## MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Further Information from [the British] on the  
Manuel RAY Case

1. [Chris Phillpotts] called me at home at 2215/  
12 June 1964 to relay additional information he had  
just received from the [Governor of the Bahamas] 24 The  
24 [Governor] reports that on 3 June Andrew St. George, the  
LIFE stringer photographer who accompanied RAY, made two  
telephone calls to Miami from Nassau in Spanish. The  
24 [Governor] also said that it was TIME's reporter Reingold,  
mentioned in the TIME article, who next morning (4 June)  
called lawyer Little and told him that he couldn't  
guarantee the fee but that the money was expected through  
American Express. Almost immediately after, an American  
unknown to (portion garbled in the [Governor's] cable) /5e  
may have been an employee of the local American Express  
or Bank 7 produced \$1,000.

2. [Phillpotts] will let us know if any additional  
information becomes available. 24 He opined that the above  
information from the [Governor] indicates that Reingold was  
probably instrumental in hiring a lawyer at St. George's  
request and probably paid for the legal fees involved.  
The \$1,000 is obviously much more than was needed to pay  
the \$14 fine for each person that was levied by the British  
court.
