FYI. An amount of \$250,000 was originally authorized for the medical phase of the AMBUD Program. Expenditures under this program have reached a level of approximately \$245,000 with bills outstanding at the present time of \$3,250. It is evident that the cases remaining which require medical treatment as outlined above will necessitate the expenditure of sums in excess of this amount.
