03 8 Debriefing Report #125 dated 30 April 64 03
1. At the request of *03* Frank Hughes, CI/OPS, and *03* Joe Burke, CI/R&A, AMMUG-1 was questioned on 16 and 17 July by Barney Hidalgo of WH/SA/CI to shed whatever additional light he could on the question of the Soviet origin of the "sweepers" in the possession of the Cuban I. S. mentioned in the above reference.
 2. Hidalgo drew the attached sketch of the equipment in question from AMMUG 1's description. Additional comments and details follow:
 - a. A-1 saw this piece of equipment only once, in the MI Section (technical shop) of the DGI where he went occasionally in connection with S/W matters and concealment devices. The room did not have other commo gear, batteries, radios, earphones, etc. Also, this was the only piece of this equipment in the room at the time he saw it.
 - b. A-1 was told by DGI technicians that this piece of equipment was the same type as that used at the Cuban Embassy, London, in July 1963 in the discovery of a hot mike and microphones. They also referred to this equipment as being "from the Soviets."
 - 03* 3. The foregoing information was passed orally to Mr. *03* Burke, CI/R&A, on 17 July.

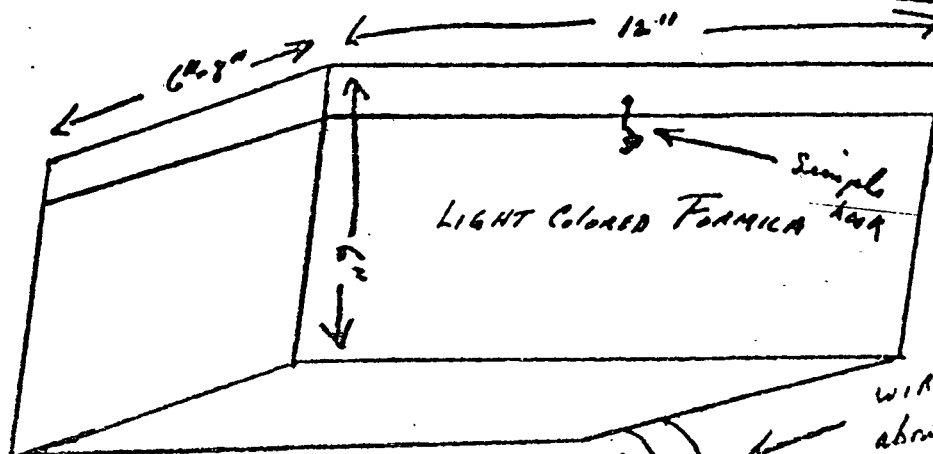

EMBASSY - LONDON (CIRCA) JULY 63"

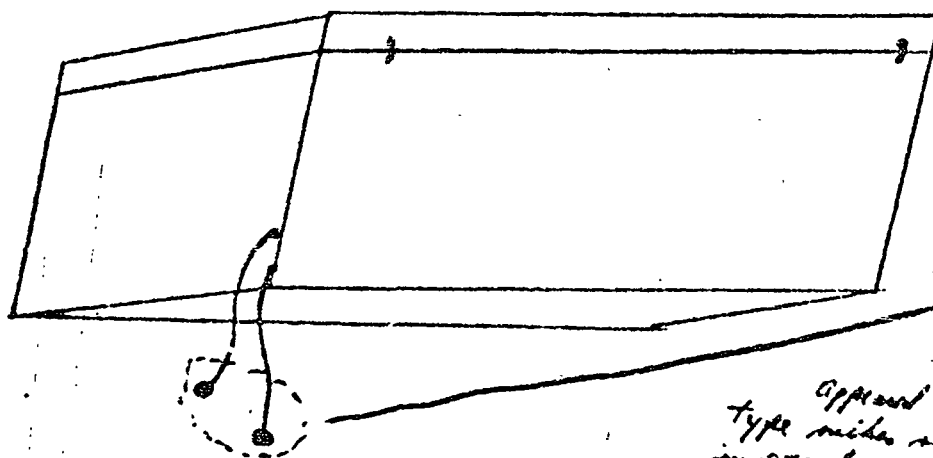
FRONT VIEW
