- 1. Reference dispatch is correct in advising that Subject is listed as Third Secretary in the Mexican Diamo Oficial.
- 2. However, it should be noted that Subject's GRU designation, as made by the Station, is based on the following information and factors:
 - a. During Subject's previous assignment to Mexico, his overt position and activity was that of distributing films to various local individuals, groups, and organizations regresting same. The identified GRU officer, Valentin Vasiliyevich BAKULIN, replaced Subject in this overt function. When Subject came to Mexico for his present assignment here, he replaced BAKULIN in this overt function. Additionally, he took over BAKULIN's diplomatic plate vehicle and has an office in the Military Attache quarters.
 - b. A recent tabulation-analysis of Subject's contacts with Soviet Embassy personnel in the compound during the past six months does not indicate an exclusive or near exclusive association with identified GRU personnel. However, the tabulation does indicate somewhat more association with GRU officers than with KGB or unaffiliated staffers.

- 12. BAKULIN told COFNVY double agent that he (Sov) had travelled to San Diego with German Documentation. (Could BAKULIN's story of trip to San Diego be CP Test C? ODENBY DA?)
- 13. MEXI 6031. IN 13138, 5 Sep 63: BAKULIN met LINEB-1 on 3 Sept 1963. Bakulin stated there had been a change of DIRECTOR" (believe he means Chief GRU) and he had been working very hard, from early ; morn to late eve " I have been doing everythin and I have to be very careful after what happened to PFNKOVSKIY. Seven of us have already left the Country. I don't want to be expelled, "They" have doubled the "Vigilancia", It's better for you not to show for meeting if something happens, I don't want to put you in Danger." BAKULIN said there possibility that alternate Soviet would meet LINFB-1, using name of Nikolas. LINEB-1 suggested that if subject working so hard he must have gotten a Promotion. BAKULIN said he had indeed gotten a Promotion and a good one.
- 14. Subj. indicated to Agent LAROB that their 30 Sep 63 meeting may be last one; Subj. mentioned that he may be transferred, possibly to Ethiopia. 7 Oct 63)

Subject's replacement will probably be fru THURAVIEV (Viktor ZHURAVIEV ?) MEXI 7439, 18 Dec 63.

Subj and family left PCS 12 Jan 64. PEXI 7762, 14 Jan 64. Sucj. replaced by Viktor Lukich MHUMHCREV (based on Subj's description to LINEB/1 of his replacement). MIXI 7733, 13 Jan 64. Lines/ Later identified

based on FI/D info: as of 11 Mar 64 no indication that a fnu ZHURAVIEW has arr'd or will arrive in Mexic City. (possibly the assignment was cancelled.) Above comment that Subject replaced by Viktor Lukich KHUKHOREV. not yet resolved as IMEB has not met his future case officer. KHUKHUREV is a diplomat, whereas Subject was an employee in MA's office. As far as overt rosition in the Embassy is concerned, Subject was probably replaced by either Turiy Alekseyevich MITROPOLSKIY (who previously employed by GRU in Germany) who arrid 18 Feb 64, or by Konstantin Fedorovich YCRONKOV (previously in MA Office in Feris) who arr'd 3 Mar 64.

Excerpts from LARCE file re Subj:

- 1. BAKULIK came to T-1's automobile carrying a bottle of Maxican gin and a bottle of Coca Cola. BAKULIN entered T-1's automobile and poured a drink into a plastic glass which he offered to T-1. T-1 refused and BAKULIN drank it himself. (Bureau report dated 23 May 63) LAROB Or.
- 2. BAKULIN reminded T-l of the day (April 11, 1963) when BAKULIN had come to T-l's home and had drunk some brandy. BAKULIN stated that, after the left Y-l's home, FAKULIN's associate, who was waiting for BAKULIN, decided that BAKULIN was too drunk to attend a meeting with BAKULIN's superior and took BAKULIN to Cuernavaca, Morelos, Mexico, to sober him up. BAKULIN stated that, as a result, when he did confer with his superior he received a very severe lecture. T-l noted that, during the period when BAKULIN was arrived these comments, PAKULIN was extremely nervous. (Furesu report dated 23 May 63) LAROB Op.
 - 3. PANULTH stated that T-1, sooner or later, would be introduced to someone else who would be the replacement for BANULTH when BANULTH receives another assignment. BANULTH requested T-1 not to mention BANULTH's drinking or the comments that had been made to the T-1 by BANULTH on a confidential tesis. T-1 assured Bakulin that he had nothing to worry about in this regard. (Eureau report dated 23 May 63) LAROB Op.
 - 4. BAKULIN appeared at the home of T-1 on the evening of November 11, 1962 at about 8:00 p.m. EAKULIN appeared to have been drinking and, while talking to T-1, drank five glasses of brandy. (Bureau report dated 16 Nov. 62) LAROB Op.
