SUBJECT : Termination of Project LIHUFF

- 1. It is requested that the LIHUFF Project be terminated, effective 30 June 1970.
- 2. Project LIHUFF covered funds for one agent, LIHUFF-1, a U.S. businessman resident in Mexico City who had served in World War II with U.S. military intelligence (MIS/X). LIHUFF-1 provided the Mexico City Station with access into the right-wing political groups and the American Chamber of Commerce in Mexico. He also obtained Dunn and Bradstreet reports for the Station and performed other tasks from time to time.
- 3. LIHUFF-1 was actually terminated effective 28 February 1970. No funds were expended for the termination, as he was not given a termination payment. He was paid his salary of \$300 per month, plus social security contributions, up until the time he was terminated. During FY 1970 \$2,528.41 of LIHUFF Project funds were expended.
- 4. There were no known problems or security risks in connection with the termination. A quitclaim was not obtained. LIHUFF-1 was advised concerning his social security benefits derived from his CIA employment and told to contact the Station should he have further questions.

SUBJECT : Renewal of Project LIHUFF

1. Renewal of Project LIHUFF in the amount of \$4,000 is requested for the period 1 July 1969 through 30 June 1970. The Project was budgeted for \$4,000 for FY 1970 and funds are available within WH Division.

- 2. LIHUFF represents Mexico City Station's access into right wing political elements and organizations in Mexico, and provides contact with the large and influential American business community there. In addition, his access to Dun and Bradstreet reports has also been useful in carrying out checks on WOLADY citizens of operational interest to the Station. During the project year three field information reports were credited to the Project, one of which was disseminated by Headquarters, and some thirty-five background investigations and file traces were conducted by the agent.
- 3. In paragraph D "Effectiveness" of the attached renewal request it was noted, "He (LIHUFF-1) also organized at the request of COS (who, in turn, had been requested by Headquarters) a public demonstration in front of the Soviet Embassy in protest against the invasion of Czechoslovakia." A review of the LITEMPO Project reveals that LITEMPO-4 was paid \$4,000.00 by the Station to organize and rally as many students as possible in addition to the MURO planned demonstration in front of the Soviet Embassy, and to Headquarter's knowledge LIHUFF-1 did not organize the student demonstration on behalf of the Station.
- 4. The Desk feels that this Project should be reviewed during the upcoming project year to determine whether it should be continued.

: Renewal of Project LIHUFF SUBJECT

- 1. Project LIHUFF covers a singleton agent (a U.S. citizen) who has been managed directly by the COS, Mexico City, and who has worked for WHD for more than twenty years, beginning in Panama and continuing in Mexico. LIHUFF-1 provides the Station access to right-wing political elements and contact with the American business community in Mexico City (he is executive director of the American businessman's association).
- 2. The project provided three disseminations in Fiscal Year 1969, and it is deemed unlikely that it will ever be a source of effective and meaningful intelligence.
- 3. WH/FI suggests that LIHUFF-1 be considered for one or several specific support tasks, which represent a continuing burden for Station Mexico City, and that he no longer be considered as a source of intelligence.
- 4. If it is ascertained that he can perform/support task(s), we advise that the project be terminated. In the meantime, we recommend approval in the amount of \$4,000 for Fiscal Year 1970.

REQUEST FOR RENEWAL PROJECT LIHUFF

A. CURRENT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this project is to provide support for a singleton contract agent, LIHUFF-1, who is the Executive Director of the most important organization of WOLADY businessmen in Mexico. He also continues to have access to right-wing political elements and organizations in Mexico, one of which is a right-wing student group (principally at the Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico, UNAM).

B. CHANGES

1. Operational Mechanism

There have been no changes in this respect since the previous project renewal was submitted.

2. Agents

The only agent to be supported by this project for the coming year is LIHUFF-1.

C. INTELLIGENCE PRODUCTION

- 1. Three disseminated reports were credited to this project during FY 1969:
 - HMM-11890 "University Rector's Conviction that U. S. Promoted Student Riots."
 - HMM-12003 "Views of Minister of Industry and Commerce on Forthcoming Visit of Nelson Rockefeller."

2. This agent is used as a source for background, operational and investigative data. For that reason it does not produce a sufficient amount of positive intelligence to justify its existence for that purpose. Its real value is the availability of this agent and his contacts to the Chief of Station, Mexico, for a current reading on right-wing political activities and personalities. He is also a primary investigative source for information on WOLADY citizens of operational interest to the Station. This agent has access to all reports produced by Dunn & Bradstreet in Mexico and can have investigations conducted by them.

D. EFFECTIVENESS

During the project year, the agent provided the Station with details on a proposed new federal labor law (which was subsequently passed) and an analysis on how this new law would affect foreign investors or companies. The agent also kept the Chief of Station, Mexico, advised of right-wing political activities and student agitation. He also organized at the request of COS (who, in turn, had been requested by Headquarters) a public demonstration in front of the Soviet Embassy in protest against the invasion of Czechoslovakia. LIHUFF-1 conducted about thirty-five background investigations and file traces for the Station.

E. PROBLEMS

This project has presented the Station with no problems of security or cover.

F. LIAISON

This project involves no liaison relationship.

G. INTERAGENCY COORDINATION

This project involves no interagency coordination.

- 1. Renewal of Project LIHUFF in the amount of \$4,000 is requested for the period 1 July 1968 through 30 June 1969. The project was budgeted for \$4,200 for FY 1969 and funds are available within WH Division.
- 2. During the past year, one progress report was received, in June 1968, recapitulating the activities reported in the attached renewal request. Although the Station has made use of LIHUFF's relations with the right wing student organization, MURO, in connection with Evgeniy YEVTUSHENKO's visit to Mexico this spring, the use of MURO is being de-emphasized. The main value of LIHUFF/1, a long time collaborator previously serving in Panama and beginning in OSS days, is his availability to service various requests which the COS may make of him and to provide insight into the activities of the extreme right wing of Mexican politics. His access to Dun and Bradstreet reports has also been useful.

PROJECT LIHUFF

A. CURRENT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this project is to provide support for a singleton contract agent, LIHUFF-1, who is the Executive Director of the most important organization of WOLADY businessmen in Mexico. He also continues to have access to right-wing political elements and organizations in Mexico, one of which is a right-wing student group (principally at the Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico - UNAM).

B. CHANGES

1) Operational Mechanism

There have been no changes in this respect since the previous project renewal was submitted.

2) Agents

The only agent to be supported by this project for the coming year is LIHUFF-1.

C. INTELLIGENCE PRODUCTION

This agent is used as a source for background, operational and investigative data. For that reason it does not produce a sufficient amount of positive intelligence to justify its existence for that purpose. It's real value is the availability of this agent and his contacts to the Chief of Station, Mexico, for a current reading on right-wing political activities and personalities. He is also a primary investigative source for information on WOIADY citizens of operational interest to the Station. This agent has access to all reports produced by Dunn & Bradstreet in Mexico and can have investigations conducted by them. For example, some forty Dunn & Bradstreet reports have been obtained (via LIHUFF/1) on persons and/or organizations of interest.

D. EFFECTIVENESS

During the project year, the agent provided the Station with

details of Mexican Government plans to impose legislative restrictions on foreign investments and Government advice to banks to limit loans to companies with an appreciable amount of foreign capital.

This agent kept the Chief of Station, Mexico, advised of right-wing political activities and student participation in anti-LNHARP demonstrations which occurred at least once each month during the past year.

LIHUFF-1 conducted some twenty background investigations and file traces for the Station, in addition to those cited in C above.

In March LINLUCK prevailed upon a Mexican book publisher to print copies of the LINLUCK open letter to Yevtushenko as well as the text of the telegram by Soviet intellectuals to the Consultative Conference of Communist Parties in Budapest asking for an end to Soviet persecution of intellectuals. The latter handbill was illustrated with LINLUCK pen and ink drawings of Sinyavsky and Daniel behind barbed wire. At the same time the Station produced several thousand cartoon and text handbills of a beatnik Yevtushenko dancing into Mexico tossing flowers. Turning a fold of the handbill revealed a Russian officer striking off the nib of a Soviet writer's pen with his sword. In a wet run in January LITEAR: 1 directed four small boys in the distribution of the cartoon handbill in the artists' district of Mexico where Station monitors watched students and artists read and pocket the cartoon handbill. The cartoon handbill was again distributed in the artists' district' on the day of Yevtushenko's arrival. The following day, when Yevtushenko held his first recital at Mexico City's Chapultepec Park, one of the handbills was distributed by LICOAX students. while members of the "MURO" rightist student organization under direction of LIHUFF quietly distributed the other two handbills. Station officers verified that everyone in the audience held copies of the black WOFIRM material.

E. PROBLEMS

This project has presented the Station with no problems of security or cover.

F. LIAISON

This project involves no liaison relationship.

G. INTER-AGENCY COORDINATION

This project involves no inter-agency coordination.

H. PLANS

Station Mexico plans to continue to use LIHUFF-1 as a support agent and informant on activities of right-wing political minority groups and for investigative and background information on persons of operational interest.

I. FUNDS

- 1. The cost of the LIHUFF Project (paid by the Mexico Station exclusive of Headquarters costs) from 1 July 1967 through 31 May 1968 was approximately US \$200.00 which does not include the agent's salary of US \$3,300 (\$300 per month) advanced locally and T/Aed to Headquarters.



CA Aspects: Project LIMUFF (F1)

- 1. We note that, despite the cut-off (at Perdquerters insistence) of CIA funds to LIHUFF action groups in 1865, and although little manay is currently passed to LIHUFF-1 for ope and support purposes (\$120 in FY 1967, \$600 projected for FY 1968), the Station is continuing to use LIHUFF-1 for ad hoc political action. This involves mainly Station requests and guidance for specific operations, principally narresment accions conducted by MURO, the militant arch-rightist and Communist student group at the Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Maxico (UNAM).
- 2. CA/PEC questions whether the use and encouragement of MURO for these purposes is consistent with OD objectives or USC interests in Mexico, even though most of the MURO actions supported by us are directed at non-UNAM targets. Any encouragement or support to MURO, for whatever reasons, will have the inevitable by-product of mentaining and building up the prestige and influence of MURC on the UNAM campus--s result antithetical to the objectives of other Station and Embassy efforts in the student field in Maxico Is, g., Project LICOAX).
- 3. We appreciate the need for a Station militant action team for appecific baracement purposes as the need arises. We believe, however, that the long-range negative effect of perpetuating MURO curveiths the tectical short-range benefits to be derived from MURO barasement accions at our matigation. We cannot therefore endones this CA aspect of the LIHUFF project as presented.

1. It is requested that Project LIHUFF be renewed in the amount of \$4,200.00 for the period 1 July 1967 through 30 June 1968. Funds are available in WH Division. Project costs are estimated to be the same as last year.

2. LIHUFF represents Mexico City Station's access into right wing circles, and also provides contact and rapport with the large and influential American business community there. It will be observed from the attached renewal request that a considerable portion of the project's accomplishment was along political action lines, but it has nevertheless been decided to maintain LIHUFF as an FI activity, since the addition of the investigative function to LIHUFF-1's mission balances the project more heavily on the FI side. There has been no progress reporting since 16 November 1966, at which time the station recounted the harrassing of a Czech official, the Soviet Embassy and the Chinese art exhibit. Since the principal agent is personally handled by a busy chief of station, however, and since the course of the operation changes little from month to month, the infrequent reporting is explainable.

PROJECT LINUER

A. CURRENT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this project is to provide support for a singleton contract agent, LIMUFF-1 who is the Executive Director of the most important organization of American businessmen in Mexico. He also continues to have access to right-wing political elements and organizations in Mexico: and through these contacts, has access to a right-wing student group (principally at the Universidad Macional Autonoma de Mexico - UNAM).

B. CHANGES

1) Operational Mechanism

The LHRUFF Project was approved 18 June 1966 for the period 1 July 1966 through 30 June 1967. LHRUFF-1, the contract agent involved, has been a contact of the Mexico Station since 1950. Before that time he was a contract agent for Station Panama when he was in tudiness in that area. In November 1962 the relationship was formalized into contract status with LHRUFF-1 acting as a funding channel to an anti-Communist research group and rightist student group headed by LIHUFF-2, as well as handling LICHANT-1 and reporting on right-wing activities from other conservative business sources. Subsidies to action groups were discontinued via LHRUFF-1 during 1965. During 1966 LIHUFF-1 has been used as a support asset doing credit and other type investigations with his overt position as cover. Duri and Bradstreet listings and investigations are examples of the kind of checks LIHUFF-1 provides.

2) Agents

The only agent to be supported by this project for the coming year is LIHUFF-1.

C. INTELLIGENCE PRODUCTION

This agent is used as a source for background, operational and investigative data. For that reason, the Mexico Station makes no effort to justify this project on the basis of positive intelligence disseminations or the number of dispatches or cables produced by it. LIHUFF-1 meets regularly with and is handled directly by Willard C. CURTIS, Chief of Station, Mexico. The agent is used to obtain information on activities of right-wing political groups in Mexico. Much of this is marginal in comparison with activities of other

political groups, nevertheless, the Ambassador depends upon Station Mexico for information on all political groups. LIHUFF-1 is the only Station asset who circulates freely in these circles. During the past year, LIHUFF-1 has conducted through his organization, investigations and checks on firms and individuals connected with them. This type of operational data is not available from any other sources. LIHUFF-1 has access to all reports produced by Durp & Bradstreet in Mexico; and can have investigations initiated by them and others.

D. EFFECTIVENESS

Some examples of the effectiveness of this project are:

- 1) During the past year, LTHUFF-1 provided guidance to a right-wing action group which launched a press attack against the Commercial officer of the Czech Embassy (Subject of 201-204656) which resulted in his PCS transfer from Mexico.
- 2) In late Augus: 1966 LINUFF-1 arranged for a right-wing action group to conduct a harrassment of a Chinese Communist Art Exhibit at the UNAM which resulted in the closing of the exhibit. This action was taken as a result of a personal request of the Chief LNPURE. Results were reported to Headquarters.
- 3) In October 1966 LIHUFF-1 arranged for a student action group to conduct a demonstration in front of the Soviet Embassy on the 10th anniversary of the crushing of the Hungarian rebellion. This resulted in considerable press comment against the Soviets with photographic coverage of a casket and anti-Soviet banners on the sidewalk in front of the Soviet Embassy.
- 4) Some investigations conducted by LIHUFF-1 through his firm were:

 - d) Barnices Aislantes, S. A. Lic. Alfredo PORRAS Ing. Ralph WIEGANDT Enrique OSORIO Robles

E. PROBLEMS

There have been no significant security, cover or control problems with LIHUFF-1 during the project year.

F. LIAISON

This project involves no liaison relationship.

G. INTER-AGENCY COORDINATION

This project involves no inter-agency coordination.

H. PLANS

Station Mexico plans to continue to use LIHUFF-1 as a support agent and informant on activities of right-wing political minority groups.

I. FUNDS

1. For the Past Period.

The cost of the LIHUFF Project (paid by the Mexico Station exclusive of Headquarters costs) from 1 July 1966 through 31 May 1967 was approximately US\$ 120.00 which does not include Subject's salary of US\$ 3,300 (300 per month) advanced locally and T/Aed to Headquarters.

2. During the Next Project Year.

During the period 1 July 1967 through 30 June 1968, an estimated US \$4,200 is requested. It will be used in the following manner:

MEMORALDUM FOR: Chief, WH Division

SUBJECT LIMUFF Project Renewal

- 1. It is requested that the LIMUFF Project be renewed for the period 1 July 1966 through 30 June 1967 for \$4,200. It was approved for \$9,000 last year, reflecting a 50 per cent cut this year in an effort to cut to a minimum project obligations. Funds are available in WH Division.
- 2. LIEUFF provides the Station's only agent with access to rightist political organizations. The information gathered through LIHUFF-1 is used mainly for background information for operational planning and Embassy memoranda, rather than for positive dissemination. The Station and WH/1 believe that the Station needs to get this other side of the picture in order to balance out the reporting on leftist activity in Mexico.
- 3. Since July 1965, LIHUFF has been the source of five positive intelligence reports -- four on rightist and leftist university activity and the fifth on the Fondo de Cultura Economica publishing house.

4. WH/1 recommends renewal.

### REQUEST FOR RENEWAL

### PROJECT LIHUFF

### A. CURRENT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this project is to provide for the operational and administrative support for a high-level contract agent, LIMUFF-1, who has access and is a participant in the right-wing political elements and organizations in Mexico; and through one of these contacts, has access to a right-wing student group (principally at the Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico - UNAM).

### B. CHANGES

# 1) Operational Mechanism

The LIHUFF Project was approved in September 1965 for the period 1 July 1965 through 30 June 1966. LIHUFF/1, the singleton agent involved, has been a contact of the Mexico Station since 1950. Before that time he was a contract agent for Station Panama when he was in business in that area. In November 1962 the relationship was formalized into contract status with LIHUFF/1 acting as a funding channel to an anti-Communist research group and rightest student group headed by LIHUFF/2, as well as handling LICHANT/1 and reporting on right-wing activities from other conservative business sources. This activity was funded from Station COA until 1 July 1965. The LIHUFF Project provided only for salary and operational expenses for LIHUFF/1.

# 2) Agents

The only agent to be supported by this project for the coming year is LIHUFF/1. No further subsidies are planned to LIHUFF/2. LICHANT/1 was relieved of his position in the Ministry of Education and is not included as a part of the LIHUFF Project. However, LIHUFF/1 continues in his private business capacity to solicit funds for the LIHUFF/2 group and will continue to use them as sources for information on right-wing political activities.

# C. INTELLIGENCE PRODUCTION

The Mexico Station makes no effort to justify this project on the basis of positive intelligence disseminations. The information is primarily for background. It is often too sketchy for formal dissemination and is

frequently overtaken by public events before a dissemination can be made. LIHUFF/1 meets regularly with and is handled directly by Willard C. Curtis, Chief of Station Mexico. The agent is used to obtain information in response to Priority A.3. of the most recent Related Mission Directive (HM3-4218, 27 July 1966). In addition to the RMD, Chief PESMINO depends upon Station Mexico for information on all political groups. LIHUFF/1 represents the only high-level source trained and available who can circulate freely in Mexican concervative political circles and provide the Mexico Station with information on their activities. During the past project year LIHUFF/1 has provided the Station with the following general categories of information:

- 1) Memoranda on leftists or Communist affiliation of members of the Mexican intellectual and official community. This is generally based on contribution of funds or public assistance in behalf of known leftist or Communist organizations, hence the information is useful for background rather than dissemination.
- 2) Information on Catholic Church activities in Mexico, including press clippings and periodic reports on the rightest student action group, Movimiento Universitario Renovadora Orientacion (MURO) active at the Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico (UNAM), the Universities of Puebla, Guadajalara and Michoacan. HMM-10,325, the only positive intelligence dissemination received from LIHUFF during the past project year was obtained from the MURO group at UNAM. In August 1965, Chief, PBSWING asked for a complete report on "Los Tecos", a right-wing Catholic secret society of which MURO is a student arm. This information was required by Chief, PBSWING, to make a decision on the application of the Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara (U.A.G.) for certain U.S. Government-sponsored monetary grants of several hundred thousand dollars to be used for development of this anti-Communist University which is competitive with the Communist dominated University of Guadalajara. From background data previously supplied by LIEUFF and other sources, a detailed report was made available to Chief, PRSWING.
- 3) Anti-Communist publications from LIHUFF/2's right-wing research center and MURO student publications, all of which are available to Headquarters and are of interest to the Station for background.

# D. EFFECTIVENESS

This project provides the Station with a window into right-wing

political activities. Also, as previously reported to Headquarters, the groups influenced by LIHUFF/1 represent a potential for counter balancing for leftist and Communist pressure groups. One example of this can be cited in action taken by student MURO leaders in August 1965. The Cuban Ambassador to Mexico, Joaquin HERNANDEZ Armas, set about making speeches at Mexican (leftist) Universities of Tabasco, Michoacan and Guadalajara proposing Mexican-Cuban student exchanges. MURO members immediately set up a storm of public protest, demanding that HERNANDEZ Armas be declared persona non-grata for spreading subversive propaganda and agitating on university campuses. This caused HERNANDEZ Armas to be a target for considerable unpleasant press publicity. Through LIHUFF/1, the Station Mexico can exploit such incidents when it is to KUBARK's advantage to do so.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Western Hemisphere Division

SUBJECT : Renewal of Project LIHUFF

1. Renewal is requested of the LIHUFF Project for the period 1 July 1965 through 30 June 1966 for a total of \$9,000. The LIHUFF Project was originally approved on 20 April 1965 for \$7,500 for the period 1 January 1965 to 30 June 1965 as a CA Project. It has been decided that the direction of the agent under this project and the project objectives in general will be changed from CA to FI, and therefore, the renewal request is being submitted as an FI Project. The Operational Program for FY 1966 included LIHUFF for \$16,000. Funds are available in WH Division.

- 2. The Project objectives under CA were to support and sustain MURO, a national right-wing student movement, through a long-established anti-communist front organization in Mexico, the Instituto de Investigaciones Sociales y Economicas (IISE). This support was terminated effective 30 June 1965 as it became apparent that the IISE was financially capable of providing this support on its own and MURO became more and more controversial and extremely militant on the far right. Under the new project submitted by the Station, support will be provided to a U.S. contract agent who has access to a wide variety of rightwing political elements and organizations in Mexico. The project is responsive to Priority A3d and f of the RMD.
- 3. This project is the only project in the Mexico Station which will cover rightist political activity in Mexico, emphasis in other projects and operations being geared against the extreme left and the present political party, the PRI, which is slightly left of center. Other than LICHANT-1, the only other access to the Ministry of Education is LIBELER who is carried under his own project.

- 4. Headquarters and the Station are looking forward to receiving better coverage on the rightist political activity in Mexico. WH/l is preparing guidelines and requirements for this project which will reflect the needs of the intelligence community. These requirements will be furnished the field so that proper utilization can be made of LIHUFF-l and his contacts and informants. During the last fiscal year, three reports were credited in full or in part to LIHUFF-l.
- 5. Last year the Station submitted regular quarterly progress reporting in addition to more detailed reporting on certain activities. The Station will be reminded to provide a minimum of quarterly reporting during the next year.
- 6. WH/l recommends approval of the new LIHUFF Project as it is set forth in the attached Station renewal request. The delay in submission of the renewal request is that it was just decided to change this Project to FI and cancel out most of the CA aspects. As a CA Project the renewal request was not due at Headquarters until mid-July 1965.

SUBJECT : LIHUFF Renewal

- 1. Project LIHUFF has been active as a CA project for a number of years. It is now being renewed and submitted as an FI project. Its purpose and objective is to support a singleton U.S. contract agent (LIHUFF-1) who has access to a wide variety of right wing political elements and organizations in Mexico in order to develop information on this political and social sector. This effort is in consonance with priority A3d and f of the RMD and is the only one which covers rightist political activity in Mexico.
- 2. Since LIHUFF was previously a CA project, there is, therefore, no data on which to judge past intelligence product although three reports resulted in the past year. The Mexican Desk and the Station are taking steps to prepare suitable requirements in keeping with LIHUFF-1's access and the objectives of the project.
- 3. The reporting received from the Station with regard to the operational status of the agent and project appears to have been adequate in the past. There are no apparent security or control problems.
- 4. \$9,000 has been requested in support of the project effective 1 July 1965. Of this amount \$5,400 is marked for operational expenses, entertainment, and travel. A study of the detailed project outline leads to the conclusion that this latter figure is somewhat excessive when viewed against anticipated operational activity and in all likelihood only very little of it will be expended.
  - 5. Project LIHUFF is recommended for approval.

SUBJECT : Approval of Project LIHUFF

1. WH/1 requests approval of Project LIHUFF in the amount of \$7,500 for the second half of FY 1965. The project has been programmed in the amount of \$20,000 for FY 1965 and these funds are available in WH.

2. This new project is to provide some support and help sustain an independent Mexican anti-communist group called the Instituto de Investigaciones Sociales y Economicas. The group founded in 1953 has as its aim the spreading of the principles of free enterprise and private initiative. LIHUFF is particularly active in the student field, having organized a nation-wide, right-wing, active student organization called Movimiento Universitario de Renovadora Orientacion (MURO). LIHUFF funds will be used to pay a salary to LIHUFF-1, an American businessman with previous experience with CIA in Panama, and for spot covert action activities such as the militant anti-communist student activities in the universities and the placement of articles in the press.

### 3. Effectiveness

During the developmental period of this activity, the following indications of effectiveness have been reported:

- A. Former Ambassador Thomas Mann valued the IISE publication "Espejo" as worth far more than what one man in the field could accomplish. (Station funds no longer support "Espejo.")
- E. The IISE continues to provide the Station with a research facility not otherwise available.
- C. Provided the Station with a valuable intellectual asset, Manuel Calvillo Alonso, who is a source of FI on right-wing political groups and who completed a book at Station request on the "Penetration of the Mexican Educational System by Communists."

- D. MURO's 200 shock troops have campaigned vigorously against Communism and pro-Castro groups at the National University (UNAM), and in the Universities of Puebla and Guadalajara. MURO takes major credit for the ouster in past months of Communist rectors from the Universities of Monterrey, Puebla, Guadalajara, and Morelia; MURO continues to place anti-communist articles in the national media of interest to students and government leaders; MURO has carried out successful demonstrations against the Soviet Embassy.
- E. MURO took an active part in cabling the Chilean government protesting the Communist nature of the Latin American Youth Conference in Santiago.
- F. LIHUFF-2 is used by the Station for writing and placing certain types of strong anti-Soviet articles in Excelsion and El Universal.
- G. LIHUFF-2 acquired evidence of a large purchase of American hospital supplies by two professors at UNAM for transhipment to Cuba.

# 4. Security

The IISE is funded through a cut-out in such a way that CIA participation is concealed. Only LIMUFF-1, who is met clandestinely by a Station case officer, is witting of the true source of funds. There have been no security problems during the developmental period of this activity.

5. Reporting on this proposed project has been adequate. Five progress reports were received during the past year.

### PROJECT LIEUFF

### A. Identification

Mexico City, Mexico--Political Action. See C. below for other countries which may become involved.

### B. Objectives.

To support and sustain a national right wing student movement, Movimiento Universitario de Renovadora Crientacion (MARO), through a long-established anti-communist front organization in Mexico, the Instituto de Investigaciones Sociales y Economicas (IISE). To maintain and influence significantly this front group by obtaining a measure of substantial control through this continued funding. To assist in maintaining a counterbalancing influence on the common party, PRI, against far leftist pressures through this organization, IISE. To accomplish the following objectives in the Related Mission Directive: Priority A. 3f; Priority B. 3a, b, c.

### C. Background.

- 1. The IISE was founded in 1953 under the auspices of a group of Memican bankers, industrialists, and nerchants to spread the principles of free enterprise and private initiative. Since its founding, the group has arranged a number of meetings and congresses designed to explore the dangers of Communism, particularly in its economic aspects, and hypernationalism; it has organized the student group MURO; it has published books, pamphlets, and news letters on Communism as well as the dangers of economic socialism; it has engaged in considerable press placement on various matters involving private initiative and the Communist threat; and it has accumulated a file of basic data on events and individuals revolving about Communism that would be difficult for any private Mexican group to duplicate.
- 2. In June 1960, LIMUFF-1 visited the Embassy's Political Counselor and requested an Embassy contact with LIMUFF-2's organization. Subsequently, the Ambassador asked the COS to explore the possibility of giving financial help to the group headed by LIMUFF-2. In mid-August 1962 (MIE-2530 RYEAT), Oliver G. GALBOND advised the Maxico Station that the group had been receiving partial financial aid from a group of U. S. business corporations solicited by Mr. Henry Holland, now deceased, and that Headquarters had also provided some financial assistance through this channel. After the death of Mr. Holland, it was recommended that the funding be hamiled through the Mexico Station. Specifically, this was to help pay for the publication "Espejo," an economic journal which strongly supports the free enterprise system. The Ambassador was consulted and he replied that he thought LIMUFF-2 was one of the few economists in Mexico fighting Communism.

The Ambassador also said that everything possible should be done to support "Espejo" (EDMT-3023 EHAT 1926, 30 August 1962).

- 3. A project was submitted by the Station on 22 March 1963 (BLM-20931), but Headquarters on 12 July 1963 (DIR-53801) indicated the project had been disapproved as submitted and that instead the Station funding should support the student activity NURC on a spot assistance basis. This was done with the U. S. business associates of LIMUTT-1's picking up the cost of the "Espejo" magazine, some \$1,200 per month. The Station's assistance since that time has been confined to the payment of LIMUTT-1's calary (\$500 per month) and the payment of \$500 per month to MURO. The Station, however, retains access to the full range of the LIMUTT mechanism and potential.
- 4. MURO, the militant student organization, is extremely active in the political action field, in the provinces as well as in the capital. The ITSE organization has its offices in Mexico City, with associated offices in Salvador and Guatemala and working contacts in the provinces of Mexico and in several capital cities of Latin America.
- 5. LIMIT devotes its efforts to selling the free enterprise system as an economic way of life and in defending at every turn individual liberty or treedom. In Mexico this type of organization is rather unique, as the trend in Mexico is toward more government intervention. The IISE also prepares and sends out to provincial newspapers editorials featuring anti-communist themes. In the last five years the IISE has collected seventy loose-last binders filled with editorial clips authored in the IISE office. This organization also sponsors a training course at which interested groups of 15 to 20 persons are indoctrinated.
  - 6. LIMPF-2, the Director of the IISE, has shown complete dedication to the program. The members of the organization, especially the students, have demonstrated courage and competence in a variety of operations.

# D. Operational Assets.

### 1. Personnel.

1. LIEUFF-1 is a 48-year-old American businessman who acts as a cut-out and operational adviser to LIEUFF-2, the Director of the group. LIHUFF-1 worked for CIA in Panama from April 1947 until April 1949 when he returned to Nexico. He was in contact socially with members of the Mexico Station and in November 1962 was hired for the above work. Training was not required since LIEUFF-1 has been in intelligence work from his service with U. S. military intelligence during WWII. He was engaged to work for U. S. military intelligence in Pexico until late 1962. He knows he is working for CIA. HIW-11040 of 25 October 1962 granted an CA for LIHUFF-1.

2. LIEUFF-2 is a 47-year-old Mexican lawyer. He is also a well-known economist who directs an economic research organization in Mexico and other Latin American countries. He is met by LIEUFF-1. LIEUFF-2 protably suspects that funds may come to him from the U. S. Government; however, cover used is that the money is from private business groups. He was granted an CA on 26 October 1962.

### 2. Mechanisms.

- 1. The principal officers of the HEE group are listed in Appendix 1. During early 1964 MARC organized a strong and large chapter of its organization at the University of Vera Cruz, Jalana. This University has seme 23,000 students and a sizable communist infiltration in its student ranks. This makes four universities now in which MURO has chapters: Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico (UNAM), University of Fuebla, University of Sundalajara, and the University of Vera Cruz. Three of these, with the exception of Guadalajara, are noted centers of communist activities.
- 2. a. The IICE organization frequently and regularly makes precs placements in all of Mexico City's leading newspapers. Its editorial features are also regularly accepted by provincial publications. General propaganda and political actions of the organization will be influenced and guided by the Station.
- b. The IISE editorial service for provincial newspapers has been used by the Station.
- c. The IISE's international connections, especially the associated offices in Salvador and Guatamala, will be emploited.
- d. The Station will continue to call on the IISE to fill research needs.
- e. Samples of publication and propaganda material are attached.

# E. Security Evaluation.

The IISE organization is funded through a cut-out in such a manner that CIA participation is concealed. It is not connected in any way with any other CIA operation. There have been no security problems which have come to the attention of the Station in connection with this activity. Both LIAVFF-1 and LIEVFF-2 have been, to the Station's knowledge, quite discreet about their relationship. In view of the nature of the IISE, there has been no curiosity about the source of funds contributed by the Station.

### F. Coordination.

1. All coordination with other U. S. elements will be handled by the COS Mexico as such situations arise. For the present there are none. The former Ambassador Mr. Thomas Main asked the COS Mexico to assist the IISE group financially. Also, the operational use of LIMUFF-1 was cleared with U. S. military intelligence when it was learned that they also had an interest in using him in clandestine operations. They are not using him at the present time.

# 2. Relationship to Other Projects

- a. LICCAX: Both projects LICCAX and MURC are operating at UMAN, a University of upwards of 80,000 students. So far there have been no basic problems of conflict since MURC is working the Catholic side of the street while LICCAX works on the so-called "independents," and there is still plenty of room for both to operate. In this connection, it should be noted that a great deal of MURC student effort is devoted to universities outside Mexico City.
- b. LIEITEN: This project is concerned with a mass propaganda approach to Communism in Mexico. It is headed by a group of businessmen known as the Committee of Mine. The only relationship between LIHUFF and LISIMEN is in the fact that four of the members of the Committee of Mine are also members of LIHUFF's 25-man "Board of Directors." This loss not necessarily mean an interlocking directorate between the two projects since, as in many similar activities in the U.S., individuals interested in civic or outside activities of this nature are frequently tapped to serve in multiple assignments.
- c. LILISP/C: Since LILISP/C is a National Student Organization stressing student affairs in the interior of Nexico, obviously LINUFF and LILISP/C are working in the same general field in universities cutside Mexico City. However, in these universities in which LIMUFF is concentrating its efforts, this can be a complementary relationship since LIMUFF can work in much more depth in these universities than can LILISP/C and can affiliate its groups to the LILISP/C National Student Confederation which is the only one now generally recognized in Mexico. LILISP/C, as a National Student Confederation, obviously can only spend very limited time on any single university or sizuation.

### G. 1. Costs.

It is requested that the following estimates be approved for use in the LIHUFF project for the period 1 January 1965 through 30 June 1965.

The organization receives funds from private groups but the Station does not know the amounts of all the donors and it is unlikely that we will ever know these exactly.

No permanent commitments have been made.

# 4. Funding and Accountability.

Funds will be paid to LHAUFF-1 by the inside case officer. Receipts will be obtained. The money will be paid in cash in local currency. There are no unusual funding and accountability requirements.

SUBJECT : Approval of Project LIEUFF

1. WH/1 requests approval of Project LHBFF in the amount of \$7,500 for the second half of FY 1965. The project has been programmed in the amount of \$20,000 for FY 1965 and these funds are available in WH.

2. This new project is to provide some support and help sustain an independent Mexican enti-communist group called the Instituto de Investigaciones Sociales y Economicas. The group founded in 1953 has as its aim the spreading of the principles of free enterprise and private initiative. LIEUFF is particularly active in the student field, having organized a mation-wide, right-wing, active student organization called Movimiento Universitatio de Renovadora Orientacion (MERO). LIEUFF funds will be used to pay a salary to LIEUFF-1, an American businesses with previous experience with CIA in Funana, and for spot covert action activities such as the militant anti-communist student activities in the universities and the placement of articles in the press.

### 3. Effectiveness

During the developmental period of this activity, the following indications of effectiveness have been reported:

- A. Forser Ambassator Thomas Mann valued the HISE publication "Espajo" as worth far more than what one man in the field could accomplish. (Station funds no longer support "Espajo.")
- 8. The IISE continues to provide the Station with a research facility not otherwise available.
- C. Provided the Station with a valuable intellectual asset, Massel Calvillo Alonso, who is a source of FI on right-wing political groups and who completed a book at Station request on the "Penetration of the Maxican Educational System by Communists."

- D. MIRO's 200 shock troops have campaigned vigorously against Communism and pro-Castro groups at the Entional University (UHAM), and in the Universities of Purbla and Cambalajara. MIRO takes major credit for the ouster in past mouths of Communist rectors from the Universities of Nonterray, Purbla, Guadalajara, and Morelia; MIRO confines to place anti-communist articles in the national media of interest to students and government leaders; MIRO has carried out successful demonstrations against the Soviet Embassy.
- E. MEO took an active part in cabling the Chilean government protesting the Communist nature of the Latin American Youth Conference in Fantiago.
- F. LHEUFF-2 is used by the Station for writing and placing certain types of strong anti-boviet articles in Excelsion and  $\underline{\text{Bl}}$  Universal.
- G. LIBUT-2 acquired evidence of a large purchase of Asserican hospital supplies by two professors at UNAN for transhipment to Cuba.

### b. Security

The IISZ is funded through a cut-out in such a way that CIA participation is conscaled. Only LIEFF-1, who is not clandestinely by a Station case officer, is witting of the true source of funds. There have been no security problems during the developmental period of this activity.

5. Reporting on this proposed project has been adequate. Five progress reports were received during the past year.

#### PROJECT LIEFY

### A. Identification

Mariec City, Marico--Political Action. See C. below for other countries which way become involved.

### B. Objectives.

To support and custain a maticual right wing student sovement, Moviniento Universitario de Renovadora Crientacion (1830), Eurough a long-established anti-commist front organization in Mexico, the Instituto de Investigaciones Sociales y Economicas (IEE). To maintain and influence significantly this front group by obtaining a measure of substantial control through this continued funding. To assist in maintaining a counterbalancing influence on the common party, PAI, against for leftiet pressures through this organization, IEEE. To accomplish the following objectives in the Malated Mission Firective: Priority A. 3f; Priority B. 3a, b, c.

### C. Beckground.

- 1. The INS was founded in 1953 under the empires of a group of Mexican benkers, industrialists, and reschants to oproad the principles of free enterprise and private initiative. Since its founding, the group has arranged a number of meetings and congresses designed to explore the dangers of Communica, particularly in its economic aspects, and hypernationalise; it has organized the student group MINO; it has published books, peophlats, and nows letters on Communica as well as the dangers of economic socialism; it has engaged in considerable press placement on various exiters involving private initiative and the Communicat threat; and it has accumulated a file of basic data on events and individuals revolving about Communica that would be difficult for any private Mexican group to deplicate.
- 2. In June 1960, LIMITA-1 visited the Embassy's Political Counselor and requested an Embassy contact with LIMITA-2's organization. Embassymently, the Ashmesador asked the CON to employ the possibility of giving financial belp to the group bended by LIMETA-2. In mid-August 1962 (1981-2530 ETHAT), Oliver G. CALBORD advised the Excise Station that the group had been receiving partial financial aid from a group of U. N. business oceparations solicited by Mr. Emery Holland, now deceased, and that Ecolometers had also provided some financial assistance through this channel. After the death of Mr. Holland, it was recommended that the funding be bandled through the Maxico Station. Epecifically, this was to help pay for the publication Templo," an occassic journal which strongly supports the free enterprise system. The Ambassador was consulted and he replied that he thought LIMET-2 was one of the few economists in Maxico fighting Communism.

The Ashessador also said that everything possible should be done to support "Reselo" (MRT-3023 KYBAT 1925, 30 August 1952).

- 3. A project was substitted by the Station on 82 March 1963 (1864-20931), but Handquarters on 12 July 196? (DIE-53801) indicated the project had been disapproved as substitted and that instead the Station funding should support the student activity MENO on a spot assistance basis. This was done with the U. S. business associates of LIMEF-1's picking up the cost of the "Espajo" magazine, come \$1,200 per mouth. The Station's assistance cince that time has been confined to the payment of LIMEF-1's salary \$500 per month) and the payment of \$500 per month to MESO. The Station, however, retains access to the full range of the LIMEF mechanism and potential.
- a. MENO, the militant student organization, is extremely active in the political action field, in the provinces as well as in the capital. The ILEE organization has its offices in Mexico City, with associated offices in Salvador and Guatemala and working contacts in the provinces of Mexico and in several capital cities of Latin America.
- 5. LIEFF devotes its efforts to selling the free enterprise system as an economic way of life and in defending at every turn individual liberty or freedom. In Maxico this type of organization is rather unique, as the transfin Maxico is toward more government intervention. The IIIV also prepares and sends out to provincial arresponse editorials featuring anti-communistic thanss. In the last five years the IIV has collected seventy loose-leaf binders filled with editorial clips authored in the IIV office. This organization also sponsors a training course at which interested groups of 15 to 20 persons are indoctrinated.
- 6. LIMBY-2, the Director of the IDE, has shown complete dedication to the program. The sembers of the organization, especially the students, have becometrated country and competence in a variety of operations.

### D. Operational Acosts.

### 1. Personnel.

1. LIMPF-1 is a 48-year-old American businesseen who note as a cut-out and operational advisor to LIMPF-2, the Director of the group.
LIMPF-1 vorked for CIA in Panesa from April 1947 until April 1949 when he returned to Funice. He was in contact socially with members of the Mexico Station and in Hovember 1962 was hired for the above work. Training was not required since LIMPF-1 has been in intelligence work from his estrict with U. 6. military intelligence during Wall. He was compact to work for U. 8. military intelligence in Mexico until late 1962. He known he is working for CIA. Hell-11040 of 25 October 1962 granted an CA for LIMPF-1.

2. LHEWF-2 is a 47-year-old Maxican lawyer. He is also a well-known economist who directs an economic research organization in Maxico and ther latin American countries. He is met by LHEFF-1. LHEFF-2 probably suspects that funds may come to him from the U. S. Government; however, cover used is that the money is from private business groups. He was granted an CA on 25 October 1962.

### 2. Mochanismo.

- 1. The principal officers of the HEE group are listed in Appendix
  1. During early 1994 MURO organized a strong and large chapter of its
  organization at the University of Vera Cruz, Jalapa. This University has
  some 23,000 students and a sizable communist infiltration in its student
  ranks. This makes four universities now in which MURO has chapters:
  Universited Hacional Automoma de Mexico (UNAM), University of Purbla,
  University of Guadalajara, and the University of Vera Cruz. Three of these,
  with the exception of Quadalajara, are noted centers of communist activities.
- 2. a. The ILE organization frequently and regularly makes press placements in all of Mexico City's leading newspapers. Its editorial features are also regularly accepted by provincial publications. General propaganda and political actions of the organization will be influenced and guided by the Station.
- b. The HEE editorial service for provincial neverspers has been used by the Station.
- c. The INE's international connections, especially the associated offices in Calvador and Gesternia, will be exploited.
- d. The Station will continue to call on the ILEE to fill research media.
- e. Essples of publication and propaganda material areattached.

### E. Security Evaluation.

The IIEE organization is funded through a cut-out in such a manner that CIA participation is concealed. It is not connected in any way with any other CIA operation. There have been no security problems which have exact to the attention of the Station in connection with this activity. Both LIMMF-1 and LIMMF-2 have been, to the Station's knowledge, quite discrept about their relationship. In view of the nature of the IIEE, there has been no curiosity about the source of funds contributed by the Station.

# F. Coordination.

1. All coordination with other U. S. elements will be handled by the COS Mexico as such situations arise. For the present there are none. The forces Ambassador Fr. Thomas Manu asked the COS Mexico to assist the ILES group financially. Also, the operational use of LURFF-1 was cleared with U. S. military intelligence when it was learned that they also had an interest in using him in claudestime operations. They are not using him at the present time.

# Relationship to Other Projects

- a. LICCAI: Both presents LICCAX and MIRO are operating at UNAH, a University of upwards of BO,000 students. So far there have been no basic problems of conflict since MIRO is working the Catholic side of the street while LICCAX works on the so-called "independents," and there is still planty of row for both to operate. In this connection, it should be noted that a great seal of MIRO student affort is devoted to universities outside Mexico City.
- b. LIPINE: This project is concern: I with a mass propagando approach to Commiss in Maxico. It is beaded by a group of businessess known as the Commisse of Sine. The only relationship between LIMBY such LIMBES is in the fact that four of the newbore of the Committee of Sine are also measured of LIMBY's 25-can "Board of Directors." This does not proceed by measuredly mean an interlocking directorate between the two projects since, as in every similar ectivities in the U.S., individuals interested in civic or outside activities of this mature are frequently typed to serve in multiple acaignments.
- e. LILEP/C: Gince LILEP/C is a Mational Student Organization stressing student offairs in the interior of Maulco, obviously LLENY and LILEP/C are vorting in the come general field in universities outside Maxico City. However, in these universities in which LILEP? is concentrating its efforts, this can be a complementary relationship since LIMEP con work in much some depth in these universities than can LILEP/C and can arrillate its groups to the LILLEP/C Bational Student Confederation which is the only one new generally recognized in Maxico. LILEP/C, as a Settimal Student Confederation, obviously can only spend very limited time on any single university or exaction.

LIHUFF devotes its efforts to selling the free enterprise system as an economic way of life and in defending at every turn individual liberty or freedom. In Mexico this type of organization is rather unique, as the trend in Mexico is towards more government intervention.

LIHUFF maintains an excellent library of source materials on e-conomics and free enterprise, which is open to interested researchers. LIHUFF publishes regularly a considerable amount of materials, including the monthly publication (Identity B). See Enclosure 5 for samples of LIHUFF publications.

The group is extremely active in the student field, in the provinces as well as in the capital. It supports student publications; has organized a national student group (Identity C); and engages in militant student political action.

LIHUFF also prepares and sends out to provincial newspapers editorials featuring anti-Communist themes. In the last four years LIHUFF has collected 65 loose-leaf binders filled with editorial clips authored in the LIHUFF office. LIHUFF also sponsors a training course at which interested groups (of 15 to 20 persons) are indoctrinated.

### MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Comments on Proposed Project LIHUFF

1. I recommend this project proposal not be submitted for approval, for the following reasons:

a. The LIHUFF organization has other sources of funds and would conduct its activities anyway without any support or aid from CIA or any other U. S. Government agency. A project to fund the organization is unnecessary.

b. The Station indicates that it has achieved, and can continue to achieve, results through the LIHUFF mechanism without making sizeable payments. A project to provide a subsidy is therefore unnecessary.

c. Several members of the LIHUFF organization are also members of the LISIREN organization. One of them, Eduardo PRIETO Lopez, recently discussed the LISIREN operation with the DCI in the latter's Headquarters office and is nware of U. S. Government funding to the LISIREN complex. This fact, taken with the similarity of the proposed funding mechanism to that of LISIREN, the similarity of operations of the two organizations, and other such parallels could eventually be expected to strip LIHUFF of its cover and create a potential security problem.

- d. The activities that this proposed project would subsidize overlap the activities of several other operations in the Station. LIHUFF does not contribute enough beyond this overlapping to be justified. Its student program coincides with Projects HEVICT, LILISP-C and, to a lesser extent, LICOAX. LIMUFF-2 is a 46 year old Mexican lawyer. He is also a well known oconomist who directs an oconomic research organisation in Mexico and other Latin American countries. He is met by LIHUFF-1. LIHUFF-2 probably suspects that funds may come to him from ODYOKE; however, cover used is that the mone. Is from private business groups. He was granted an OA on 26 October 1962 (HMMW-11089 of 9 November 1963).

### 2. Mechanisme.

- a. The principal efficers of the identity A group are listed in Appendix I (separate cover enclosure No. 3). Other details of the organization are included in C. Background above.
- b. The Likuff organization frequently and regularly makes press placements in all of Mexico City's loading newspapers. Its editorial features are also regularly accepted by provincial publications. Radio and television placement is on an irrogular basis.
- (1) General propaganta and political actions of LIHUFF will be influenced and guidedby the Station for its benefit.
- (2) LIMUFF student operations have already been utilized (alten in coordination with other Station student assets).
- (3) The LIHUFF editorial service for provincial newspapers has been used by the Station.
- (4) The press-placement capabilities of LIHUFF in capital city newspapers, which is considerable, has been used. This will be taken advantage of by the Station for KUBARK purposes.
- (5) LIHUFF's international connections, especially his associated effices in Salvador and Guatemala, will be exploited.

(6) The Station will call on LIHUFF to fill research needs.

# E. Security Evaluation.

The LIHUFF organization is funded through a cut-out in such a manner that KUBARK participation is concealed. It is not connected in any way with any other KUBARK operation.

### F. Coordination.

All coordination with other PBPRIME elements will be handled by COS Mexico as such situations arise. For the present there are none. In the past, ODACID Chief Mexico asked COS Mexico to assist the group financially. Also, the operational use of LIHUFF-1 was cleared with PBPRIME military intelligence when it was learned that they also had an interest in using him in clandestine operations. They are not using him at the present time.

### G. Costo.

Statica Mexico proposes to pay only a portion of the LIHUFF operation. It is not intended that this partial support will make LIHUFF a completely controlled Station asset. It will make it responsive to Station guidance. The organisation receives funds from private groups but the Station does not know the amounts or all the donors and it is unlikely that we will know these exactly. The Station, however, will be alert for the future possibility that the LIHUFF may begin to operate soluly on Station funds. Should this occur, steps will be taken to place the organisation under complete, classic control.

### 2. Fereign Currency.

There are no special requirements for foreign currency.

### 3. Commitments.

No permanent commitments have been made.

# 6. Freding and Accountability.

Funds will be paid to LIHUFF-1 by COS Maxico. Receipts will be obtained. The money will be paid in cash in local currency. There are no unusual funding and accountability requirements.

scame may not affect the group's offices in other Latin American countries. In the event of an emergency situation, contact can be made by the COS with either LIMUFF-1 or LIMUFF-2.

- a. Furnished the Mexico City Station with index cards and summary information on some three (3) thousand Mexican Communists. Although almost all of these Communists were already known to this Station, the data confirms Station information and, in some cases, adde to Station knowledge.
- b. Organised a nationwide right-wing, anti-Communist and active student organization in the nation's universities. It is called blowindente Universitaria Removadora Crientacie's (MURC) publishes PURO (Fiet), a fighting anti-Communist student paper and has organized shock brigades ready and willing to take offensive (street fighting) action. MURO has been very active in the National University of Mulico (UNAM); the University of Puebla and the University of Milhanens. In the last two MURO can claim a large degree of the credit for casting Communist rectors at these universities.
- c. Kept its publication. ESPEJO, actively attempting to counter overwhelming odds and advantages held by pro-marxist economists and their textilizes in blenico. Chief ODACID believes the Director and the organization are meet useful in this regard.
- d. Taught groups of students pro-capitalist, pro-free exerprise occasinist a rare and much needed service is Mexico where the Commission have taken ever the field of economics in higher education.
- e. Continuously published pro-PBPRIME, pro-free enterprise and anti-Communist articles in Mexico City's leading newspapers and in the provincial press of Mexico.

HMMA 22250 With the discontinuance of the subsidy for the publication of the LIHUFF magazine as reported in Paragraph 3 of Reference B. Headquarter's major objection to this project has been satisfied. However, we feel compelled to point out to the Station that despite a clear disapproval of this subsidy in Reference A, the Station continued payment of it for an additional five months. In the absence of any interim reporting or other attempt to justify this continued expenditure, the Station Chief exceeded his fiscal authority. Although Headquarters is prepared to make a concession to the Station with rejard to other aspects of the project as stated later in this dispatch, we must advise you that the prolongation of the LIHUFF-1 magazine subsidy for five months is viewed here with great seriousness It is requested that Willard C. Curtis prepare a dispatch explaining the Station's action in this matter. With regard to other facets of the project, we are willing to continue for a time even though we are not fully convinced that the level of LIHUFF-1's compensation or the student activities supported are justifiable. To avoid an arbitrary termination of the entire operation at this time, you are authorized to proceed for the balance of Fiscal Year 1964 on the following basis:

A. To continue LIHUFF-L's compensation at \$500 per month.

B. To support selected student activities through the LIHUFF complex at a rate not to exceed \$500 a month.

C. To meet the cost of publication of the book per HMMA 21976 which we estimate should not exceed a total cost of \$6000.

Should you wish to support other specific projects through LIHUFF such as the publication of the book, these will be considered by Headquarters on a case to case basis.

- 3. The above authorized expenditures are to be charged to D&TO and under no circumstances are they to exceed the amounts specified. In this connection, you are advised that Headquarters has allocated an additional \$30,000 to the Station's D&TO funds for the fiscal year 1964 bringing the total for FY64 to \$82,500. It is not likely that any further increase can be obtained.
- 4. The Station is also requested to submit to Headquarters, not later than 1 June 1964, an up-dated assessment of the LIHUFF operation. If at that time the Station wishes to present a revised project for fiscal year 1965, your recommendations should be fully submitted in the reassessment. If your recommendations are accepted, then Headquarters will undertake to rewrite the project outline forwarded with HMMA 20931 and submit the project for approval.
