FLIGHT OF AXIS PERSONNEL TO ARGINTINA

An article which was published in the newspaper, "El Pueblo Argentino", Monteviaco, Uruguay, on September 25, 1944, elleged that numerous Nazi officials were presently hiding in Argentina under assumed identities. Among the individuals listed as Nazi officials were Colonel Walter Ostarkamo, Major General Hans Steuderann, one Dr. Frick, Karlheinz Von Dufais and Gottfried Sandstede.

One of the allegations in this article was to the effect that Major General dans Steudemann was stopping at the "Hotel Adam", Calle Maiyu 1268, Buenos Aires. He was said to be using false Argentine documents in the name of Pedro Cassmann. Investigation at the "notel Adam" has failed to uncover any record of any individual named Hans Steudemann or Pedro Cassmann. No record of the issuance of documents in the name of Pedro Cassmann has been located.

One Dr. Frick, an engineer, director of the steel works at Bochum, Germany, was alleged to be living at the "German Riding Club", Calle Ecneverria, Belgrano, Buenos Aires, and was said to visit the German Embassy. It was also claimed that he was the bearer of a -ichtenstein passport in the name of Eduard Reden. Investigation at the "German Riding Club" indicates that Dr. Frick does not reside there at the present time. The German Empassy in Buenos Aires has been closed since the severance of relations between the Argentine and German governments in January 1944 and the Embassy is guarded twenty-four hours per day by the Buenos Aires Police Department. No record of the passport or other documents in the name of Eduard Reden has been encountered.

Inquiries in German circles in Buenos Lires have developed no information regarding any of the individuals alleged by this article to be seeking refuge in Argentina.

Information as to the original source of this article has not been developed. It is believed that the story was originated by the Communist Party in Argentina. It was reprinted in five clandestine Communist Party newspapers in Uruguay and Argentina.

Gottfried Sandstede was born in Oldenburg, Germany, on January 25, 1902. He was the son of Georg Sandstede and was married to Frieda Brandes.

Sandstede was the subject of numerous reports emanating from South America in 1939, 1940, and 1941, due to the fact that he was very active in German projectance work. He was also a German espionage agent.

Wilhelm you SciClitz, a confessed German agent who is presently in the custody of Argentine authorities, advised that he met Sandstede in Berlin, Germany during the last part of 1936. Sandstede had apparently lived in Argentina prior to this time. Von Seidlitz traveled from Berlin to Buenos Aires, Argentina, with Sandstede arriving in Buenos Aires December 15, 1936. At this time, both Von Seidlitz and Sandstede were employees of the German Railways, and Sandstede was head of this agency in Argentina. They were associated together in the offices of the "Central European Travel Agency" which was a subsidiary of the German Hailways at Calle Florida 439, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

In 1939 Sandstode was called to Germany, apparently by the German Government. Von Seidlitz stated that he returned to Argentina on August 25, or August 26, 1939, with the title of Press and Propagunda Attache of the German Embassy, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

With the outbreak of war between Great Eritein and Germany in September, 1939, Von Seidlitz determined to return to Europe. On this occasion he requested Sandstede to assist him in obtaining passage, but Sandstede advised him that it was his duty to remain in Argentina, since he could be of more value to Germany in that country by functioning as an espionage agent than by enrolling in the German Army. Sandstede advised him that he, Sandstede, had already been functioning as a German agent for some time. He was active in obtaining shipping information from Argentine harbors for forwarding to Germany through the German diplomatic power and by means of the Lati Airline.

Von Seidlitz agreed to assist Sandstede in obtaining this type of information, and thereafter he turned over a number of reports to the subject.

Another individual who was reported to have worked as a German agent with Sandstede was Heinz Lange, a known German agent who is presently believed to be in hiding in Argentina. Lange was cooperating with Sandstede in this regard as early as May, 1940.

One Hahn, an employee of the D.N.B. (German News Agency) Buenos Aires, was reported to have worked under Sandstede in obtaining general intelligence information in Argentina in the last part of 1940. The

extent of Halin's activities in this regard has not been clearly defined.

In order to contect agents working with him, Sandstedo retained an office at the "Central European Travel Agency" and he received a salary of \$3,250.00 monthly there in addition to his salary as an Attache of the German Embassy. There is some indication that the payments made to Sandstede at the office of the "Central European Travel Agency" were payments for distribution to propagance and espionage agents.

In addition to his activities as an espionage agent, the subject was active in directing German propaganda in Colombia, Peru, Brazil, and Argentina. During the last part of 1940, Sandstede also maintained contact with Italian diplomatic officials in Argentina for propaganda purposes.

In August, 1940, Sandstede held a meeting in Buenos Aires, Argentina, with dans Henning von Kossel, a German diplomatic official from Rio de Jdneiro, concerning the heasures to be adopted by the German Government in case the United States entered the war. It was agreed at that time that a press campaign would be undertaken in Brazil regarding the bad treatment accorded to Regroes by the United States through the "Transocean News Agency" and local Brazilian agencies. It was believed that this line of propagends would appeal to numerous Brazilians with colored blood. These plans were accepted in Brazil and arrengements were made to carry out the same type of propagenda in Peru, Rexico, Bolivia and other countries with a large Indian population.

In addition, Sandstede agreed to reinforce the German and Italian influence in the Longshorement Union in Argentique.

On April 4, 1941, a number of prominent Nazis in Argentina are reported to have held a meeting at the German Athletic Club, Calle Cuba, 2410, Buenos Airos, Argentina. Sandatede and Reigion Vollberg, who was need of the Nazi Party in Argentina, made specches.

On April 23, 1941, prominent Mazis from all parts of Colombia neld a meeting in the upper floors of the "Almacen nelda", Manizales, Colombia. Sandstede was in charge of this meeting and is reported to have arrived in Colombia, using an assumed have and talse passport. The subjects under discussion at this meeting are not known.

During the middle of 1941 a report was received to the effect that one Werner Loewer, Calle Pampa 3799, Buenos Aires, Argentina, was a German agent working under Sandstede. Loewer was described as a chamist for the German firm "Thyssen Lametal Company", Calle Paseo Colon 532, Buenos Aires, Agentina. The nature of the duties performed by this individual is not known.

Membership lists of the Fascist organization "Afirmacion Argentina", Buenos Aires, reflect that Sandstede was one of the leaders in that organization.

On August 19, 1941, the special committee of the Chamber of Deputies of Argentine ordered the subject to eppear before that body for questioning concerning his activities. Sendstede claimed that he had extra territorial rights as a result of his position as Press and Propagenda Attache of the German Embassy, and he refused to appear. The investigating committee then took the view that inasmuch as he was still head of the "Central European Travel Agency," that he must appear, and a warrant was issued for his arrest.

On August 26, 1941, Sendstede departed from Argentine by Condor plane for Brazil, apparently in order to avoid questioning. On September 4, 1941, he left Brazil for Europe by Lati plane.

Prior to his departure from Argentine, Sandstede instructed Wilhelm.
You Seidlitz to take Charge of the saip reporting service which he
had been operating. You Seidlitz agreed to do so, and Sandstede
paid him 12,000 Argentine pasos (\$3,000.00) as an advance for expenditures.

Sandstede also furnished Von Seidlitz the following mail drop to be used for espionage communications: Jannick Ortner, Wilnelmstrasse 102, Berlin, Gernany,

Information recently developed in Argentina is to the effect that during September, 1942, Sanastede was traveling for the German Government in Spain and Portugal. The nature of the work being performed by him tagge was not disclosed.

During August, 1943, one Rudolfo Admeso was arrested by Argentine authorities while operating an unauthorized radio transmitter in the vicinity of Euchos Aires. Amadeo is reported to have been an associate of Sandstede when the subject was in Argentine. Apparently, this station was simply an unauthorized amateur station and not a clandestine radio transmitter.

According to accounts published in the German language newspaper "Doutsche La Plata Zeitung", Buehos Aires, on May 11, and May 12, 1944, Sandstede was killed while serving in an armored granadien regiment in the German Army on the Eastern Front. The exact date of his death was not disclosed.

It has been suggested by various sources that the report of Sandstede's death might possibly be part of a scheme to enable him to return to Argentina under an assumed name. No information is available to show that Sandstede is not in fact dead.



Carfias is a member of the following associations:

The Bureau advises they are still checking for information on Valentin R. Carlias.

Concerning Emilio Cervi and his son of Mexico City, the following is a report from the FBI on these individuals:

"The Eureau has a record of an Emilio 3. Cervi who was head of the Uinarquista movement in Mexico, and was responsible for publication of a Sinarquista pamphlet. Cervi was born in Tuxpaur, Versoruz, Mexico and now resides at Orziaba El, Mexico City. Cervi is a lawyer, 57 years old, and resided in the U.S. from 1925 to 1929.

"The files of the Bureau reveal that Enillo Cervi (Cercia); father of Foilio S. Servi above, is approximately 77 years old. He has been seen attending a meeting of the "Casa de Espana", a society whose members are known to be pro-Franco. This society propagandized for the Spanish Falance and disbanded shortly after the U.S. ontered the War."

ACCION RUYCLUCIONARIA VEXICANISTA (CAMISA DORADAS)

This Party has been known by the following names other than the above: Ios Dorados, Gold Shirts and Brown Shirts. This organization was first founded in 1931-1935, and was headed by General Micolas Redriguez. As the old Gold Shirt organization, it was a strengly nationalistic group and was involved in the Gedillo revolt. This Party often clashed with organized labor and in the year 1935 there were two armed assaults at the offices of the Communist Party. Mount ten persons died as a result of this conflict. The following year, about the middle of 1936, President Cardenas ordered this Party to be dissolved and from thereon, when it did function, it did so as an illegal secret party. Colonel Aniceto Lopes is now associated with the organization. It has been used as a vehicle of anti-Semitic propagands and is said to have Fascist sympathies.

VANGUARDIA MACIONALISTA

This organization advocates neutrality for Mexico. This thesis, however, is not genuine, as it has been advanced as purely German propaganda. The organizer of the Party is Adolf Leon Ossorio who was on the pay roll of the German Legation as a propaganda agent. It also has an apparent anti-Jewish policy and seaks to prejudice the Mexicans against the influence of the United States. It is in close contact with the Partido de Accion Macional, representing it as a shock or action force. Eitler has been openly praised by officials of the Vanguardia Macionalista for his so-called great accomplishments in Europe.

FARTIDO DE ACCION NACIONAL

<u>Fanuel Gomez Morin</u> is President of this Party. This Party is composed chiefly of the professional and business elements of lexico and is said to often furnish the intellectual leadership for the Sinarquista group. It has been known in the past to be allegedly anti-Lxis, anti-Communist, and opposed to American influence in Boxican affairs. However, it has also been known to manifest certain sympathies in the direction of Pascism. The organization gives considerable study to rural developments, social problems, and general questions of economic and political policies affecting the Mexican nation.

From the information furnished, it has not been possible to establish the identity of the following organisations:

Movimiento Unificador Macionalista

MARIA ALFARO:

A Maria Alfaro (De Mata) is listed as a Communist and holds the position of Assistant Secretary of the Communist Revolutionary Union. This person is also a director of the Esc ela Atlantici.

CARMEN CALEROS

The above person is associated with the Partido Anti-Resisctionista Accion. This individual is an elderly woman physician and has been active in different Fascist groups.

ANTONIO F. ESCOBAR.

The above Antonio F. Escobar was a member of the "Los Dorados" organization in Mexico City. He is reputed to have been one of the organizers of "Los Dorados" and indications are that his sentiments are pro-Fascist. He also is associated with the "Union Nacionalist Lexicans."

This person is said to have been the leader of the Mexican Fascist Party which he started to organize in November 1942 in Jalopa, Veracrus, Mexico. At one time this organization was reported to have had four hundred twenty branches. In professional life this individual was an engineer.

/DIEGO ARFITAS GUZMAN :

The above person is reportedly associated with the Mexico City periodical, "El Eucoo Dia;" also "El Hombre Libre," a Cerman subsidized newspaper. The magazine, "El Ruevo Dia," is a propaganda instrument of the Hasis in Mexico, and its publication was suspended.

GENERAL HICOLAS RODRIGUEZ:

This porson was one of the founders of the old "Los Dorados" organization (also known as the "Gold Shirts") which was subsequently outlawed by the Exican Covernment and never legally reinstated. Its off-spring was the "Accion Revolucionaria Rexicanista." The General was very anti-Jewish and his organization was used to dissimulate anti-Semitic literature. The General was also involved in the Cedillo Revolution and is reported to come directly under German influence. General Rodrigues died in 1940. Dr. A. D. Cook of laredo, Texas, is said to have been associated with General Bicolas Rodrigues.

PRANCISCO CAYON Y COS.

Francisco Cayon y Cos is reported to be a close friend of Ibanes Serrano, a high ranking confident of General Franco of Spain and a member of the Falange of the "Liga do Hispanidad Ibero Americana." This organisation is to be found in all Central American countries. It is pur orted to be a civic and cultural organisation for the purpose of defending Mexican Hispanic culture and the promotion of the union of Spanish-American people. This organisation is financially

supported by Danes Serrano and comes under the influence of Falancist ideology. This person is likewise a Chief by the Propaganda Service of the Spanish Falance.

GABINO VIZCARRA CAMPOS:

This person may be identical with a Cabino Vizoarro who is an associate of German agents and a responsible official in General Almazan's campaign organization.

DEG. H. CARRASCO:

This person may be identical with Ecocrato Carrasco who was in charge of financing and paying of all propaganda operations for the Mazi-Communist espicange setup in Ecoco during 1941 prior to the German-Russian Nor.

LECK OSSORIGE

This person is reported to have been an organizer of Mexican-Nasi activities and a leader of the Zerican-Pascist Party which was dissolved by the Cardenas Government. A Leon Osserio, Niagra S, Mexico City, may be identical with Adolfo Leon Osserd at the same address.

ROBERTO CARRIEDO:

A Roberto Carriedo Rosales living at Balma Morte 402, Merico City, is reported to be sympathetic with the "Accion Estional."

GENERAL STIALIO CUTIVATEZ:

A person bearing the name of Eulalio Gutlerres was formerly president of the Grand Liberal Party in Maxico. It is reported that General Gutlerres was associated with General Antonio S. Villareal in a contemplated revolutionary movement. General Gutlerres was once the Provisional President of Maxico, and instigated revolutionary activity at Durange on March 16, 1929.

MANUEL GOTTE MORIE

This person is the leader of the "Accion Bational" organization which is regarded as one of the most important oppositionist groups in Exico. It was founded in 1933 as a non-political organization, and its object was to lay the basis for a "new spiritual rebirth of citizenship." It claims a membership of forty thousand. Its main strength is to be found among the professional and business men of Mexico. Morin is reported to be a political advisor of Ibanes. Serreno and was at one time a member of the "Council of the Hispanidad Movement."

Sufficient information was lacking to establish a record on the following individuals: Juan B. Marzal, Orlando Herrora Moguel, Enrique Garcia. This Branch is engaged in a survey of the above subject, including secret inks. Obviously, the first thing we want is a survey of the present state of the art. We have canvassed every interested agency except the PBI.

We have, on 22 February 1944, shown our devices and sabotage weapons to Mossrs. Coffey, Flanagan and Parsons of the FBI. These gentlemen suggested that an official request from you for entree to their laboratory on the above subject of secret inks, etc., would be well received.

The study of this subject is in the hands of one man only. He is a chemist and ink expert of international repute and for security reasons works entirely in a secret laboratory in Rochetter, N.Y.

It is suggested that opening this subject to our appointes will not be entirely a gift on the part of the Bureau to is, but that highly interesting information will thereby be made available to the FBI laboratory.

Unfortunately, speed is very necessary to prevent duplication of effort, and I would appreciate a high priority action on the above request.

- 1. There is hereby established in the Central Information Division of the Research and Analysis Branch of the Office of Strategic Services a section to be known as Biographical Records.
- 2. Biographical Records shall be responsible for the systematic collection and recording of information about foreign persons abroad and in this country who may be of interest for purposes of psychological warfare and military occupation, and generally for the properation of such lossiers on persons as may be required by the various operations of CSS.
- 8. Biographical Records shall make the fullest possible use of axisting facilities of OSS in the collection and evaluation of the material.
- 4. All name information now available in or hereafter.... acquired by the zeveral branches of OSS shall be systematically made available to the new section. The procedure to be followed with respect to SI material is set forth in Appendix "A" attached.
- 6. The personnel and files of the Geographic Index of Persons in 31 are hereby transferred to the new section.
- 6. The personnel and budgetary requirements for the section are hereby approved as submitted.

Appendix "A"

Relationship of SI Material to Biographical Records

The following procedure shall be followed in handling biographical data derived from SI sources:

1. SI material (other than operational and strictly CE records and material) is to be made available to M. Unless authorized to include such data, MR will omit any reference to subversive or undercover activities of individuals, except where an individual is a notorious agent, or otherwise is so conducting his activities that secrecyrespecting them is useless or unnecessary.

- 2. Where an individual is of interest to BR, and is also engaged in undercover activities, BR may record straight biographical data and may also indicate:
- (a) the subject's political views e.g., "Pro-Ally" "Pro-Axis;"
- (b) his trustworthiness e.g., "can be trusted" "cannot be trusted;" and
- (c) his willingness or unwillingness to cooperate, or similar phrases, provided the comments are of a type in general use in the records and are not calculated to suggest undercover activities.
- 8. In cases where material regarding subversives is made available from S1, an appropriate punch should be made in IB4 cards to indicate the individuals in under observation by SI.
- 4. ER shall be free to record any data on subversive activities received from sources other than SI, and shall arrange to make such data available to SI.
- 5. In certain cases where evidence of the subversive activities of individuals would be embarrassing to CE operations, the evidence should be suppressed upon the request of CE.
