[02] VAPID/Operations - [VACCINE/1] comments on the VAPID-Torreyesa Case

[02] 1. On the evening of 10 September [VACCINE/1] and his wife were at Brusley's home for dinner. It was supposed to be purely a social evening, and very little business was discussed. However, [VACCINE/1], who has been back from his five-week summer vacation for only one week, could not resist the urge to bring up the VAPID-Torreyesa case. He said that he had read the interrogation report which had been prepared by one of his men and had subsequently talked to COUS on COUS's initiative. COUS had called him and invited him to lunch, and they had met last Thursday. From [VACCINE/1]'s account it appeared that COUS had described the incident at the airport quite factually, but [VACCINE/1] placed very little credence in the accuracy of the account. He said that in view of the fact that the six American athletes were left behind to await visas, he could well understand that Torreyesa had needed VAPID to [02] the point of desperation. He does not believe that anything further will come of the case. Certainly the Ministry of Interior plans to forget about it unless a new protest comes from the Soviet Ambassador.

[02] 2. Incidentally, COUS told [VACCINE/1] that VAPID had behaved stupidly in the whole affair and has been recalled to the Soviet Union. ([VACCINE/1] says he has already departed.) COUS also remarked that VAPID is a married man and expects no sex. Apparently the Soviets, or at least COUS, do not believe VAPID's full story, according to [VACCINE/1]. The reason for this distrustfulness is that when the slapping incident occurred, VAPID had been speaking English to Torreyesa. This report was evidently confirmed by the baggage loader who witnessed the cuffing. COUS thought it strange that VAPID, who speaks Finnish well, should not use that language in speaking to Torreyesa, who also has a fair command of Finnish.
