MEDINA is the only one permitted to photograph documents which leave Cuba clandestinely, i.e., he can photograph the "frequency plan" that an agent will take with him. the one which will be transmitted by radio. He can also photograph the codes and dead-drops that an agent will use. MEDINA has possibly traveled to Mexico to buy photographic equipment and material. MEDINA was born in approximately 1933, he is five feet nine inches in height, and weighs between 135 and 140 pounds.
