The following report is one of a series containing personality information provided by the source and includes supplemental information from the records of this Agency.

It is requested that the addressees take no action on any of the individuals mentioned in the personality reports without first checking with this Agency.

Source identified a photograph of Jose Raul VIERA Linares, pseudonya "Genez," and said that he is the desk officer for Colombia in the Section Sur (South American Section) of the Departamento de Liberación Nacional (The National Liberation Department - LT) in the Direction General de Inteligencia (General Directorate of Intelligence - DGI). VIERA was a DGI officer stationed in Dolivia, but returned to Cuba at the end or 1963. He has not traveled since his return to Cuba. 1,2,3,4,5,6

Readquarters Coscuets

- 1. A usually reliable source, on 24 February 1931, reported that Jose Radi VIRRA Linares, born on 20 April 1940 in Cignfuegos, Cuba, arrived in Madrid from Mexico-Habana on 19 Tebruary 1961, for a position in the Cuban Embassy in Midrid. He carried Cuban Diplomatic passport number 28, issued in Habana on S February 1961. He was residing at the Hotel Rosalla de Castro in Hadrid.
- In a document duted 3 July 1981, it was reported that the Bolivian Foreign Elmistry announced on 23 June 1961, that it had asked the Cuban Foreign Manistry to recall their Cuban

Charle d' Alfaires because he had interferred in Solivian domestie minirs. The Cuban Foreign Kinistry applojized and said they would withdray him. In the same message provisional accreditation was asked for Jose Raul VIERA Limares for the position of Charge d' Affaires in Bolivia. On 24 June 1901, VIERA arrived in La Paz from Santiago, Chile, where he was First Secretary in the Cuban Embassy. It was also stated that VIERA was born to 1900, that his first diplomatic post was Santiago, and that he was a voluntary teacher in Cuba prior to entering the diplomatic service.

- 3. A fairly reliable source, in a report dated 15 Larch 1963, said that he met Raul Jose VIERA Linares, a Cuban diplomat assigned to La Paz, in Santiago about 21 February 1963. VIERA is married to Laria Cecilia Deril DEZ de Viera and they have an infant daughter, Isabel VIERA Bermudez.
- 4. A report dated 20 Larch 1963 gave the following information on Jose haul VIERA Lineres:

VIERA replaced Mauro GARCIA Triana as Interin Charge of the Cuban Embassy in La Paz in late June 1981. He held this position until the arrival of Ramon AJA Castro on 13 March 1962. An untested source said that AJA severely criticized VIERA after his arrival and relegated VIERA to Cultural Affairs officer, a relatively low position. Another untested source said that VIERA has been meeting Cuban couriers at the airport which would seem to indicate that VIERA has not climbed back-up into the hierarchy of the Cuban Embassy.

- 5. A report dated 15 October 1963, stated that Jose Raul VIERA Linares was being expelled from La Paz for attempting to get information from the Bolivian Foreign Office by clandestine means. VIERA was expected to leave La Paz by 15 October 1963.
- 6. An (official) travel manifest revealed that Raul Jose VIERA, his wife, Maria VIERA Cegilla, and his daughter, Isabel VIERA Beatriz, went to Habana from Mexico City on 14 October 1963.
