1. Jaime DURAN Hernando is known personally by source and was identified by source from official travel manifests and also from a photograph as a Dominican and a member of the Movimento Popular Dominicana (MPD) and the Agrupacion Politica Catorce de Junio (APCJ).

2. As a member of the APCJ, DURAN was originally sent to Cuba to secure a scholarship in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR).² However, source judges that upon this scholarship not materializing, DURAN was put into the guerrilla warfare training program instead. Source believes that DURAN was still in Cuba at the time he left.³

3. Unwittingly, DURAN was used by a Direccion General de Inteligencia (General Directorate of Intelligence - DGI) member, whose true name is allegedly Elpidio RUIZ (pseudonym "Tiburon"), to deliver a microfilm message, concealed in a match folder, to source in Habana, with the comment that it came from one of the members of the MPD. The MPD does not know RUIZ is a Cuban intelligence officer. DURAN traveled to Cuba by way of Jamaica and France.²
