschervakova to have a seat for a moment, and repaired to another room to make photostats. He then returned the originals and directed T. to the proper office. Should any more samples turn up in ^{DI} [V/1]'s office, he will provide us with photostats.
