- 1. A consitive, reliable source reported that on 16 May 1967 an unidentified man, circa 60 years old, thin, with gray hair and searing glasses, visited the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City from 1300 to 1330 hours. He was driving a 1961 ten Pontice with California license plates JKB-824.
- 2. Investigation revealed that these plotes were easigned to a 1962 Pontiac Coupe owned by Den C. DELAO of 315 Mockinghird Lane, South Passidena, California. The driver's license reflected that DELAO was born 29 April 1908 (ego 59). He is 5 feet 11 inches tall, weighe 175 pounds, has black beir and brown eyes.
- 3. Piles of the Estell Merchants Credit Association of los Angeles were scarched in the name of Ben C. DELAO and revealed a file which possibly might be identical with Subject showing that DELAO and his wife, Estile, have been known to them since March 1952. His age was given as 32 in 1952 (sic), and their most recent address was given as 2209 South Vermont Avenue, Los Angeles, in 1962. Prior residence was at 4211 Union Pacific Avenue, Los Angeles, in March 1952, for 14 years. He is originally from Les Cruces, Hew Merico. In August 1951 the Lockheed Aircraft Company, Burbank, California, was his employer. This was verified in March 1952. Credit was entisfactory; crimical and subversive checks were negative.
 - 4. There was no information on DELAO in the files of this Office.

They were driving a 1967 Ford Mustang with Toxes license plates CIS-46. Their visit leated about five minutes. A set of photos of the three men are provided your Bureau for identification, and this Office would appreciate being informed if any of the sen in the photos is positively identified.

- 2. Purther investigation revealed that these plates were assigned to a 1967 Ford two-door Masteng owned by Antonio ECHEGARAY C., Jr., of 1418 Borth Stemton, Apartment A, El Paso, Texas.
- 3. The only information evailable in the files of this Office are two Baresu reports on Automio ECHESCARAY (sks ECHECARAT, dated 28 and 30 July 1952). Our Subject is probably not identical with your Subject; however, he could be the son who reportedly traveled with SCHEMARAY and his wife in 1952 and was at that time a "young boy."

Unidentified Visitor to Soviet Embassy

1. A sensitive, reliable source has reported that on 9 March 1967 a man who appeared to be an American stopped at the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City to talk with Soviet Consul Valentin Sorgeyevich LOGIMOV. The man did not enter the Soviet Embassy. He was driving what appeared to be a late model Buick Electra with Florida tags # 10-V-7778.

- h. The net-up in the old as well as the new base is the following!
 The equipment cases, some entrined is writted in one bedroom behind venetian blints without and removed. This rise is incled to keep servants or any chance intrinder fine entering. The operators do not spend all their time behind the camera, but so to the adjoining bedress where a table and typewriter are set up and where the daily logs are transcribed, knitting done, or some other activity that does not require full communication is carried out. The curtains and blinds in this room are kept partially or fully open to allow good visibility and provide a normal appearance. Most of the daily soverant of the Soviet personnel is followed from this room and when it is necessary to take pictures of visitors, unknown persons or newly arrived Soviets, the operators go to the other room and use the pre-net equipment.
- 5. GERENDE's Comment. It seems to me that any careful observation by the Soviets would have revealed the tell-tele position of the venetian blinds in both the old and the new twees. I have no doubt that the Soviets realize they are under photo surveillance. The move by the family from the old to the new building must survely have been noted by the Soviets. Possibly the Soviets think the family is working with the local authorities due to LIEMPTY-13's former association with the Mexican Army.
- 6. Station Communication agrees with Observe that careful observation by the Soviets would have revealed the missing elst in the venetian blinds and also the fact that these blinds are salice open. The Station also agrees that the Soviets realize that they are under photo surveillance. This was pointed out recently when a Soviet shielded an INEROO walk-in wheat they passed the front exts of the Sabasay and made a sign to the walk-in indicating that they could be seen by someone watching with a telescope from the buildings arms the atreet. Also, as Realpurters is absure, there have been numerous comments by residents of Maxico City to the effect that anyone entering the Soviet Dabasay is photographed; however, seldem has it been removed that the "Americans" are doing it, which might indicate most people believe the Maxican (kwarmant is doing any such photographing and thereby reaffirming GEGNET'S statement that the Soviets possibly believe the Maxican Guvernment runs the base.
- 7. Given the assumption that the LILYRIC base is blown, the Station at this point does not plan to terminate or revemp the LILYRIC installation. Any operational chance by the operators would be epotted by the Soviete and if the Base were closed the devicts would start looking for a new installation. The LILYRIC base is performing a useful function and it is believed that it will continue to do so. The devicts have had opportunities to complain to the Mexican Government about teins nonitored photographically and have not seen fit to do so and it is believed that they probably will not do so unless there is a radical change in Mexica that they probably will not do so unless there is a radical change in Mexica and/or Mexican policy. - 8. The operator of the LIMITED Base, LIEMINY-6, is, to my knowledge, the oldest band in the photo surveillance of the Soviet target and possibly the most likely to be "burned". His residence for years at the former Base (now the site of the new LILYMIC building) and his move to the precent base could not have gone unnoticed by the Soviets. His cover is that of an insurance salesman, but he actually simm not work at the cover and is at a discoverage in trying to explain his express of income. 2. CTUGES.

A. Operational - As noted in the previous Request for Project Renewal, the former LIMITED property was sold to LECUSINE, who as per formal agreement with the Station, denolished the old structure and constructed a new edifice. While it was initially contemplated to place the LECTED (LECTYS -b and -7) personnel in the new building and to retain the same, equal division of workload between LILYRIC and LECTED, it was later accused to move the present LILYRIC basehouse personnel (LIECTYS-13, -14, -26 and -27) into the new base instead, along with the following ancillary modifications:

An increase in the hours of both the photographic and physical surveillance coverage provided from the new base by the LILYRIC operators (CSOC-1600 hours) during the weekdays and to have the LIMITED base provide photographic and physical surveillance coverage from 1600-1630 hours on weekdays and from C900-1500 hours on weekends. These changes were dictated by the following considerations:

- 1. The new LINCUSINE building offers a much better vantage point for both photographic and physical surveillance than does the present complex which houses the LILYNIC and LIMITED bases. Therefore, the Station felt that the personnel occupying this new base should be those possessing the highest technical skills and also those able to provide the most thorough and complete coverage. Since the LIMITED base now has only one trained operator while the LIMITED basehouse has three, the LIMITED and a revision of working hours was indicated.
- 2. Because it was apparent that the coverage of the LEGRICK installation would be a long-range and continuing requirement, the Station desired to staff the new base with personnel of long-range potential. LEEPTY-5, now almost 60 years old, does not possess this potential; however, the LILYRIC agent complex happily combines experienced personnel with youthful agents.
- 5. Finally, the social and financial status of the LILYAUC personnel is such more compatible and consistent with the environment of the new building than is that of the LEGITED family.

The above-cited revised work schedule was initiated in July 1966 and the actual novement of the LILYRICs into the new base began in late September 1965.

At San Antonio, Texas:

On 9 July 1965, Mrs. V. N. HIBBS, Texas Highway Department, Motor Vehicle Division, Austin, Texas, was telephonically contacted. She checked the records and advised Texas License Tag LU-1796 was assigned in 1964 to a 1963 Ford Convertible Thunderbird owned by Mario PEDRERO, Box 222, Hidalgo, Texas; second address listed as 8462 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. The lien holder of this automobile was Boggus Motor Sales, Box 340, McAllen, Texas.

Mrs. HIBBS stated all 1965 plates issued to private automobiles contain three letters (no vowels) and from two to three numbers.

On 9 July 1965, Mr. J. H. WRIGHT, Credit Bureau in McAllen, which covers Hidalgo, was telephonically contacted. He checked the records in the name of Mario PEDRERO with negative results. Mr. WRIGHT then stated he was introduced to Mario PEDRERO about two years ago at a party in Reynosa, Mexico. Mr. WRIGHT stated he was told that this person is the son of a wealthy family living in Mexico City. During conversations with Mario PEDRERO, Mr. WRIGHT learned that he had just returned from Europe, that he lived in Mexico City and also had a home in California. Mr. WRIGHT described him as being in his early twenties, a little spoiled but a person who appeared to be authentic. At the time of this meeting he had just purchased a fully equipped new Thunderbird from Boggus Motor Sales.

Mr. WRIGHT stated he saw Mario PEDRERO again about six months ago when he came to McAllen to have his car repaired. When he comes to McAllen he usually stays at the Casa de Palmas Hotel. Mr. WRIGHT could furnish no additional information.

On 9 July 1965, Officer KURTMAN, McAllen Police Department, was telephonically contacted. He checked the records of the McAllen Police Department and Hidalgo County Sheriff's Office in the name of Mario PEDRERO with negative results.

At Los Angeles, California:

On 13 July 1965, files of the Retail Merchants Credit Association were checked by Agent Howard M. O. and disclosed no record in the name of Mario PEDRERO.

On 13 July 1965, files of the Police Department and the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office disclosed no record when checked in the name of Mario PEDRERO.

- 1. On 24 January 1956, the LICOL run reported that LIPSTICK/LIPPIC was available. LINCHPIN was immediately contacted with instructions to investigate this possibility. Preliminary investigation through the janitor revealed that there was a front apartment available which was ideally suited for our purposes. LINCHPIN contacted the owner who stated that the apartment was not for rent since his daughter was going to move into it. The owner did offer LINCHPIN his daughter's old apartment which was in the back of the building. LINCHPIN contacted the daughter and found that her apartment was not suited for our purposes, and mentioned to her casually that should she not take the front apartment, he would be interested. She told LINCHPIN that she didn't really want it and would tell her father to rent it to LINCHPIN. Subsequently LINCHPIN again contacted the owner and was told that he could have the front apartment.
- 2. LINCHPIN has executed the contract for one year for LILYRIC at \$56.00 US per month. He plans to move from the present RAPTER base by 5 February 1956 and place his furniture in storage for approximately one week. The furniture will be moved to the storage warehouse by one moving company and taken out of the storage warehouse by another moving company. Although it is realized that this series of moves would not cover the trail of the furniture to an experienced investigator, it will prevent questions by neighbors who see the furniture being moved just one-half block and also prevent comments from the moving men themselves who would move the furniture this one-half block.
- 5. Since the RAPPER base consisted of one bedroom and the LILYRIC base contains three bedrooms, and is generally larger in all respects, it will be necessary to purchase additional furniture to make LINCHPIN's occupancy normal in all appearances. It is estimated that the requisite amount of furniture needed for this purpose will not apprecate in excess of \$500 US. Further, since this apartment is rather large for one single man, LINCHPIN's brother is being cleared,

المراجعة ا المراجعة ال and, after clearance, will move in the apartment with LINCHPIN to serve as relief operator and lend cover to the base.

- 4. It is planned that LILYRIC will be kept co-plotely consertmented from LIMIES and other LIPITICK operations. LIPITICK 30 will act as cut-out between the Station and LIKEPIE, and has been instructed that he is not to mantion this duty to anyone. Since LIPITICK 20 does not know of the existence of LIMITED, the LILYRIC operation is co-plotely compartmented.
- 5. The LILYRIC base will be principally used for photographic surveillance of the LIMIRICK target, working alternately but without any pattern, with the LIMIRID base. This working schedule will be worked out by the Case Officer in advance and given to both bases. Since complete compartmentation is desired, the films will be processed in the Station instead of being sent to James O. AICALL who does the processing for LIMITED. Later, the processing may be done by LINCHPIN in his chemical laboratory in order to take this load off the Station personnal involved. LINCHPIN has a fairly well equipped chemical laboratory that, with a few modifications, could be used for the processing of the films and prints. At present LINCHPIN has a partner in this laboratory and it is planned that the partner will be cleared.
- 6. This Station sincerely feels that by the alternative use of this base with LIMITED that many of the outward signs of photographic surveillance (possibly only apparent to the Case Officer knowing they were there and locking for them) will be reduced. The acquisition of this base, in a sense, provides the best possible cover for the LIMITED base by decreasing the use of that base.
