## Ex-Castro Aide Released by U.S.

Former Castro rebel leader Eloy Gutierrez Menoyo arrived in Miami Sunday with 11 fellow Cuban exiles after almost five months detention in an Immigration Service camp at McAlien, Tex.

Greeted by his wife and a wildly cheering throng of fellow anti-Castro refugees, Mesow anti-Castro rerugees, Me-noyo said he and others had been freed "on parole" by the US. government and probably would be permitted to live lere as political exiles. Menoyo, leader of the Sec-cord Front of the Freenhau

and Front of the Escambray in Las Villas Province, was credited with making the big push at Santa Clara in December 1958 which permitted Castro's forces to overthrow President Fulgencio Batista on the following New Year's Day.

A major with Castro's postrevolution army, Menoyo fled the country last Jan. 26. and with 19 companions, crossed to key West in a smali power boat.
